Game #17 - Home Game #8

TODAY'S GAME: Rubber match of a three-game series with the Lakeland Flying Tigers (DET) (1-1)... First of four series between the two clubs in 2018...Florida went 4-5 against Lakeland in 2017, including 2-2 at Osceola County Stadium.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP Jeremy Walker makes his fourth start of the 2018 in the rubber match against the Lakeland Flying Tigers...The 22-year-old product from Gardner-Webb finished his 2017 season on a four-game winning streak for the Rome Braves (A-), going 3-0 with a 1.23era (4er/29.1ip) in the month of August with two complete games, and posting 19 strikeouts compared to just three walks...The 6'5" hurler allowed shut out the St. Lucie Mets through 4.2 innings on April 17...The North Carolina gave up four hits, walked a man and picked up a strikeout in the no-decision...Sunday will be Walker's first career start against the Flying Tigers.

FIRE FROGS BOUNCE BACK WITH WIN OVER FLYING TIGERS: The Florida Fire Frogs bounced back with a 7-5 victory over the Lakeland Flying Tigers on Saturday night at Osceola County Stadium, forcing a rubber match for the finale of the three-game set on Sunday morning...Florida grabbed the early advantage with an RBI single from Brett Cumberland in the first, but Lakeland knotted the contest with a two-out rally in the second...The Fire Frogs plated a run in the third and two more in the fourth for the three-run lead, but a three-error fifth allowed three runs to cross for the visitors to tie the game at four...But the home team pushed across three runs of their own to jump out in front for good.

COMEBACK TRAIL: Jose Bautista hit lead-off and started at third his 2018 debut on Saturday. The 37-year-old veteran flew out to left field on a 3-2 pitch in his first at-bat, flew out to center in the third, earned a walk to start the fifth, and bounced a single through the hole on the right side of the infield in his final plate appearance in the sixth.

LUCK ON THEIR SIDE: The Fire Frogs committed six errors on Saturday, setting a new team record...Despite the defensive miscues, Florida still managed to take the game by two runs...The team's previous high happened in 2017 when the club committed four errors in a game twice, with the most recent game occurring on April 23 against the Clearwater Threshers.

TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT: With 16 games played this season, 12 have already been decided by two runs or less for Florida...The Fire Frogs have gone 6-6 this season in close contests, and are 28-50 in just over a year in those games...All six of the Fire Frogs victories have been decided by two runs or less (three by one run, three by two runs).

2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted .290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.

2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies...From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors...Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 6/30 vs. MIA. Compiled a 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.

- During his time with the Brewers organization, he spent three seasons (1998-99 and 2000) as the Brewers' Triple-A hitting coach: Louisville (1998 and 1999) and Indianapolis (2000), and in 1996 and 1997, he managed the Single-A Beloit Snappers.
- Salazar's first appointment as a coach came in 1995 with Chandler of the rookie-level Arizona League.
- In 1994, he worked as a scout for the Montreal Expos.
- A 13-year Major League veteran and Venezuelan native, Salazar played for the San Diego Padres, Chicago White Sox, Detroit Tigers and Chicago Cubs.
- Luis, 61, and his wife Graciela reside in Boca Raton, Fla. They have two children, son Carlos and daughter Viviana.
