TODAY'S GAME: Game two of the three-game series against the St. Lucie Mets (NYM) (1-0). First of four series between the two teams in 2018. Florida finished 2017 with a 3-11 record against St. Lucie, including 2-5 at Osceola County Stadium.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 22-year-old Tucker Davidson makes his third start of the season in game two of the threegame series against the St. Lucie Mets on Wednesday night. The Amarillo, Texas native enters the 2018 season as the 13th- (Baseball America) and 23rd- (MLB.com) ranked prospect in the Atlanta Braves organization.

The 6'2" southpaw allowed four runs over 2.2 innings of work on six hits, five walks and two strikeouts in a losing decision to the Fort Myers Miracle on April 12. The Texas nataive tossed 71 pitches, with 35 going for strikes.

Wednesday will be Davidson's first career start against the Mets.

EARLY OFFENSE SPARKS VICTORY OVER METS: The Florida Fire Frogs plated three runs in the first three innings to jump out to an early lead against the St. Lucie Mets on Tuesday night, leading to a 3-1 victory at Osceola County Stadium on Tuesday night. The series opener was the ninth contest to be decided by two runs or less through 12 games for the Fire Frogs to start the 2018 season.

Jared James started the scoring with an RBI single in the first to bring home Jordan Rodgers, Ray-Patrick Didder smacked his first home run of the season to start the second frame and struck again in the third to drive in James for the third run in as many innings for the Fire Frogs.

Jeremy Walker, Mauricio Cabrera, Jon Kennedy, Chad Sobotka and Devan Watts combined to limit the Mets to just one run on five hits, but also walked eight batters on the night.

JAMES' JAMS: Jared James pieced together three hits on Tuesday, giving the corner outfielder back-to-back three-hit performances. The Sacramento native has six hits in nine chances over his last two games, and is currently on a three-game hitting knocks and drove in two. streak in which he is batting .583 (7-for-12) with two runs, two RBI and three stolen bases.

LIGHTS OUT: Devan Watts earned his second save of the season in as many chances, and in as many games, on Tuesday night to lock down the two-run victory. The right-hander only faced one batter, but stranded the bases loaded with a groundout from Anthony Dimino to end the game. The North Carolina native was a perfect 4-for-4 in save opportunities for the Fire Frogs in 2017 in 19 games.

TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT: With 12 games played this season, nine have already been decided by two runs or less for Florida. The Fire Frogs have gone 4-5 this season in close contests, and are 26-49 in just over a year in those games. All four of the Fire Frogs victories have been decided by two runs or less (two by one run, two by two runs).
