Monday..... Tuesday.... Wednesday Thursday... Friday.... Saturday TODAY'S GAME: The start of a four-game road trip to Fort Myers (MIN) for the Florida Fire Frogs. These teams will play a total of 11 games against one another and won't meet again for another series until August 3-5. Florida is 3-5 all time against the Miracle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 19-year-old Ian Anderson makes his 2018 season debut.... Played his first full professional season with Single-A Rome, and went 4-5 with a 3.14 ERA (29 ER/83.0 IP) and 101 strikeouts over 20 starts...Led all Atlanta farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) by averaging 11.0 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched...Pitched to a 6.15 ERA over six starts in May, but logged a 1.75 ERA (11 ER/56.2 IP) over 14 starts in the other five months of the season, including an 0.83 ERA (2 ER/21.2 IP) in seven starts after the All-Star break. Anserson is the fifth ranked prospect in the Braves organization according to Baseball America.

FIRE FROGS FALL IN EXTRAS: Florida's bats came alive in the ninth to force extras, but fell short of completing another comeback with a 2-1 loss in 10 innings to the Daytona Tortugas on Sunday afternoon at Osceola County Stadium. Cristian Pache tied the game in the ninth with an RBI triple to left-center field. RHP Joey Wentz made his 2018 debut going 4 innings allowing 3 hits, 1 run, and striking out 3. With the loss, Florida is 1-2 in one-run ballgames.

STRONG SHOWING FROM FLORIDA BULLPEN: Major League rehabber Chase Whitley relieved Joey Wentz in the fifth inning of Sunday's ballgame. He threw two perfect innings and was followed up by Bladimir Matos who also threw two perfect innings. The bullpen kept the Fire Frogs in the game by going a combined 6 innings and allowing just 2 hits and 1 unearned run.

FLORIDA INVOLVED IN 3 ONE-RUN BALLGAMES: Three of their first four games in 2018 have been decided by only one run. With the exception of Friday's game in Daytona, the Fire Frogs have had a chance to tie or win the game in the 9th.

HIGHLY RANKED PROSPECTS: Entering the 2018 season, the Atlanta Braves have the second rated farm system in Minor League Baseball, according to MLB.com...Ian Anderson is ranked the top prospect on the Fire Frogs and 49th in Minor League Baseball by MLB.com. Cristian Pache, Joey Wentz and Bryse Wilson are also Fire Frogs players ranked in the top 15 in the Braves organization, according to MLB.com.

YOUNG STARTING PITCHING: The average age of the five projected starting pitchers is 20.6-years-old. Every starting pitcher is 22-years-old or younger with lan Anderson(19) being the youngest.

SALAZAR TAKES OVER: Luis Salazar is in his first season as the Fire Frogs skipper and his eighth season overall as a manger in the Braves organization...Salazar spent his first five seasons (2011 to 2015) with the organization as the High-A skipper before managing the Double-A Mississippi Braves for the last two seasons (2016 and 2017)...Salazar, who has 20-plus years of minor-league coaching and managerial experience, owns an overall managerial record of 769-836 (.479) over 14 seasons.

KNOWLEDGE FROM CRAFTY LEFTY: The 2018 season is Mike Maroth's third with the Braves organization and his first in a coaching role... Maroth joined the club in September of 2015 and spent his first two years working as the minor league pitching rehabilitation coordinator...Prior to joining Atlanta, Maroth spent four seasons as a pitching coach in the Detroit Tigers farm system, including working his final year (2015) with Triple-A Toledo...Maroth's Major League playing career spanned six seasons from 2002 to 2007, and included a pair of organizations, Detroit (2002-07) and the St. Louis Cardinals (2007)...He made 161 appearances at the Major League level during his career, including 150 starts... Maroth compiled a 50-67 career record and a 5.05 ERA.

FRESH FACE WITH THE BATS: Rene Tosoni is in his first season as a full-time coach in 2018...Tosoni, who made the transition from player to coach after retiring from his professional playing career in 2016, spent the 2017 season working as an assistant coach with Atlanta's Double-A affliate Mississippi...The former outfielder played parts of seven seasons with the Minnesota Twins and Milwaukee Brewers organizations from 2007 to 2013, including making his major league debut during the 2011 season with Minnesota...He also spent parts of three seasons, from 2014 to 2016, playing in the Independent League.

<u>Today's Start:</u> 19-year-old Ian Anderson makes his 2018 debut in the series opener against the Fort Myers Miracle on Monday night. The 6'3" hurler comes into the campaign as the Atlanta Braves fifth-ranked prospect in both Baseball America and MLB.com, and is the 42nd- (Baseball America) and 51st- (MLB. com) overall rated prospect in baseball.

<u>Last Outing:</u> The native of Rexford, N.Y. gave up two hits, walked a man, and punched out two against the Greenville Drive on August 12, 2017.

vs. Fort Myers: Monday will be Anderson's first career start against the Miracle.

2017: Played his first full professional season with Single-A Rome, and went 4-5 with a 3.14 ERA (29 ER/83.0 IP) and 101 strikeouts over 20 starts...Led all Atlanta farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) by averaging 11.0 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched...Pitched to a 6.15 ERA over six starts in May, but logged a 1.75 ERA (11 ER/56.2 IP) over 14 starts in the other five months of the season, including an 0.83 ERA (2 ER/21.2 IP) in seven starts after the All-Star break...Named South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week for the period of 5/22-28 after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 11 strikeouts on 5/25 vs. Augusta...Did not allow a home run on the season, and has surrendered just one homer over 122.2 professional innings...Entered 2017 named by Baseball America as Atlanta's No. 5 prospect, and as the No. 66 prospect in the minor leagues.

2016: Split his first professional season between the GCL Braves and rookie-level Danville, combining to go 1-2 with a 2.04 ERA (9 ER/39.2 IP) over 10 starts...Made five starts with the GCL Braves before advancing to Danville on 8/10...Allowed five earned runs over 4.0 innings on 8/22 vs. Bluefield, but pitched to a 0.99 ERA (4 ER/35.2 IP) in his other nine appearances...Limited left-handed batters to a .172 (10-for-58) average against him, while righties hit .277 (23-for-88)...Held opposing batters to a .189 (10-for-53) average with runners on base...Selected by the Braves with the third overall pick in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, Atlanta's highest draft selection since 1991, when it took Mike Kelly second overall...Rated as the 12th-best prospect by Baseball America in the 2016 draft class, and also earned the distinction by the publication as having the "Best Delivery" by a prep pitcher...ESPN ranked him as the seventh-best player and the third-best prep pitcher in the 2016 class.

2017: Acquired by Atlanta in January and played the full season with Single-A Rome...His 92 strikeouts led all Atlanta relief farmhands, and his 12.4 SO/9.0 IP was the second-best rate in the system (min. 60.0 IP)...Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratic (T6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)...Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.

2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted .290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season... Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.

2016; Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies...From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors...Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 6/30 vs. MIA. Compiled a 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.
