SUPER BOWL LIII CHAMPIONS

The 13-3 Super Bowl LIII victory over the Los Angeles Rams marked the sixth Super Bowl win since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a total that is the most in the league over that span. Super Bowl LIII was the 11th Super Bowl in the history of the New England Patriots, the most Super Bowl berths in NFL history.

The Patriots victory over the Rams is their sixth Super Bowl win, tying the Pittsburgh Steelers for the most Super Bowl victories. The win was also the Patriots 37th postseason win, moving past Pittsburgh (36) for the most postseason wins in NFL history.

Bill Belichick won his sixth Super Bowl, joining George Halas and Curly Lambeau as the only coaches with six NFL championships. He has the most Super Bowl wins of any NFL coach. QB Tom Brady has now won six Super Bowls, breaking a tie with Hall of Fame DL Charles Haley (5) as the only NFL player to play on six Super Bowl-winning teams

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. In his 25 season of ownership, he has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous



success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (18), conference crowns (10) and Super Bowl championships (6) than any other NFL team. Additionally, the Patriots have achieved the most winning seasons (22) and have the fewest losing seasons (2) since Kraft assumed ownership beginning in 1994. Super Bowl LIII was the 10th Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has appeared in more than four Super Bowls. In Kraft's 25 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 20 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons. In 2018, Kraft earned his 22nd winning season in 25 years of owning the franchise.

NOTEWORTHY IN 2018

- Since purchasing the team in 1994, Robert Kraft has 33 career postseason wins as an owner, third-most in NFL history behind the Rooney Family in Pittsburgh (36) and the Green Bay Packers (34). The Rooney Family founded the Steelers in 1933 while the Green Bay Packers were founded in 1919.
- Under Robert Kraft's guidance, the 2000-09 Patriots set the NFL record for most wins in a decade in NFL history with 126 wins overall. With 11 wins in 2018, the Patriots tied that record for the current decade and set a new mark in the postseason with 129 total victories since 2010.

DYNASTY VS. DYNASTY

Of all of the great teams throughout the Super Bowl era, the New England Patriots and the San Francisco 49ers have set a standard of extended excellence above all of the others. The 49ers run of success spanned two decades, while New England's streak is still in progress.

- The Patriots won their sixth Super Bowl title to tie Pittsburgh for the most Super Bowl wins in NFL history.
- The Patriots extended their NFL record by reaching their eighth straight conference title game in 2018 (2011-18).
- The New England Patriots have 37 postseason wins and moved past Pittsburgh for the most postseason wins all-time.
- The Patriots have 113 regular-season wins this decade and need three more regular-season victories over the next two seasons to move past the Indianapolis Colts record of 115 wins from 2000-09 for the most regular season wins in a decade.

- The Patriots win at the N.Y. Jets (11/25/18) put the team at 8-3 and secured a record of .500 or better for the 18th straight season, behind only Dallas, who had 21 straight seasons at .500 or better.
- The Patriots have now had a winning record for 18 straight seasons (2001-18) after a win vs. Minnesota (12/2/18) moved the team to 9-3, the most consecutive winning seasons since the 1970 merger.
- Two Patriots were selected to the AFC Pro Bowl squad. QB Tom Brady joined Tony Gonzalez (14), Peyton Manning (14), Bruce Matthews (14) and Merlin Olsen (14) as the only NFL players with at least 14 Pro Bowl berths. CB Stephon Gilmore earned his second career Pro Bowl and first with the Patriots.
- Stephon Gilmore earned 2018 NFL All-Pro first team honors by the Associated Press. Gilmore is the fourth Patriots cornerback to be named First Team All-Pro after Ty Law (1998, 2003), Asante Samuel (2007) and Darrelle Revis (2014).
- Gilmore was also named to the Pro Football Writers of America's All-NFL Team.

- Cordarrelle Patterson was named Associated Press Second Team All-Pro as a kick returner. This marks Patterson's fourth time receiving All-Pro honors (First Team 2013 and 2016, Second Team 2015).
- Stephen Gostkowski was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Month for October. Gostkowski converted 11-of-12 field goal attempts, 15-of-15 extra points and kicked 17 touchbacks during the month, while New England finished October with a perfect 4-0 record.
- LB Dont'a Hightower was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the Patriots 38-31 victory over the Chicago Bears in Week 7. Hightower blocked a Chicago punt attempt that was recovered by LB Kyle Van Noy and returned 29 yards for a touchdown. The score put the Patriots ahead, 31-24, and gave them the lead for good.

400-POINT SEASONS

The Patriots extended their NFL record to 12 straight seasons with at least 400 total points (2007-18) after finishing fourth in the NFL in 2018 with 436 total points. The Chargers previously held the record by scoring at least 400 points in eight straight seasons from 2004-11. New Orleans has a current streak of eight straight seasons with 400 points.

RUSH TO VICTORY

Since 2000, New England is 51-1 in the regular season when a Patriot eclipses 100 yards rushing. The only loss during the Bill Belichick era came at Miami on Dec. 20, 2004, when Corey Dillon rushed for 121 yards on 26 carries and the Patriots fell 29-28 to the Dolphins. The Patriots defeated the Kansas City Chiefs, 43-40, on Oct. 14, 2018 at Gillette Stadium. It was just the second time in franchise history that the Patriots have played in a game that both teams scored 40 or more points. The only other occurrence was a 43-43 tie vs. Oakland on Oct. 16, 1964.

NO PUNTS; NO PENALTIES

The Patriots did not punt and were not charged with a penalty in the victory over Kansas City (10/14/18). It was the first time in the Super Bowl era that an NFL team played an entire game without punting or being charged an accepted penalty. It was the sixth time in franchise history that the Patriots were not charged with a penalty and the fifth time in franchise history that the Patriots did not punt in a regular-season game.

WIDE RECEIVERS IN A RUSH

WR Cordarrelle Patterson (61 yards) and WR Julian Edelman (28 yards) combined for 89 yards rushing on 13 attempts in the win vs. Green Bay on Nov. 4, 2018. It marked the most rushing attempts and yards by wide receivers in a single game in New England history, besting the 51 yards on 12 attempts by the wide receivers (38 by Patterson and 13 by Edelman) the previous week vs Buffalo.

CAREER NOTES

Tom Brady has quarterbacked the Patriots to victories in 207 of his 267 career regular-season starts, compiling a .775 winning percentage and giving him the best record of any quarterback in the Super Bowl era (since 1966). Brady's 155 career wins in his first 200 starts are the most in NFL history. Peyton Manning is second with 136 wins in his first 200 career starts.



2018 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Brady moved past Adam Vinatieri (236) for the most wins all-time with 237 wins after leading the Patriots to win in Super Bowl LIII.
- Brady was selected to his 14th career Pro Bowl in 2018, joining Tony Gonzalez, Peyton Manning, Bruce Matthews and Merlin Olsen as the only NFL players with at least 14 Pro Bowl berths.
- Brady (517) became the third QB in NFL history to throw 500 career touchdown passes, joining Peyton Manning (539), Drew Brees (520) and Brett Favre (508). Brady reached the mark with three touchdowns passes vs. Indianapolis (10/04/18). He is the only player with 500 touchdowns with one team.
- Brady has 590 touchdown passes overall (517 in the regular season and 73 in the postseason), the most in NFL history. He moved past Peyton Manning to take the lead with three TD passes at Miami (12/09/18).
- Brady moved past Peyton Manning in the win over the Jets (11/25/18) and now has the most total passing yards in NFL history, including the postseason, with 81,693 total passing yards.
- Brady passed for 279 yards at Pittsburgh (12/16/18) to become the fourth quarterback in NFL history to reach 70,000 regular-season passing yards. He now has 70,514 passing yards.
- Brady reached 4,000 yards passing for the 10th time in his career in 2018, becoming the third player to reach 10 seasons with 4,000 yards passing, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (12).
- Brady (267) made his 266th regular-season start at quarterback vs. Buffalo (12/23) to move out of a tie with Peyton Manning and into second all-time behind the 298 starts by Brett Favre.
- Brady has thrown touchdowns to 71 different players in his career, the most touchdown targets by a QB. Brady reached the milestone on a 34-yard touchdown pass to WR Josh Gordon vs Indianapolis (10/04/18). It was also his 500th career regular-season touchdown pass.
- Brady (269) appeared in his 267th regular-season game at Pittsburgh (12/16/18), moving him out of a tie with Peyton Manning for third-most games played by a quarterback, behind George Blanda (340) and Brett Favre (302).

2018 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Brady played his 19th season with the Patriots in 2018, joining Jim Marshall (19-Minnesota), Bruce Matthews (19-Houston/Tennessee), Darrell Green (20-Washington), Jackie Slater (20-L.A. Rams) and Jason Hanson (21-Detroit) as the only players with at least 19 seasons with one NFL team.
- Brady led the Patriots to his 15th 11-win season as a starter in 2018. Peyton Manning is second with 11 11-win seasons in the Super Bowl era.
- Brady became the fourth NFL player to reach 6,000 completions vs. the NY Jets on Dec. 30, 2018 and now has 6,004 career regular season completions.

Edelman had a 47-yard run vs. Indianapolis (11/18/12). It is the longest run by a Patriots receiver, topping Troy Brown's 35-yard run vs. Tampa Bay on (09/03/00) and Terry Glenn's 35-yarder vs. Kansas city (12/04/00).

FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State, where as a senior, he completed 56 percent of his passes (153-of-275 for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he

really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

FATHERLY ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told The Boston Herald. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."

SUPER BOWL MVP

Edelman was named Super Bowl MVP after finishing with 10 receptions for 141 yards in Super Bowl LIII. He became the seventh wide receiver to win Super Bowl MVP honors and the second Patriots wide receiver to win the award. Deion Branch was named MVP for his performance in Super Bowl XXXIX.

INCHING CLOSER TO THE TOP

Edelman ranks second all-time in NFL postseason history with 115 receptions. He is ranked second all-time in postseason receiving yards and is one of 15 players with at least 1,000 postseason receiving yards. He is the Patriots all-time playoff leader with 115 receptions and 1,412 receiving yards.

UNCONVENTIONAL JOURNEY

Despite a successful three-year lacrosse career at Penn State, Hogan, also a standout football player in high school, said that playing college football was always in the back of his mind. Having redshirted his sophomore year of lacrosse, Hogan had an extra year of athletic eligibility following his fourth academic year at Penn State. As the football itch still lurked, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth (N.J.) football team, and at the end of the season joined some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

"I honestly didn't know if I had what it took to play in the NFL," Hogan wrote in the Players Tribune. "Still, it was one of those things where I didn't want to look back in five years and be like, 'Man, I wish I would've tried."

Chris did not get invited to compete in the Combine that year but turned heads during a Pro Day at Fordham University. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

G TED KARRAS

SCHOOL'S NOT OUT

Although he already owns a bachelor's degree in communications and a master's degree in recreation, sport and tourism from his time at the University of Illinois, Ted Karras hasn't completely given up his notebook for an NFL playbook. Along with teammate Joe Thuney, Karras is pursuing his MBA from Indiana University thanks to an NFLPA program that provides tuition assistance for players while navigating a busy NFL schedule.

"It just seems to be that everyone keeps wanting to pay for my school, so I'm not going to turn it down," Karras told the Boston Globe.

Karras and Thuney began their MBA pursuit two weeks after the Patriots Super Bowl LI victory by taking online classes and Skyping with professors from Indiana University's Kelley School of Business up until training camp. They continued their classes in the 2018 offseason.

A FAMOUS NAMESAKE

A noted sports fan and basketball enthusiast. Shag's mother, Alicia McGuire, named him Shaquille Olajuwon Mason in 1993 after her two favorite NBA stars at the time, Shaquille O'Neal and Hakeem Olajuwon. Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater was named to seven straight Pro Bowls (2011-17) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the eighth straight season in 2018.

The special teams ace shared what it means to be a captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eightman rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."

Shoop convinced then head coach James Franklin to ask Butler to transition to defense.

"Coach Franklin brought me into his office and he asked me what I wanted, and I wanted whatever was best for the team," Butler told The Tennessean. "Because we were so short on defensive linemen at that time, that's how it happened."

DB Devin McCourty's 84-yard interception return for a touchdown in the win at Buffalo on Oct. 29, 2018 was his first career interception returned for a touchdown and the ninth-longest in team history. The pick-six was McCourty's second career score. His first touchdown came on a 104-yard kickoff return vs. the New York Jets on Oct. 21, 2012.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, joined the Patriots in the 2018 offseason for his 10th NFL season. The two became the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. In the season opener, Devin and Jason became the first set of twins to play together on the same NFL team since 1926 when Gene and Tom Golsen suited up together for the Louisville Colonels. Shaquill and Shaquem Griffin of the Seattle Seahawks also accomplished this unique occurrence on Kickoff Weekend. New England also had twins on the team last year, with TE Jacob Hollister on the roster again in 2018 and Cody was on the non-football/injury list.

Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and was a year behind his brother in eligibility. Devin became the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Jason, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

McCOURTY GOES LONG

McCourty had a 104-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. N.Y. Jets (10/21/12), the second longest kickoff return in team history. Ellis Hobbs has the longest in team history with a 108-yard return for a touchdown at N.Y. Jets on Sept. 9, 2007. McCourty was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

McCourty earned Associated Press All-Pro Second Team honors at safety in 2013 and 2016. He also earned Second Team All-Pro Honors as a rookie in 2010 when he played cornerback. McCourty joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Rod Woodson and Ronnie Lott as the only NFL players to earn All-Pro honors at both safety and cornerback.

BROTHERS IN ARMS

Devin and twin brother Jason McCourty have seen first-hand the effects of sickle cell disease. Both their aunt and uncle lived with the disease while their father carried the trait. Devin and Jason partnered with Embrace Kids Foundation to form their own "Tackle Sickle Cell" campaign aiming to educate the public, increase blood donations and raise money and awareness for the fight against sickle cell disease. Devin's work with the local Boston Children's Hospital has helped advance research of the disease with doctors now as close as they've ever been to a cure.
