**TODAY'S GAME:** First game of a three-game road trip to Palm Beach (STL) for the Florida Fire Frogs. These teams will play a total of 12 games against one another and won't meet again for another series until May1-3. Florida is 6-7 all time against the Cardinals.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER:** LHP Joey Wentz makes his second start of the 2018, and first since April 8th at Daytona. Wentz spent the full season with Single-A Rome and went 8-3 with a 2.60 ERA (38 ER/131.2 IP) and 152 strikeouts...Ranked in the Top 10 among Braves farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) in starter's ERA (T2nd, 2.60), wins (T3rd, 8), strikeouts (3rd, 152), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 10.4), innings pitched (7th, 131.1) and hits per 9.0 innings (T8th, 6.8)...Named by the South Atlantic League as a Post-Season All-Star and as the league's Most Outstanding Pitcher...Ranked second in the SAL in strikeouts and fourth in ERA.

**FLORIDA FALLS SHORT OF SPLIT WITH LOSS TO FT. MYERS:** The Florida Fire Frogs finished up their four-game series against the Fort Myers Miracle on Thursday night with an 8-2 loss at Hammond Stadium. The defeat handed the Fire Frogs their second series defeat to start the season.

**CLEAN DEFENSE:** With another errorless game on Thursday night, the Fire Frogs have committed just two errors through their first eight contests to open up the 2018 campaign (second best in the league). The Bradenton Marauders are the only team in the Florida State League that has committed just one error this season.

Through eight games during their inaugural season, Florida had already committed 14 defensive miscues, and finished the month of April with 43.

**REVERSAL OF FORTUNE:** With another one-run game on Tuesday, Florida has now had five games decided by two runs or less to open 2018, and is 2-3 in those contests. Both of Florida's wins this season have come by one run: 3-2 over the Daytona Tortugas on Opening Night, and Tuesday night's 1-0 victory over Fort Myers.

The Atlanta Braves High-A affiliate finished their inaugural campaign 22-44 in similar games.

**HIGHLY RANKED PROSPECTS:** Entering the 2018 season, the Atlanta Braves have the second rated farm system in Minor League Baseball, according to MLB.com...Ian Anderson is ranked the top prospect on the Fire Frogs and 49th in Minor League Baseball by MLB.com. Cristian Pache, Joey Wentz and Bryse Wilson are also Fire Frogs players ranked in the top 15 in the Braves organization, according to MLB.com.

**Today's Start:** 20-year-old Joey Wentz starts the first of a three-game series against the Palm Beach Cardinals Friday night. The 6'5" lefty has not lost a game since May 8, 2017, winning his last seven decisions of 2017.

**Last Outing:** He recorded a no-decision against the Daytona Tortugas on April 8th allowing one run on three hits in four innings of work.

**vs. Palm Beach:** Friday will be Wentz's first career start against the Tortugas.

**2017:** Spent the full season with Single-A Rome and went 8-3 with a 2.60 ERA (38 ER/131.2 IP) and 152 strikeouts...Ranked in the Top 10 among Braves farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) in starter's ERA (T2nd, 2.60), wins (T3rd, 8), strikeouts (3rd, 152), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 10.4), innings pitched (7th, 131.1) and hits per 9.0 innings (T8th, 6.8)...Named by the South Atlantic League as a Post-Season All-Star and as the league's Most Outstanding Pitcher...Ranked second in the SAL in strikeouts and fourth in ERA...Ended the season on a seven-game winning streak, going 7-0 with a 2.35 ERA over his final 17 starts...Entered the season tabbed by MLB.com as Atlanta's No. 8 prospect, and by Baseball America as the Braves' No. 15 farmhand.

**2016:** Selected by the Braves with the 40th overall selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and split his first professional season between the GCL Braves and rookie-level Danville, going 1-4 with a 3.68 ERA (18 ER/44.0 IP) over 12 starts...Opened his career with four scoreless outings for the GCL Braves before advancing to Danville on 7/20...Baseball America tabbed him as the 10th-best prospect in the Appalachian League at the season's end... Entered the 2016 draft ranked as Baseball America's 26th-best prospect and the 16th-best player in the draft class according to MLB.com...Led Shawnee Mission East High to the 2016 Kansas Class 6A state championship and was named the Sunflower League Player of the Year after going a perfect 9-0 while not allowing an earned run in 51.1 innings pitched...Struck out 104 batters over 51.1 high-school innings and allowed just seven hits with 12 walks
