TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 20-year-old Kyle Muller makes his team debut in game two of the three-game set against the St. Lucie Mets on Tuesday night...The southpaw made six starts with the Rome Braves, going 3-0 with a 2.40 ERA across 30 innings of work (8er)...The Dallas native earned this third consecutive quality start, holding the Lakewood BlueClaws to three runs on seven hits, a walk and three strikeouts in 6.1 innings of work...The 6-foot-7 hurler tossed 88 pitches, with 54 going for strikes...Tuesday will be Muller's first career start against the Mets.

LATE LEAD SLIPS AWAY IN SERIES-OPENING LOSS: For a second consecutive game, a late lead slipped through the Florida Fire Frogs fingers, as the Atlanta Braves Advanced-A affiliate fell 3-2 to the St. Lucie Mets at First Data Field on Monday

Sean McLaughlin surrendered a two-out, two-run homer off the bat of Luis Carpio in the eighth inning that saw a 2-1 advantage turn into a 3-2 deficit.

Cristian Pache returned from a two-game hiatus and hit leadoff for the first time this season, finishing 2-for-5 with a run scored in the first to give Florida an early 1-0 lead. Alejandro Salazar drove in the go-ahead run in the seventh inning after an 18-minute delay due to a power outage.

SIZZLING ON THE MOUND: Troy Bacon fired in 2.2 scoreless innings on Monday night, stretching his scoreless-inning streak to a team-high, 9.0 innings...The last run the Tampa native allowed came on a lead-off home run in the ninth inning against the Lakeland Flying Tigers on April 26...The right-hander then retired the next three batters to start the streak.

SALAZAR'S STREAK: Alejandro Salazar extended his on-base streak to 11 games with a singles in his final two at-bats in the opener. The 21-year-old infielder is batting .421 (16-for-38) during the streak...The streak includes a team-best, eight-game hitting streak from April 25-May 4 (13-for-30).

COOL AS A CUCUMBER: Brett Cumberland drew a free pass in his final at-bat in the eighth, extending the Cal product's on-base streak to 12 consecutive games....During the streak, the switch hitter is batting just .205 (8-for-39), but he has drawn 11 walks...The 22-year-old leads the clubs with 15 walks on the season, and is tied for seventh in the league in that category.

ROSTER MOVES: Right-handed pitcher Bryse Wilson has been promoted to Double-A Mississippi...The 20-year-old paced the Fire Frogs with a 0.34 ERA (1er/26.2ip) and WHIP (0.86)...The fourth-round draft pick in 2016 came into Tuesday ranked second in all of Minor League Baseball with the 0.34 ERA, behind only Caleb Ferguson's 0.33 mark on the Tulsa Drillers (LAA, AA).

Jon Kennedy returns to Florida from Triple-A Gwinnett...The native of Melbourne, Australia is coming off a spot start with the Stripers on Monday night, allowing four runs on five hits and two strikeouts in four innings of work.

Monday's starter, Dilmer Mejia, will be moved back to Danville after allowing just one run on four hits, three walks and two strikeouts in his High-A debut against the Mets.



2018: Entered the season as the Atlanta Braves 12th-ranked prospect, according to MLB.com...Transferred to the Florida Fire Frogs on May 8.

2017: Played his first full professional season with rookie-level Danville, going 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (22 ER/47.2 IP) and 49 strikeouts over 11 games, all starts...Allowed two or fewer earned runs in eight of his 11 starts...Opponents batted just .232 against him, including a .184 (7-for-38) mark by left-handed batters...Entered the season tabbed by MLB.com as Atlanta's No. 13 prospect, while Baseball America named him No. 17.

Saves/Opp: — Holds: 2 1st Batter/retired: 10/5 Inherited Runners/Scored: 3/2 2017; Acquired by Atlanta in January and played the full season with Single-A Rome...His 92 strikeouts led all Atlanta relief farmhands, and his 12.4 SO/9.0 IP was the second-best rate in the system (min. 60.0 IP)... Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratio (T6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)...Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.

2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted 290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

Saves/Opp: 0/1 Holds: 1 1st Batter/retired: 10/5 Inherited Runners/Scored: 3/0 2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.

2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph.
