TODAY'S GAME: Game one of a three-game series against the Dunedin Blue Jays at Dunedin Stadium...First of four series between the two clubs in 2018, including two three-game sets at Dunedin Stadium...The Fire Frogs finished 5-8 against the Blue Jays in 2017, including 1-6 on the road.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 20-year-old Kyle Muller makes his third start at the High-A level in the opener of the threegame set against the Dunedin Blue Jays on Monday night...The southpaw made six starts with the Rome Braves, going 3-0 with a 2.40 ERA across 30 innings of work (8er)...The Dallas native did not factor into the decision on May 15 against the St. Lucie Mets at Osceola County Stadium...The 2016 second-round draft pick allowed two runs on three hits, four walks and six strikeouts in 4.2 innings of work...Monday will be Muller's first career start against the Blue Jays.

RAIN, RAIN, GO AWAY!: Sunday's games against the Clearwater Threshers were postponed due to rain at Osceola County Stadium...The two clubs will make up Saturday's suspended game on Friday, June 1 before a schedule 6:15 start against the Threshers at Spectrum Field, and make up Sunday's originally scheduled game on Saturday, June 2 as part of a twin bill in Clearwater...The Fire Frogs played just three games of their seven-game homestand this past week, excluding Saturday's suspension.

SATURDAY'S CONTEST SUSPENDED IN THE SIXTH: The Florida Fire Frogs and Clearwater Threshers were suspended in the top of the sixth inning with runners at second and third and two outs during a 3-1 count to Mickey Moniak on Saturday night at Osceola County Stadium. The game will be resumed on Sunday at 11 a.m., and will be followed by a nine-inning contest to close out the three-game set.

The Fire Frogs had a chance to break through the scoreboard in the top of the sixth with runners at first and second with two outs, but Cristian Pache flew out to centerfield to end the threat.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Ian Anderson tied a season-high with seven strikeouts during his eighth start of the season. The third overall pick in the 2016 draft recorded two of the punchouts against 2016's first overall pick, Moniak...The 20-year-old lowered his ERA at home to 1.34 (3er/20.1ip), compared to 5.51 on the road (10er/16.1ip)...The two runners left on base when Saturday's game was suspended do belong to the right-hander's line, but even if they cross the plate, his home ERA is still an impressive 2.24.

BULLPEN BASICS: Mauricio Cabrera and Connor Johnstone bridged the gap to the ninth with scoreless eighth and ninth innings, and Devan Watts worked around back-to-back, one-out singles in the final frame by inducing a game-ending double play off the bat of Edgar Cabral...Florida's bullpen has turned thing around in the month of May, posting an ERA of 2.29 (13er/51.2), after throwing up a 3.42 mark (43er/113ip) during the opening month of the season.

WELCOME BACK, WATTS: Devan Watts made his first appearance with Florida since April 17, giving up two hits en route to his team-leading, thirs save of the season...The product of Tusculum College is a perfect 3-for-3 in save chances as a Fire Frogs this season, and is 7-for-7 in his career at the High-A level.

2018: Entered the season as the Atlanta Braves 12th-ranked prospect, according to MLB.com...Transferred to the Florida Fire Frogs on May 8.

2017: Played his first full professional season with rookie-level Danville, going 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (22 ER/47.2 IP) and 49 strikeouts over 11 games, all starts...Allowed two or fewer earned runs in eight of his 11 starts...Opponents batted just .232 against him, including a .184 (7-for-38) mark by left-handed batters...Entered the season tabbed by MLB.com as Atlanta's No. 13 prospect, while Baseball America named him No. 17.

2016: Played his first professional season with the GCL Braves and earned the club's Pitcher of the Year honors...Closed his rookie campaign as the 11th-best prospect in the Gulf Coast League as named by Baseball America...Prior to being drafted, earned 2016 Gatorade National Player of the Year honors after pitching to a perfect 8-0 record with a 0.46 ERA and 133 strikeouts in 76.0 innings at Jesuit College Prep, and entered the First-Year Player Draft as the 25th-best player in the class according to Baseball America...Hit .396 with 15 home runs in his final season at Jesuit Prep...Taken as the 44th-overall selection in the 2016 draft (taken after Ian Anderson and Joey Wentz)...Signed for \$2.5 million.

Saves/Opp: — Holds: 2 1st Batter/retired: 12/5 Inherited Runners/Scored: 5/3 2017; Acquired by Atlanta in January and played the full season with Single-A Rome...His 92 strikeouts led all Atlanta relief farmhands, and his 12.4 SO/9.0 IP was the second-best rate in the system (min. 60.0 IP)... Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratio (T6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)...Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.

2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted .290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

Saves/Opp: 0/1 Holds: 3 1st Batter/retired: 13/6 Inherited Runners/Scored: 3/0 2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.

2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies...From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors...Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 6/30 vs. MIA. Compiled at 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.
