TODAY'S GAME: Game two of a four-game series against the Tampa Tarpons at Osceola County Stadium (1-0)...Third of four series between the two clubs in 2018, including two, and final set in Kissimmee...The Fire Frogs are 3-3 against the Tarpons this season after finishing 0-12 against the New York Yankees' affiliate in 2017.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 20-year-old Ian Anderson makes his ninth start of 2018 in game two of the four-game series against the Tampa Tarpons on Friday night...The 6'3" hurler came into the campaign as the Atlanta Braves fifth-ranked prospect in both Baseball America and MLB.com, and is the 42nd- (Baseball America) and 51st- (MLB.com) overall rated prospect in baseball...The native of Rexford, N.Y. held the Clearwater Threshers off the board through 5.2 frames on May 19 in a suspended game...The right-hander tied a season-high with seven strikeouts, and gave up just two hits while handing out three walks...Friday will be Anderson's third career start against the Tarpons...The third overall pick in the 2016 draft blanked Tampa over seven frames on two hits, a walk and seven punchouts at Osceola County Stadium on May 6...His next start on May 12, Anderson allowed two runs on four hits, four free passes and seven strikeouts across five innings of work at George M. Steinbrenner Field.

FLORIDA OPENS HOMESTAND WITH WIN OVER TAMPA: The Florida Fire Frogs hot stretch continued into Osceola County Stadium, as the home team took out the Tampa Tarpons, 9-1, to open up a four-game series.

Florida jumped all over Nick Nelson in the first inning, striking for two runs before recording an out. Cristian Pache singled on the first pitch from the right-hander, and moved up to third after back-to-back walks to Alejandro Salazar and Brett Cumberland. Kurt Hoekstra drilled a double over the head of Isiah Gilliam in left field, plating Pache and Salazar for the 2-0 advantage. The Fire Frogs tacked on anther run in the opening frame on a wild pitch to Braxton Davidson.

Tucker Davidson took a seven-run advantage into the fifth, but surrendered a lead-off home run on the first pitch of the inning to Angel Aquillar. The southpaw did not allow another tally through his remaining two innings, as the 22-year-old worked his second consecutive quality start with the one run allowed on five hits, a walk and four strikeouts for his third win in the month

WALK THIS WAY: The Fire Frogs set a team record with nine walks drawn at the plate, surpassing the previous high of eight set on May 8 of this season against the St. Lucie Mets.

TUCKED AWAY: Tucker Davidson limited the Tarpons to just one run on five hits, a walk and four strikeouts on Thursday night...The southpaw improved to 3-0 in the month of May, with an ERA of 3.22 (8er/22.1ip) after going 0-4 with a 9.17 ERA (18er/17.2ip) during April...The 22-year-old is now 2-0 at home this season, and has allowed just four runs over 21.1 frames at Osceola County Stadium in 2018.

SLEEPING GIANTS: After being shut out and no-hit through the first six innings of a doubleheader against the Dunedin Blue Jays on May 22. Florida's offense has tallied 27 runs on 36 hits over its last 27 innings...The Fire Frogs had scored just 23 runs over their previous seven games.

2018: Tossed a career-high seven innings against the Tampa Tarpons on May 6 at Osceola County stadium, blanking the New York Yankees High-A affiliate on two hits, a walk and seven strikeouts.

2017: Played his first full professional season with Single-A Rome, and went 4-5 with a 3.14 ERA (29 ER/83.0 IP) and 101 strikeouts over 20 starts...Led all Atlanta farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) by averaging 11.0 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched...Pitched to a 6.15 ERA over six starts in May, but logged a 1.75 ERA (11 ER/56.2 IP) over 14 starts in the other five months of the season, including an 0.83 ERA (2 ER/21.2 IP) in seven starts after the All-Star break...Named South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week for the period of 5/22-28 after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 11 strikeouts on 5/25 vs. Augusta...Did not allow a home run on the season, and has surrendered just one homer over 122.2 professional innings...Entered 2017 named by Baseball America as Atlanta's No. 5 prospect, and as the No. 66 prospect in the minor leagues.

2016: Split his first professional season between the GCL Braves and rookie-level Danville, combining to go 1-2 with a 2.04 ERA (9 ER/39.2 IP) over 10 starts...Made five starts with the GCL Braves before advancing to Danville on 8/10...Allowed five earned runs over 4.0 innings on 8/22 vs. Bluefield, but pitched to a 0.99 ERA (4 ER/35.2 IP) in his other nine appearances...Limited left-handed batters to a .172 (10-for-58) average against him, while righties hit .277 (23-for-88)...Held opposing batters to a .189 (10-for-53) average with runners on base...Selected by the Braves with the third overall pick in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, Atlanta's highest draft selection since 1991, when it took Mike Kelly second overall...Rated as the 12th-best prospect by Baseball America in the 2016 draft class, and also earned the distinction by the publication as having the "Best Delivery" by a prep pitcher...ESPN ranked him as the seventh-best player and the third-best prep pitcher in the 2016 class.

Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratio (T6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)...Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.

2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted 290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.

2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games.
