MEDIA INFORMATION

MIAMI DOLPHINS MEDIA WORKROOM ACCESS & PARKING INFORMATION

As a reminder, the workroom for accredited media covering the Miami Dolphins is located behind the Dolphins Pro Shop at the Baptist Health Training Facility at Nova Southeastern University. Access to the media workroom is granted by the Communications Staff to members of the media upon their arrival at training camp.

Parking passes are distributed by the Communications Department. The passes need to be clearly displayed to gain entry into the media parking areas. Media parking is available at the Nova Southeastern University Medical School garage (HPD Garage), which is next to the Dolphins Pro Shop, and located near the intersection of University Drive and S.W. 30th Street, between Griffin Road and I-595. Access to this garage is off University Drive and S.W. 30th Street. In the event the HPD Garage is full, the overflow media parking will be in the AUX Parking Lot next to the NOVA Softball fields.

PLEASE NOTE – ALL MEDIA ARE ASKED TO PARK ON THE SECOND FLOOR OF THE HPD GARAGE. PARKING ON THE FIRST FLOOR IS RESERVED FOR NOVA PATIENTS ONLY. THE GARAGE WILL BE MONITORED BY NOVA AND THOSE WHO PARK ON THE FIRST FLOOR WILL BE TICKETED.

DOLPHINS EN ESPAÑOL

MARCHANDO EN HARD ROCK STADIUM

Miami no ha gastado tiempo estableciendo una ventaja en casa con las renovaciones importantes y la cubierta añadidos a Hard Rock Stadium.

- En 2016, el primer año con la cubierta, los Dolphins fueron 6-2 en casa, su mejor marca desde 2002.
- Miamí tuvo una racha de cinco victorias en casa en el medio de la temporada de 2016, cual fue la racha de victorias en casa más larga desde 2001-02.
- Los Dolphins fueron 4-3 en casa este año, ganándole a Tennessee en Semana 5, los Jets de Nueva York en Semana 7, Denver en Semana 13 y New England en Semana 14.
- La racha de 11 ganadas en los últimos 16 partidos en Hard Rock Stadium es la mejor de 16 partidos en casa desde que fueron 14-4 en 18 partidos entre el 2 de diciembre de 2001 y el 23 de noviembre de 2003.
- Miami ahora he ganado cuatro partidos, a lo mínimo, en casa en cada año desde 2010, aunque solo jugaron siete juegos en casa en 2015 y de nuevo esta temporada.
- Los Dolphins terminaron con una marca victoriosa en Hard Rock Stadium esta temporada para el segundo año en seguida. La última vez que tuvieron marcas victoriosas consecutivas en casa fue en 2001-02.
- Esta fue la primera temporada desde 2005 en que los Dolphins ganaron sus primeros dos juegos en casa.

LOS DOLPHINS JUGARON EL CALENDARIO DE JUEGOS TERCER MÁS DIFÍCIL EN EL NFL EN 2017

Los Dolphins llegaron a la parte más difícil de su temporada en diciembre, enfrentando equipos que llegaron a los playoffs en sus últimos cuatro partidos.

El horario de los Dolphins fue el tercer más difícil en el NFL esta temporada. Sus opositores tuvieron un porcentaje de victoria de .543. Miami enfrentó opositores con récords ganadoras en 11 partidos y nueve de sus 16 partidos fueron contra equipos que llegaron a los playoffs.

MÁS ATRAPADAS EN LOS PRIMEROS CUATRO AÑOS DE UNA CARRERA

Receptor Jarvis Landry destruyó el récord antiguo para más atrapadas en los primeros cuatro años de una carrera en la NFL. Landry superó Anquan Boldin en Semana 9 y terminó su cuarto temporada con 400 atrapadas en su carrera. Solo necesita 26 atrapadas para superar la marca para más atrapadas en los primeros cinco años de una carrera aunque ni ha comenzado su quinta temporada. Landry también es segundo en atrapadas en los primeros dos años de una carrera (194) y empatado para primero en los primeros tres años de una carrera (288).

DRAKE EL MEJOR CORRDEOR EN LOS ÚLTIMOS CINCO JUEGOS

Corredor Kenyan Drake se convirtió en el corredor principal de los Dolphins en Semana 13 después de que Damien Williams sufrió una lesión a su hombro. Desde entonces, Drake lideró la NFL con 444 yardas de carrera en 91 carreras (4.9 prom.). Las 91 carreras de Drake fueron sexto en la liga durante ese lapso. Drake fue empatado para cuarto en la NFL con 108 toques ofensivos y tercero con 594 yardas totales en las últimas cinco semanas.

LA OFENSA DE LOS DOLPHINS EN LAS ÚLTIMAS SEIS SEMANAS

Los Dolphins enfrentaron cuatro de las mejores 10 defensas en la NFL en las últimas ocho semanas y sin embargo mejoraron su producción ofensiva. Desde Semana 10, Miami ha enfrentado Carolina (No. 7 en defensa total), New England dos veces (No. 5 en defensa de anotación) y Denver (No. 3 en defensa total), pero su producción ofensiva incrementó comparado a la primera mitad de la temporada, aunque usaron dos diferentes quarterbacks titulares:

TEAM NOTES

ROCKING AT HARD ROCK STADIUM

Miami wasted no time establishing a home-field advantage with the major renovation and canopy added to Hard Rock Stadium.

- In 2016, the first year with the canopy, the Dolphins went 6-2 at home, their best home record since 2002.
- Miami had a stretch of five straight home victories in the middle of the 2016 season, which was the team's longest home winning streak since 2001-02.
- The Dolphins were 4-3 at their home venue this season, defeating Tennessee in Week 5, the N.Y. Jets in Week 7, Denver in Week 13 and New England in Week 14.
- Miami's 11 wins in their past 16 games at Hard Rock Stadium is the team's best 16-game home stretch since they went 14-4 in an 18-game stretch from Dec. 2, 2001 to Nov. 23, 2003.
- Miami has now won at least four home games in the stadium in every season since 2010, despite playing just seven games at the venue in 2015 (and again this season).
- The Dolphins finished with a winning record at Hard Rock Stadium this season for the second consecutive year. The last time Miami had back-to-back winning seasons at home was 2001-02.
- This was the first season since 2005 the Dolphins won their first two home games played at Hard Rock Stadium.

SIXTEEN STRAIGHT

With the Dolphins' Week 1 game against Tampa Bay being moved to Week 11 due to Hurricane Irma, Miami played 16 straight weeks for the first time since 1992, when a similar situation occurred. Hurricane Andrew forced the Dolphins to move their season opener vs. New England to the bye week. Miami beat the Patriots on Oct. 18, 1992 and went on to win 11 games, the AFC East title and reach the AFC Championship game that season

THE DOLPHINS IN ONE-SCORE GAMES

Miami lost two one score games in its final three contests – both against Buffalo — for just the second and third times in their past 16 one-score contests. The Dolphins were 6-3 in such games (decided by 8 points or less) this season and are 13-3 in their past 16 one-score contests, dating back to their overtime win over Cleveland on Sept. 25, 2016. The Dolphins' last win in a one-score game was in Week 14 when they defeated New England, 27-20.

DOLPHINS PLAYED THE THIRD-TOUGHEST SCHEDULE IN THE NFL IN 2017

The Dolphins hit the toughest part of their schedule in December as their final four games of the 2017 season were all against playoff teams.

The Dolphins tied for the third-most difficult schedule in the NFL this season as their opponents' win percentage was .543. Miami tied the NFL lead with 11 games against opponents that finished with winning records and nine of their 16 games against playoff teams.



With 112 receptions this season, **WR Jarvis Landry** broke his own team single-season receptions record. He now holds the top three single-season reception marks in team history and **all four of Landry's NFL seasons have ranked in the team's top seven for most receptions in a season.**

NOTING LANDRY'S RECEPTIONS

- WR Jarvis Landry caught five or more passes in all 16 games this season and is just the fourth player (fifth time overall) in NFL history to do so, joining Jimmy Smith (2001), Pierre Garcon (2013) and Antonio Brown (2013 and 2014).
- He has caught at least two passes in 63 consecutive games.
- Landry and Brown are the only players in the NFL who have recorded all of the following receiving milestones over the past four seasons: 100 receptions in 2017 (Landry 112, Brown 101), 200 total receptions from 2016-17 (Brown 207, Landry 206), 300 total receptions from 2015-17 (Brown 343, Landry 316) and 400 total receptions from 2014-17 (Brown 472, Landry 400).

'JUICE' BECOMES SIXTH PLAYER IN DOLPHINS HISTORY TO CATCH 400 PASSES

Landry finished the 2017 season with 400 career receptions on the nose, making him the sixth player in team history to reach that milestone. He's just five receptions away from WR Chris Chambers in fifth place, and 15 receptions away from WR O.J. McDuffie in fourth place:

RB Kenyan Drake became the Dolphins' featured back in Week 13 vs. Denver after **RB** Damien Williams suffered a shoulder injury. Since then, Drake led the NFL in rushing with 444 yards on 91 carries (4.9 avg.). Drake's 91 carries were sixth in the league in that span. Drake was tied for fourth in the NFL with 108 offensive touches and third with 594 scrimmage yards in that span.

KENYAN DRAKE HITS THE HOME RUN

The Dolphins offense hit many big plays in the final weeks of the season, most notably in the running game. In Week 13 vs. Denver, his first game as Miami's featured back, **Drake** took a carry 42 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. **Drake had three rushing plays for 40-plus yards, which tied for the second-most in the NFL**, despite starting just five games.

DRAKE'S PERFORMANCE VS. NEW ENGLAND

Drake had his second consecutive 100-yard performance in Week 14 when he totaled 25 carries for 114 yards (4.6 avg.) against New England. He added five receptions for 79 yards (15.8 avg.).

- Drake became the first Dolphins player to lead the team in both rushing and receiving in a game since Arian Foster did so on Sept. 11, 2016 at Seattle.
- Drake's 79 receiving yards were the most by a Dolphins running back since Lamar Miller had 97 at Buffalo on Nov. 8, 2015.
- Drake became just the third Dolphins player to record 100-plus rushing yards and 75plus receiving yards in a game, joining Troy Stradford (169 rushing, 83 receiving) at Dallas on Nov. 27, 1987 and Ronnie Brown (112 rushing, 99 receiving) vs. the N.Y. Jets on Sept. 23, 2007.



MIAMI'S LONG RUNS

The Dolphins had four rushing plays of 40-plus-yards in their final nine games, including a three-game streak with a 40-plus-yard rushing play. In Week 11 vs. Tampa Bay, RB Damien Williams had a 69-yard rush and RB Kenyan Drake had a 66-yard run in Week 10 at Carolina and a 42-yard run in Week 9 vs. Oakland. It was the first time since at least 1994 the Dolphins have had three straight games with a 40-yard rush.

Williams' 69-yard carry in Week 11 was the ninth-longest rush in team history. It's just the second time in the team's 52-year history they've had 60-yard carries in back-to-back games (RB Gary Davis and RB Norm Bulaich in 1978).

THE DOLPHINS OFFENSE IN THE SECOND HALF OF THE SEASON

The Dolphins played three games against the NFL's top 10 defenses in the final eight weeks of the season and managed to drastically improve their offensive production. Since Week 10, Miami has faced Carolina (No. 7 in total defense), New England twice (No. 5 in scoring defense) and Denver (No. 3 in total defense) but saw their offensive production increase from the first half of the season, despite using three different quarterbacks:

WR Jakeem Grant was primarily a return specialist as a rookie in 2016 but became a force to be reckoned with on offense towards the end of the 2017 season. Grant had 13 receptions for 203 yards (15.6 avg.) this season – the first 13 catches of his career. He started becoming more involved with the offense in the Week 14 win vs. New England and in the final four games, Grant totaled 10 receptions for 188 yards (18.8 avg.) and two touchdowns, including a career-long 65-yard score in Week 16 at Kansas City.

DEFENSE NOTES

CAM WAKE STILL SACKING QBs AT 35 YEARS OLD

DE Cameron Wake suffered a season-ending Achilles injury in his eighth game of the 2015 season at age 33. Despite a lengthy recovery and his age, Wake bounced back to have consecutive double-digit sack seasons in 2016 and 2017 for the first time in his career.

The Dolphins slowly brought Wake back in 2016 and re-inserted him as a starter in Week 6 of that season. Since then, **he is tied for third in the NFL with 21.0 sacks** and has helped Miami go 15-12 in its last 27 regular season games.



Wake played the 2017 season at 35 years old and totaled 10.5 sacks. He became the 12th player in NFL history (since 1982) and just the fourth in the past 15 years (John Abraham, Julius Peppers and Terrell Suggs) to record a double-digit sack season at the age of 35 or older.

This year marked the fifth time in Wake's career that he recorded 10-plus sacks and the first time he did so in back-to-back seasons. It's also the first time he's had double-digit sacks in an odd numbered year.

ONE OF THE BEST UNDRAFTED PASS RUSHERS EVER

Wake is also one of the best undrafted pass rushers in NFL history. With 92.0 career sacks, he is **second in NFL history** (since sacks were recognized as an official statistic in 1982) **for most career sacks by a player who was undrafted:**

SUH SACKS

DT Ndamukong Suh has been one of the most disruptive interior defensive linemen in the NFL since he entered the league in 2010.

Since entering the NFL in 2010, Suh is second among all defensive tackles in sacks. This season, Suh tied for 12th among defensive tackles with 4.5 sacks.

STUFFS BY SUH

Not only is **Suh** a great interior pass rusher, but the Nebraska product also disrupts rushing plays behind the line of scrimmage. Since he entered the NFL as a first-round pick in 2010, Suh leads all interior defensive linemen with **55.0 stuffs**. **His 6.5 stuffs in 2017 were tied for fourth in the NFL among defensive tackles.** A stuff is defined as any tackle of a ball carrier behind the line of scrimmage during a rushing attempt.

SUH CONSISTENTLY MAKES STOPS

Suh topped 400 career tackles earlier this season. Since he entered the NFL in 2010, **Suh is second among all defensive tackles with 418 total tackles** and his total is fourth among all defensive linemen.

Suh was tied for 15th among all interior defensive linemen in total tackles in 2017 with 47 (29 solo). He **finished among the top five** in total tackles by an NFL interior defensive linemen for **three straight seasons from 2014-16.**

DEFENSE NOTES

DOLPHINS DEFENSE ON THIRD DOWN

The Dolphins defense finished 11th in the NFL allowing just 36.9 percent of third downs to be converted this season. In Week 14 vs. New England, the Dolphins did something no team had been able to do to the Patriots in the Bill Belichick and Tom Brady era, and that was to hold them without a third-down conversion. The last time New England didn't have a third-down conversion was on Sept. 29, 1991 at the Cardinals, when the Patriots were 0-for-6 (0.0 pct.).

- It was just the fourth time since 1991 the Dolphins have not given up a third-down conversion in a game. The other three occurrences were Oct. 30, 2005 at New Orleans, Nov. 20, 2011 vs. Buffalo and Dec. 18, 2011 at Buffalo.
- The 4.2 percent conversion rate (1-for-24) allowed by the Dolphins in their Week 13 and 14 games represents the second-lowest by an NFL team over a two-game span in any of the last 40 seasons. Jets' opponents were 1-for-25 (4.0%) from Dec. 3-13, 2009.

MIAMI DEFENSE SHUT DOWN BRADY AND CO. IN WEEK 14

The Dolphins defense held New England to just 20 points and 248 total yards in Week 14. It was one of just two times in 2017 the Patriots were held to less than 21 points (19 at Tampa Bay on Oct. 5, 2017).

- New England's 248 total yards were their lowest output since Jan.
 3, 2016, also in Miami, when they gained 196 yards. Including playoff contests, that is a span of 34 games.
- The Dolphins held New England to 0 points and just 2 total yards in the
 first quarter. It's the fourth-fewest yards gained by New England in
 the first quarter of a game in their franchise's history and fewest
 since Nov. 10, 1996 at N.Y. Jets. It's the fewest first-quarter yards
 allowed by the Dolphins since they limited Houston to 0 in the first
 quarter on Oct. 25, 2015.

XAVIEN HOWARD'S TWO-GAME STRETCH

CB Xavien Howard put together the two best games of his young career in consecutive weeks during Miami's two-game home stretch late in the year. In Week 13 vs. Denver, he intercepted two passes and returned one for a touchdown. In Week 14 vs. New England, despite battling the flu on game day, Howard intercepted two more passes, **giving QB Tom Brady his first multi-interception game since Dec. 6, 2015 vs. Philadelphia.**

- Howard's pick-six vs. Denver was Miami's first interception return for a touchdown since LB Kiko Alonso won the San Diego game with a 60yard interception return for a touchdown on Nov. 13, 2016.
- Howard is the first cornerback in Dolphins history to have multiple interceptions in consecutive games.
- He became the first player to intercept Patriots QB Tom Brady twice in the same game since Indianapolis' Mike Adams had two interceptions against him on Nov. 16, 2014.
- The interceptions were Howard's third and fourth in his past two games after he did not have an interception in the first 18 regular season games of his career.
- Howard's five passes defensed in Week 13 were tied for the second-most in an NFL game this season.
 - Chicago's **Kyle Fuller** had six passes defensed on Dec. 24, 2017.

12 PASSES DEFENSED IN WIN OVER

Miami's defensive backs were all over Denver's receivers in Week 13, tallying 12 passes defensed. The total was tied for the fourth-most in a game in team history and the team's most since they recorded 12 on Oct. 31, 2010. The team was led by career highs in passes defensed by CB Xavien Howard (5) and CB Bobby McCain (3). It was tied for the second-most passes defensed by a team in the NFL this season.

RESHAD LED NFL SAFETIES IN TACKLES

S Reshad Jones earned the second Pro Bowl selection of his career this year and set a career high with 15 tackles (12 solo) at Kansas City in Week 16. **Jones finished the seasons with 122 tackles (94 solo), which led all NFL safeties and ranked No. 12 in the league, regardless of position.** His 122 stops also lead the team. Here is a look at the NFL leaders in tackles at the safety position:

RESHAD GETS INTO THE END ZONE

S Reshad Jones returned a fumble 14 yards for a touchdown in Week 12 at New England. It was the second fumble return for a touchdown of the season for Jones. He also had a 38-yard fumble return for a touchdown in Miami's Week 5 win vs. Tennessee. Jones was the only NFL player to have two fumble returns for touchdowns this season.

With the touchdown, Jones moved into sole possession of second place on the Dolphins' all-time defensive touchdown chart. It was the fifth defensive score of Jones' career:

ROOKIES PLAYED A BIG ROLE ON DEFENSE

The Dolphins relied heavily on rookies to improve their defense in 2017. Miami was one of just three teams to play eight rookies on defense (Oakland and San Francisco) and one of just six to have at least four rookies start games on defense (Cincinnati, Cleveland, Indianapolis, Oakland and San Francisco).

The starters were CB Cordrea Tankersley (11 starts), DT Davon Godchaux (five), LB Chase Allen (four) and DE Charles Harris (two). DT Vincent Taylor, S Maurice Smith, CB Torry McTyer and DE Cameron Malveaux also played snaps with the defense at critical points of various games. Allen, Malveaux, McTyer and Smith were all undrafted college free agents while the other four were selected by Miami in the 2017 NFL draft.



SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

RIZZI'S UNITS ARE SECOND IN THE NFL IN BLOCKED KICKS SINCE 2011

Associate Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator **Darren Rizzi** was promoted to the special teams coordinator role in 2011 and since then, **the Dolphins are second in the league with 22 total blocked kicks and lead the NFL with 10 blocked punts.** Here is how the Dolphins stack up in both categories:

DOLPHINS TIED FOR THIRD IN THE NFL WITH THREE BLOCKED KICKS IN 2017

The Dolphins punt and kick block units performed well in 2017 as the team totaled three blocked kicks. **DT Vincent Taylor** blocked field goals against the N.Y. Jets in Week 3 and the Baltimore Ravens in Week 8, and **DE Terrence Fede** blocked a punt in Week 13 against Denver.

Miami's three blocked kicks were tied for the third-most in the NFL in 2017. The L.A. Rams and Philadelphia Eagles blocked five kicks while Denver, Detroit, Tampa Bay, Indianapolis and New England blocked three kicks.

THE DENNEY STREAK

LS John Denney turned 39 years old in December and just finished his 13th NFL season. Denney has been Miami's long snapper for every game dating back to 2005 - a consecutive games streak that spans 208 regular season contests. That streak is the longest in Dolphins history and is tied for third-longest among all active NFL players.

THOMAS IS SECOND IN THE NFL IN SPECIAL TEAMS TACKLES SINCE 2014

5 Michael Thomas has been one of the NFL's most prolific special teams players since his first full season in the NFL in 2014. Thomas is second in the NFL with 54 special teams tackles since 2014. Thomas led the team this season with 11 special teams stops, which was tied for 19th in the league. He finished the 2016 season tied for the NFL lead with 19 special teams tackles.

MIAMI'S KICKOFF TEAM WAS THE NFL'S BEST

The Dolphins kickoff coverage unit was the best in the NFL as opponents' average starting field position is just the 23-yard line following kickoffs.

PARKEY TIED FOR BEST SEASON BY A KICKER IN DOLPHINS HISTORY

K Cody Parkey made quite the impact in his first season with the Dolphins. He made 21-of-23 (91.3 pct.) field goal attempts, with his only misses coming from 48 and 50 yards. His field goal percentage was eighth in the NFL and fifth in the AFC. Parkey's 91.3 field goal percentage tied the team record (min. 15 attempts) set by K Jay Feely in 2007, when he also was 21-of-23 (91.3 pct.).

Parkey doesn't just score points though. He is the only kicker in the NFL to successfully convert four onside kicks in a season since records that date back to 1997. The last time an NFL team successfully recovered three onside kicks was Indianapolis in 2014. On kickoffs, Parkey helped the Dolphins give their opponent the worst starting field position in the league as opponents average starting at their own 23-yard line following kickoffs.

PARKEY HITS THE SPOT

Parkey made three game-winning kicks this season. In Week 2, his first game with the Dolphins, he kicked the longest game-winning field goal in team history, a 54-yarder with 1:05 left to beat the L.A. Chargers. In Week 6, Parkey kicked a game-tying and game-winning field goal in the fourth quarter to win at Atlanta. It was the first time in Parkey's four-year NFL career he made game-tying and game-winning kicks in the same contest. Parkey also connected on a 39-yard game-winner with 22 seconds left to beat the N.Y. Jets in Week 7.

MIAMI DOLPHINS ANNOUNCE TEAM AWARD WINNERS

MIAMI – The Miami Dolphins today announced their team award winners for the 2017 season. Defensive tackle Ndamukong Suh was named the Dan Marino Most Valuable Player, defensive end Cameron Wake earned the Don Shula Leadership Award, center Mike Pouncey was named the team's Ed Block Courage Award winner and wide receiver Kenny Stills earned the Nat Moore Community Service Award. It marks the second consecutive season that Wake and Stills have won their respective awards.

Suh is a first-time winner of the Dan Marino Most Valuable Player award and the first defensive tackle to earn the honor. Entering Week 17, Suh has totaled 45 tackles (29 solo), 4.5 sacks, 6.5 stuffs, two passes defensed, 12 quarterback hits and two forced fumbles. His 4.5 sacks are tied for ninth among all NFL defensive tackles and his 6.5 stuffs are tied for fourth at the position. Suh's 51.5 sacks since entering the league in 2010 are the second-most among NFL defensive tackles in that span and his 55 stuffs lead the position. He has 416 career tackles (288 solo), the second-most by an NFL defensive tackle since 2010. Suh is the 15th defensive player to win the team's MVP award and just the fourth defensive lineman, joining Jason Taylor (2000, 2002, 2004, 2006), Adewale Ogunleye (2003) and Wake (2012). This award is voted on by South Florida media and the organization and was re-named the Dan Marino Most Valuable Player Award in 2000 to reflect the achievements of Hall of Fame quarterback and 12-time team MVP Dan Marino.



DT Ndamukong Suh was tied for fourth among NFL DTs with 6.5 stuffs in 2017



DE Cameron Wake has earned the team's leadership award four times.

Wake earned the Don Shula Leadership Award for the second consecutive season and the fourth time in his career. He also earned the honor in 2013, 2014 and 2016. Wake joins Taylor (2002, 2006, 2007, 2009) as the only players to win or co-win the award four-or-more times and is the first player in team history to win the award outright on four occasions as Taylor was a co-winner in 2009. Wake is one of six Dolphins to win the award in consecutive seasons, but the only one to win it in consecutive seasons on two separate occasions. The others to win it twice in a row include Zach Thomas (1998-99), Derrick Rodgers (2000-01), Junior Seau (2003-04), Jason Taylor (2006-07) and Karlos Dansby (2010-11). The Don Shula Leadership Award is voted on by the players and is given to the teammate who exhibits leadership on and off the field. It was re-named the Don Shula Leadership Award in 2005 to reflect the accomplishments of Hall of Fame Head Coach Don Shula.



C Mike Pouncey rebounded from a hip injury to play all 16 games.

Pouncey is a first-time recipient of the team's Ed Block Courage Award and the only center to earn the honor in team history. He bounced back from a hip injury that limited him to just five games in 2016 and was concerned he may not be able to continue his football career. Pouncey has started all 15 games this season and if he starts on Sunday, he'll have started all 16 games in a season for the first time since 2012. He began the season with 10 straight games without allowing a full sack before it came to an end at New England on Nov. 26. Those were the final 10 contests of a 26-game streak without allowing a full sack, which began back on Sept. 27, 2015. Each year, players from all 32 teams select a teammate to receive the Ed Block Courage Award. The recipient symbolizes professionalism, great strength and dedication. The honoree also is a community role model.


Stills is just the second offensive player in team history to win the Nat Moore Community Service Award in back-to-back seasons, joining Lousaka Polite (2009-10). He is the team's most active player in the South Florida community, making appearances and lending a hand nearly every single week. The team's nominee for the Walter Payton Man of the Year Award, Stills has become a pioneer among NFL players in addressing societal issues. His advocacy for social justice and equal rights has led to a partnership with RISE (Ross Initiative in Sports for Equality). Along with RISE, Stills has helped organize police ride alongs and CommUNITY tailgates, bringing local student-athletes, coaches, parents, community leaders, law enforcement and military personnel together at every Dolphins home game. Stills has used his platform to help inspire other NFL players to host similar programs in their local communities. Five other teams joined the effort and hosted their own ride alongs this season, encouraging dialogue and displaying the teamwork that unites communities and their NFL teams directly to youth in the area. The Nat Moore Community Service Award is given each year to a Miami Dolphins player recognized for his involvement in the South Florida community. The winner of this award is given to the player that logs the most community service hours and is named after Moore to highlight the commitment the former wide receiver had in the South Florida community. Moore spent 13 seasons in a Dolphins uniform, culminating by his placement on the Dolphins Honor Roll in 1999.

The collection at Hard Rock Stadium is one of the world's largest street art museums, curated by Goldman Global Arts. The exceptional line-up of international artists brings a variety of techniques and styles together to create a jaw-dropping tapestry of urban art contained in a single location.





NEW SEATING PRODUCTS

Hard Rock Stadium's modernization included doubling unique seating experiences from 8 to 16. Some of the newest seating products include:

The 72 Club: The 598 seats in the 72 Club take the premium seating experience to another level. It's the most luxurious seating experience in all of South Florida sports and entertainment. Seats are double-padded, have 11 inches more legroom and are located at midfield. At any point in-game, guests are able to walk on the field on their way to a private club designed by the Rockwell Group.



PHASE I

Phase I of the project that was completed for the 2015 season changed every seat in the stadium, rebuilt the concourses on the 100 and 300 levels, reduced capacity from 76,018 to 64,767, moved seats 25 feet closer to the field on the north and south sidelines, introduced five new premium spaces and allowed fans to enjoy improved food, enhanced concourses and 16 new restroom facilities throughout the venue.

Hard Rock Stadium's renovation stands apart in enhancing every fan experience. In delivering a new caliber of luxury, Phase I introduced The NINE hosted by Aston Martin Residences Miami, The 72 Club, the Hyundai Club, Ford Field Club and the Atos Club presented by Dell EMC.

For the everyday fan, new seating experiences debuted in the corner terraces, providing a unique social experience where guests watch the game from a half-round table and comfortable swivel chairs. Corner Terraces provide guests the enjoyment of sitting with family or friends without being confined to a row of seats.

Living Room Boxes: Hard Rock Stadium created four-person private Living Room Boxes. Located on the 35-yard line and within the Atos Club presented by Dell EMC and Ford Field Clubs in the end zones, Living Room Boxes are the biggest, most comfortable seats in the stadium. These boxes give guests the ability to watch replays and highlights on their own private screens.

Hyundai Club: The Hyundai Club is a club located between the 30-yard lines on the north side that offers wider, padded seats. The club is designed by the Rockwell Group.

Corner Terraces: The 100 level Corner Terraces provide a unique social experience where guests can watch the game from a high-top table and comfortable swivel chairs. Corner Terraces provide guests the enjoyment of sitting with family or friends without being confined to a row of seats.



The NINE hosted by Aston Martin Residences Miami: The NINE hosted by Aston Martin Residences Miami are nine open-air suites between the 30-yard lines that connect to a private club designed by the Rockwell Group. The NINE offers the best view of the field with the convenience of a private club.





PHASE II

For the 2016 season, a state-of-the-art canopy was installed that keeps as many as 92 percent of fans in the shade and protected from the rain along with four giant high-definition video boards.

On Aug. 17, 2016, the Miami Dolphins christened the second phase of the renovation with a landmark 18-year naming rights agreement with Hard Rock International to name the newly renovated facility Hard Rock Stadium.






SHADE CANOPY

- Shades approximately 92 percent of fans (increase from 17 percent in old stadium).
- The shade canopy is approximately 626,000 square feet [14.37 acres] and is comprised of 17,000 tons of steel.
- Covering the remainder of the canopy area [94,000 square feet] immediately adjacent to the ocular over the field is a translucent material called ETFE. This material provides supplemental light in the bowl while reducing solar heat.
- Four spires rise an additional 200 feet above the roof surface achieving a total height of 357 feet from the ground.
 Several steel cables secured at the top of each spire will be extended to the roof to provide additional structural support. Cable diameters range between 3.5" to 5.5" in

ALL NEW BANKUNITED CLUB LEVEL

The 2017 renovation brought additional luxury to the midsection of the stadium, renovating the BankUnited Club Level.

- Hard Rock Stadium's 147 suites were completely renovated during the 2016-2017 offseason. These suites offer luxury and comfort in the ultimate setting to watch any event.
- Suites vary in size from 10 seats up to 50 seats offering air conditioning and NFL Sunday Ticket, multi-feed sound systems, refrigerators, icemakers and private telephone services.
- Suite attendants provide personal service in each suite during the games. Centerplate caters the suites with a wide-variety of food and beverages from which to choose.

New in 2017, Hard Rock Stadium features Theatre Boxes on the BankUnited Club Level. These 4-6 person individual boxes are located in a shared suite environment with inclusive food and beverage. Hard Rock Stadium also debuted four new corner clubs, – including the new UHealth, University of Miami Health System Cornerstone Club – giving suite members access to the corner's interior space and bar.



PHASE III

Unveiled in 2017 are remodeled, modernized suites throughout the stadium offering a more intimate club space on the BankUnited Club Level with improved amenities and food, as well as the addition of theatre boxes and four new corner clubs.

Phase III of the renovation brought new party terraces on the 300 level of Hard Rock Stadium. These party terraces have a bar that services guests on the concourse, as well as a double-sided bar with awesome views of the field. Each corner includes two semi-private spaces that each can hold up to 100 people – creating a new experience for a total of 800 guests per event. The Dolphins additionally have made a commitment to donate a party terrace of 100 military tickets each game to local troops serving our country.

Throughout Phase III of the renovation, the exterior of the facility saw enhancements in the redesign of the parking lots and landscaping.

During the Phase III renovations, The NINE also received new teak flooring, enhancing the most luxurious atmosphere in sports to create the feel of watching a game from the back of a yacht.

Univision Deportes Radio 1140 AM is the Dolphins official Spanish radio broadcast partner for all preseason, regular season and playoff games. Raul Striker Jr. handles play-by-play duties with Eduardo Martell as a color analyst. WQBA 1140 AM additionally airs a pregame show and postgame show.

Defensive end/linebacker Jason Taylor was elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Feb. 4, 2017 and inducted into the Hall of Fame on Aug. 5, 2017.

In their long-awaited season debut, the Dolphins pulled off a remarkable fourth-quarter victory.

Cody Parkey's fourth field goal of the game, a 54-yarder with 1:05 remaining, gave the Dolphins a 19-17 victory against the Los Angeles Chargers at StubHub Center. Parkey, claimed off waivers from Cleveland on Sept. 3, improved to 6-for-6 in his career on field goals of 50 yards or longer.

The Dolphins clinched the victory on defense when Younghoe Koo missed a 44-yard field goal attempt with five seconds left.

Parkey's winning kick capped a 15-yard scoring drive after the Dolphins defense made a stop and Jakeem Grant had a 14-yard punt return. Jay Ajayi, who picked up where he left off last season by rushing for over 100 yards, started the drive with a 10-yard run.

Parkey earlier kicked field goals of 30, 28 and 35 yards, and Jay Cutler threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to Kenny Stills in his first game in a Dolphins uniform.

Antonio Gates for the Chargers on a 17-yard touchdown pass, which helped him set an NFL record for tight ends with his 112th career touchdown. Melvin Gordon scored on a 1-yard run and Younghoe Koo kicked a field goal in the first half.

SCORING DRIVES

The Dolphins said all week they were expecting a tough battle from the New York Jets regardless of what happened in the first two weeks of the NFL regular season, but they weren't expecting such a difficult afternoon at MetLife Stadium.

Veteran quarterback Josh McCown threw a 69-yard pass to Robby Anderson late in the first half and the Jets defense stifled the Dolphins in a 20-6 victory Sunday afternoon.

The Dolphins, coming off a thrilling 2-point victory against the Los Angeles Chargers in their delayed season opener, were one play away from being shut out for the first time since Dec. 22, 2013. DeVante Parker scored on a 3-yard touchdown pass from Jay Cutler on the final play of the game before Cody Parkey missed the extra point, perhaps a fitting ending for this disappointing afternoon.

The Dolphins did not take a snap inside the Jets 45-yard line until the fourth quarter, which is also the only time they converted a third-down

situation. The Dolphins were 0-for-3 in fourth-down conversions, including a pass by Matt Haack on a fake punt that resulted in an interception by safety Terrence Brooks.

Another fourth-down attempt came from the Jets 21-yard line early in the fourth quarter with the Dolphins trailing 20-0. The Dolphins reached the Jets 29-yard line later in the fourth quarter, but that drive ended with Brooks' second interception of the game.

Jay Ajayi, who rushed for 122 yards against the Chargers, was held to 16 yards on 11 carries.

The Dolphins defense started off strong, with Cameron Wake and Andre Branch each getting a sack in the first quarter, but the Jets started moving the ball effectively in the second quarter. The Dolphins also lost two defensive backs to injury when Byron Maxwell (eye) and Nate Allen(hamstring) left the game.

Maxwell returned and forced a turnover when he knocked the ball loose from running back Elijah McGuire and linebacker Mike Hull recovered the fumble.

A promising first drive had a disappointing ending for the Dolphins, and things didn't get better after that in London.

The Dolphins offense could get little going after an end zone interception on that first drive and the result was a 20-0 loss against the New Orleans Saints at Wembley Stadium.

Drew Brees threw touchdown passes to wide receiver Michael Thomas — not to be confused with Dolphins safety Michael Thomas — and running back Alvin Kamara, and Will Lutz kicked two field goals for the Saints.

The Dolphins drove 81 yards on the opening drive of the game and had a first-and-goal after a 22-yard completion from Jay Cutler to tight end Julius Thomas on third-and-7. But on first down from the Saints 4-yard line, cornerback Ken Crawley picked off Cutler when he attempted a fade pass to Thomas, who was lined up wide to the right.

The Dolphins had only one other promising drive, but that one ended with a questionable offensive pass interference call on Kenny Stills when Cutler had hit Jarvis Landry for a first down inside the New Orleans 40-yard line.

The Dolphins suffered their first shutout loss since December 2013 when they dropped a 19-0 decision against the Buffalo Bills.

The defense held New Orleans off the scoreboard until the final play of the first half when Lutz hit a 43-yard field goal. The Saints began the drive at midfield with 1:10 left after the Dolphins' previous was derailed by back-to-back penalties that created a first-and-26 from their 6-yard line.

Defensive end Cameron Wake had his second sack in two games in the fourth quarter, but Kamara scored on a 12-yard shovel pass on third-and-goal on the very next play.

New Orleans increased its lead to 10-0 when it took the second-half kickoff and marched 77 yards for a touchdown. The drive was kept alive when defensive tackle Davon Godchaux was flagged for a defensive holding on a third-and-1 where safety Reshad Jones dropped running back Mark Ingram in the backfield for a loss. There also was a fourth-and-inches conversion by Brees on a sneak when the spot barely was good enough for a first down.

The Saints made it 13-0 early in the fourth quarter when Lutz kicked a 45-yard field goal.

The Dolphins, meanwhile, did not take an offensive snap beyond their 40-yard line the second half until the final minutes.

Safety Reshad Jones recovered two fumbles, including one for a touchdown, and the defense recorded six sacks in a 16-10 victory against the Tennessee Titans at Hard Rock Stadium.

Jarvis Landry scored the go-ahead touchdown early in the fourth quarter when he caught a 6-yard pass from Jay Cutler on third-and-goal.

The six sacks, including two by Andre Branch, came against backup quarterback Matt Cassel, who started for Tennessee in place of the injured Marcus Mariota. Rookie first-round pick Charles Harris had his first NFL sack and it was a big one — it came on third down in the final four minutes of the fourth quarter.

The Dolphins then all but clinched the victory when Jay Ajayi gained a first down with an 8-yard run on third-and-7.

Jones and Cameron Wake shared a QB sack that almost produced a safety in the third quarter, and Ndamukong Suh had the other.

Jones' touchdown was the fourth of his career, but the first on a fumble return. The other three were on interception returns, including one against Tennessee in 2015.

It was the team's first fumble return for a touchdown since 2014 when Cortland Finnegan scored in London against the Oakland Raiders.

The Dolphins took the lead in the first quarter on Parkey's 41-yard field goal, which came after Jones recovered a DeMarco Murray fumble forced by rookie defensive tackle Davon Godchaux.

Jones' touchdown made it 10-0 before Tennessee cut the Dolphins with a field goal after the Titans recovered a Jay Ajayi fumble.

Tennessee tied the game in the third quarter with a 69-yard touchdown drive capped by an 11-yard pass from Cassel to tight end Phillip Supernaw. The play came after Supernaw had been flagged for two false starts to move the ball from the Miami 1-yard line to the 11.

Linebacker Rey Maualuga made his Dolphins debut after missing the first three games because of a hamstring injury.

The Dolphins pulled off a remarkable comeback in their first-ever visit to Atlanta's Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

The Dolphins scored 20 unanswered points in the second half to stun the defending NFC champion Atlanta Falcons, 20-17. This marked the first time the Dolphins erased a 17-point second-half deficit on the road since the famous "Fake Spike" game against the New York Jets in 1994.

Kicker Cody Parkey's second field goal of the game, a 38-yarder with 2:45 remaining in the fourth quarter broke a 17-17 tie. Safety Reshad Jones then clinched the victory when he intercepted Matt Ryan at the Dolphins 7-yard line with 38 seconds left after the Falcons had moved into field goal range.

Rookie third-round pick Cordrea Tankersley broke up Ryan's pass intended for tight end Austin Hooper and Jones was there to grab the floating ball.

Parkey earlier had tied the game with a 49-yard field goal in the fourth quarter after Jay Cutlerthrew touchdown passes to wide receivers Kenny Stills and Jarvis Landry.

Running back Jay Ajayi was a key factor in the victory as well, as he rushed for 130 yards — his second 100-yard performance of the season.

The defense shut out the potent Atlanta offense in the second half, to the pass rush and Jones' heroics.

The Dolphins began their comeback with the opening drive of the longest in terms of time since 2013 when they had a 9:10 drive again to running back Damien Williams.

The drive also featured an 18-yard completion from Cutler to Stills on third-and-2 and ended with the two hooking up for an 11-yard touchdown on third-and-7.

Matt Moore came off the bench to help the Dolphins produce another thrilling comeback victory.

After replacing injured starting quarterback Jay Cutler, Moore threw two touchdown passes to Kenny Stills to help erase a 28-14 fourth-quarter deficit and cornerback Bobby McCain had an interception to set up Cody Parkey's 39-game winning field goal with 22 seconds left as the Dolphins defeated the New York Jets 31-28 at Hard Rock Stadium.

The victory, which came a week after the Dolphins rallied from a 17-0 halftime deficit against the Atlanta Falcons, was their 12th consecutive in games decided by seven points of less. That's two shy of the NFL record, set by the Indianapolis Colts between 2008 and 2009.

On a first-and-10 from the Jets 15-yard line, McCain intercepted a pass near the sideline intended for wide receiver Jermaine Kearse.

Cutler threw two touchdown passes in the first half, connecting with Landry and Fasano, as the Dolphins score 14 points in the first half after combining for 13 in the first two quarters in their first five games.

Cutler and Moore became the first pair of Dolphins quarterbacks to throw touchdown passes in the same game since 2010 when Chad Henne and Tyler Thigpen did it in a 29-17 victory against the Tennessee Titans.

Quarterback Josh McCown threw for three touchdowns and ran for another for the Jets, who were trying to sweep the season series.

Along with Cutler, the Dolphins also lost left tackle Laremy Tunsil to a knee injury in the third quarter.

Quarterbacks Joe Flacco and Ryan Mallett each threw a touchdown pass to help the Ravens build a 20-0 halftime lead on their way to a 40-0 victory in a Thursday night game at M&T Bank Stadium.

The Dolphins completed their trio of prime-time games in disappointing fashion.

Running back Kenyan Drake had the Dolphins' longest offensive play of the season when he scored on a 66-yard touchdown run and Jay Cutler threw two touchdown passes, but it wasn't nearly enough as the Dolphins left Bank of America Stadium with a 45-21 loss.

But after the Dolphins took over at their own 20 with under a minute left, Jay Cutler was intercepted by linebacker Luke Kuechly and Carolina took a 17-7 lead into halftime after Newton threw a TD pass to tight end Ed Dickson.

Cornerback Xavien Howard scored on a pick-six, running back Kenyan Drake had a 42-yard touchdown run, and Terrence Fede blocked a punt when the Dolphins defeated the Denver Broncos 35-9 at Hard Rock Stadium.

The Dolphins set a season high for points, topping their 31 in their victory against the New York Jets on Oct. 22. Their output included two safeties, a first in franchise history.

Howard, who came into the game looking for his first career regular season interception, had another pick in the fourth quarter.

Tight end Julius Thomas, who spent the first four seasons of his NFL career with Denver, scored the Dolphins' first touchdown on a 9-yard reception. Jay Cutler threw a second touchdown pass, a 23-yarder to Kenny Stills, with 10:21 left in the fourth quarter.

The Dolphins got their first safety when an errant snap went over the head of Denver quarterback Trevor Siemian and he batted the ball out of the back of the end zone. The second came in the fourth quarter when Chase Allen forced the ball loose from Denver returner Isaiah McKenzie at the 3-yard line and McKenzie was tackled in the end zone after recovering the loose ball.

Cody Parkey also kicked a field goal.

Drake, getting an increased workload with running back Damien Williams inactive because of a shoulder injury, set career highs in attempts with 22 and yards with 116.

In their final prime-time appearance of the season, the Dolphins put together their best performance of 2017.

Jay Cutler threw three touchdown passes, including two to Jarvis Landry, Kenyan Drake had 193 yards from scrimmage, and Xavien Howard had two interceptions when the Dolphins defeated the New England Patriots 27-20 at Hard Rock Stadium on Monday Night football.

Drake rushed for 114 yards, his second consecutive 100-yard performance. Jakeem Grant also had a touchdown for the Dolphins, who beat New England in Miami for the fourth time in five years.

The Dolphins ended New England's 14-game road winning streak, which was the second-longest in NFL history. The Dolphins defense held New England to 0-for-11 in third-down conversions, the first time since 1991 the Patriots were shut out in that category.

The Dolphins led 27-10 going into the fourth quarter before New England made it a closer final score.

Howard, who had two picks in the 35-9 victory against the Denver Broncos eight days earlier, became the first cornerback in Dolphins history to record two interceptions in back-to-back games.

Howard's first interception came on New England's first drive after Cody Parkey had given the Dolphins a 3-0 lead with a 30-yard field goal. The big play on the drive was Drake's 26-yard run on his first carry of the game.

The Dolphins later converted a fourth-and-1 from the New England 36-yard line when Cutler threw a 15-yard pass to Parker after rolling out on a naked bootleg.

The Dolphins' two-game winning streak came to a disappointing end at New Era Field in Buffalo, but not without a valiant comeback effort.

Jakeem Grant enjoyed the best day of his young NFL career, but it wasn't enough to help the Dolphins defeat the Kansas City Chiefs.

Grant's 65-yard touchdown in the second quarter highlighted the first 100-yard receiving game of his career, but the Dolphins suffered a 29-13 loss that officially eliminated them from playoff contention.

Cody Parkey kicked two field goals for the Dolphins, who couldn't overcome two lost fumbles or shut down the versatile Kansas City offense. The Dolphins were 0-for-7 in third-down conversions, and they also didn't help their cause with penalties, as they gave the Chiefs two first downs with third-down penalties on defense and turned a third-and-9 on offense into a third-and-24 with a personal foul on guard Ted Larsen.

Jarvis Landry had five receptions, reaching the 100-catch mark on the season for the second time in his four-year NFL career. He's the only player in Dolphins history to reach the century mark.

Tyreek Hill had 109 receiving yards and running back Kareem Hunt rushed for 91 yards and a touchdown for the Chiefs, who clinched their second consecutive AFC West title. Kicker Harrison Butker had five field goals.

A high-scoring first half ended with Kansas City leading 20-13 after the Chiefs got a late field goal.

After the first drive of the game ended with a Jarvis Landry fumble near midfield, the Chiefs and Dolphins traded field goals.

Kansas City took a 10-3 lead early in the second quarter after Alex Smith threw a 52-yard pass to Hill on third-and-15 from the Chiefs 35-yard line. That drive ended with a 9-yard touchdown pass from Smith to tight end Travis Kelce, who went over 1,000 receiving yards on the season.

Jarvis Landry's record-setting day and a spirited comeback attempt were the highlights when the Dolphins ended their regular season against the Buffalo Bills at Hard Rock Stadium.

Landry had nine catches, giving him 112 on the season. That broke his own team record of 110, which he set in 2015. Landry broke the record with a 4-yard catch to the Buffalo 1-yard line, and he followed that with a 1-yard touchdown on a shovel pass.

Landry and running back Kenyan Drake both were ejected after an altercation broke out following Landry's touchdown, the only one for the Dolphins in a 22-16 loss that gave them a final record of 6-10.

Kicker Cody Parkey made his only field goal attempt, a 36-yard kick in the fourth quarter, to tie the Dolphins single-season for field goal accuracy by going 21-for-23. The record first was set by Jay Feely in 2007.

Defensive end Cameron Wake recorded 1.5 sacks, giving him 10.5 for the season. It marked the fifth time in nine NFL seasons that Wake reached double digits.

David Fales made his second regular season appearance with the Dolphins when he replaced Jay Cutler for the second offensive possession. He played the rest of the way and completed 29 of 41 passes for 265 yards.

He threw the shovel pass to Landry for his touchdown and had a 1-yard touchdown run with 1:56 left to cut the Buffalo lead to six points.

The Dolphins recovered the onside kick at its 37-yard line with 1:52 left, giving themselves a chance to pull a miracle comeback from a 22-3 fourth-quarter deficit.

The Dolphins advanced to the Buffalo 48-yard line before an interception by Jordan Poyer sealed the outcome.

The Dolphins took an aggressive approach to this game, going for it on fourth down twice in the first quarter and three times overall.
