Fire Frogs Recap (All-Time)

TODAY'S GAME: Opening day in the Florida State League and game one of a 4 game series split between Daytona and Kissimmee. This is the first of five series in 2018. Last year, the Fire Frogs went 7-7 against the Tortugas and 2-5 in Daytona.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP Jeremy Walker gets the call for the season opener in his Florida Fire Frogs debut. Walker played in his first full professional season with Single-A Rome and went 7-11 with a 3.97 ERA (61 ER/138.1 IP) and 100 strikeouts over 27 starts.

HIGHLY RANKED PROSPECTS: Entering the 2018 season, the Atlanta Braves have the second rated farm system in Minor League Baseball, according to MLB.com. Ian Anderson is ranked the top prospect on the Fire Frogs and 49th in Minor League Baseball by MLB.com. Cristian Pache, Joey Wentz and Bryce Wilson are also Fire Frogs players ranked in the top 15 in the Braves organization, according to MLB.com.

YOUNG STARTING PITCHING: The average age of the five projected starting pitchers is 20.6-years-old. Every starting pitcher is 22-years-old or younger with Ian Anderson(19) being the youngest.

NEW MANAGER: Luis Salazar is in his first sea-son as the Fire Frogs skipper and his eighth season overall as a manger in the Braves organization. Salazar spent his first five seasons (2011 to 2015) with the organization as the High-A skipper before managing the Double-A Mississippi Braves for the last two seasons (2016 and 2017). Salazar, who has 20-plus years of minor-league coaching and managerial experience, owns an overall managerial record of 769-836 (.479) over 14 seasons.

NEW PITCHING COACH: The 2018 season is Mike Maroth's third with the Braves organization and his first in a coaching role. Maroth joined the club in September of 2015 and spent his first two years working as the minor league pitching rehabilitation coordinator. Prior to joining Atlanta, Maroth spent four seasons as a pitching coach in the Detroit Tigers farm system, includ-ing working his final year (2015) with Triple-A Toledo. Maroth's Major League playing career spanned six sea-sons from 2002 to 2007, and included a pair of orga-nizations, Detroit (2002-07) and the St. Louis Cardinals (2007)...He made 161 appearances at the Major League level during his career, including 150 starts... Maroth compiled a 50-67 career record and a 5.05 ERA.

NEW HITTING COACH: Rene Tosoni is in his first season as a full-time coach in 2018...Tosoni, who made the transition from player to coach after retiring from his professional playing career in 2016, spent the 2017 season working as an assistant coach with Atlanta's Double-A affiliate Mississippi. The former outfielder played parts of seven seasons with the Minnesota Twins and Milwaukee Brewers or-ganizations from 2007 to 2013, including making his major league debut during the 2011 season with Minnesota...He also spent parts of three seasons, from 2014 to 2016, playing in the Independent League.

Today's Start: RHP Jeremy Walker makes gets the call to start the 2018 season for the Florida Fire Frogs against the Daytona Tortugas on Thursday night. The 22-year-old product from Gardner-Webb finished his 2017 season on a four-game winning streak for the Rome Braves (A-), going 3-0 with a 1.23era (4er/29.1ip) in the month of August with two complete games, and posting 19 strikeouts compared to just three walks.

Last Outing: The 6'5" hurler blanked the Columbia Fireflies (NYM, A-) over five frames, while surrendering five hits and punching out two.

vs. Daytona: Thursday will be the Advance, N.C. native's first career start against the Tortugas.

2017: Played his first full professional season with Single-A Rome and went 7-11 with a 3.97 ERA (61 ER/138.1 IP) and 100 strikeouts over 27 starts... Ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta farmhands in innings (5th, 138.1) and wins (T5th, 7), Pitched to a 4-4 record and a 1.90 ERA (13 ER/61.2 IP) over his final 11 starts of the season after going 3-7 with a 5.63 ERA over his first 16 turns... Tossed back-to-back 7.0-inning complete games on 8/6 and 8/12, including the first shutout of his career on 8/12 at Greenville.

2016: Made his professional debut with rookie-level Danville after being a fifth-round selection in the First-Year Player Draft and went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA (14 ER/39.2 IP) and 39 strikeouts over 13 games (five starts)... Compiled a 4.63 strikeout-walk ratio, the sixth-best mark in the Atlanta system... Pitched to a 1-0 record with a 2.60 ERA (5 ER/17.1 IP) over eight relief appearances, compared to a 2-3 mark and a 3.63 ERA (9 ER/22.1 IP) in five starts.

2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.

2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies...From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors...Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 8/30 vs. MIA. Compiled a 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.



MANAGER, LUIS SALAZAR

- During his time with the Brewers organization, he spent three seasons (1998-99 and 2000) as the Brewers' Tri-ple-A hitting coach:Louisville (1998 and 1999) and Indi-anapolis (2000), and in 1996 and 1997, he managed the Single-A Beloit Snappers.
- Salazar's first appointment as a coach came in 1995 with Chandler of the rookie-level Arizona League.
- In 1994, he worked as a scout for the Montreal Expos.
- A 13-year Major League veteran and Venezuelan native, Salazar played for the San Diego Padres, Chicago White Sox, Detroit Tigers and Chicago Cubs.
- Luis, 61, and his wife Graciela reside in Boca Raton, Fla. They have two children, son Carlos and daughter Viv-iana.

- Rene Tosoni is in his first season as a full-time coach in 2018...Tosoni, who made the transition from player to coach after retir-ing from his professional playing career in 2016, spent the 2017 season working as an assistant coach with Atlanta's Double-A a  liate Mississippi.
- The former outfi  ler played parts of seven seasons with the Minnesota Twins and Milwaukee Brewers or-ganizations from 2007 to 2013, including making his major league debut during the 2011 season with Min-nesota...He also spent parts of three seasons, from 2014 to 2016, playing in the Independent League.
- Tosoni was twice selected in the First-Year Player Draft by the Minnesota Twins...In 2004, they took him in the 34th round out of Terry Fox Secondary School in Port Coquitlam, B.C., and in 2005 they selected him in the 36th round out of Chipola College located in Mirianna, Fla.
