TODAY'S GAMES: Games three and four of a four-game series against the Clearwater Threshers at Spectrum Field (1-1)...Games three and four of a seven-game road trip against the Threshers and Bradenton Marauders at LECOM Park (1-1)...The Fire Frogs are 2-2 against Clearwater in 2018 after finishing the inaugural campaign with a 6-8 mark against the Philadelphia Phillies' affiliate...Florida finished 1-3 at Spectrum Field in 2017.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHERS: 20-year-old Kyle Muller makes his fifth start at the High-A level in game one of the doubleheader on Sunday morning...The southpaw made six starts with the Rome Braves, going 3-0 with a 2.40 ERA across 30 innings of work (8er)...The Dallas native suffered his first loss as a Fire Frog against the Tampa Tarpons at Osceola County Stadium on May 27...The 6-foot-7 hurler allowed three runs on nine hits, two walks and six strikeouts in his fourth quality start of the season (first with Florida)...Sunday will be Muller's first career start against the Threshers.

20-year-old Dilmer Mejia makes his second start at the High-A level in the finale against the Threshers on Sunday...The southpaw appeared in two games with the Rome Braves (A-) to start the season, allowing four runs (three earned) on six hits, a walk and seven strikeouts in 4.2 innings of relief...The native of El Sauce, Nicaragua held the St. Lucie Mets to a run on four hits, three walks and two strikeouts in a no-decision at First Data Field on May 7...Sunday will be Mejia's first career start against the Threshers.

FLORIDA'S ROAD WINNING STREAK SNAPPED ON SATURDAY: The Florida Fire Frog's four-game road winning streak came to an abrupt end with a 10-6 loss to the Clearwater Threshers at Spectrum Field on Saturday night. Ian Anderson lasted two innings, forcing the bullpen to work the final six frames after tossing 6.1 innings on Friday.

Anderson needed 29 pitches to work out of the first inning with just one run allowed, and needed 26 more to make it out of the second with no damage against the 20-year-old. Troy Bacon, Jon Kennedy, Mauricio Cabrera and Marcus Mooney were tasked with working through the final six frames, and allowed nine runs to score on 12 hits, three walks and three strikeouts.

Alejandro Salazar broke up Nick Fanti's no-hit bid with a solo shot to right-center for the infielder's first long ball of the season. Cristian Pache continued his hot streak with two more hits and two runs scored in the loss.

THE STAR SHINES BRIGHT: After being named to the 2018 North All-Star roster on Friday, Cristian Pache has been on an absolute tear against the Clearwater Threshers over the first two games of the weekend. The 19-year-old is off to a 6-for-10 start in the series, with four runs, two doubles, a home run and six RBI...The centerfielder bumped his hitting streak up to nine games with the two-hit performance on Saturday...During the stretch, Pache is batting .357 (15-for-42) with two long balls and 10 RBI.

SALAZAR'S STREAK: Alejandro Salazar stretched his hitting streak to eight games with his solo home run to start the top of the fifth...The 21-year-old's first home run of the season came in his 41st game in 2018, while he had to wait until his 82nd game to collect his first home run in 2017 (a walk-off grand slam against the Bradenton Marauders on Aug. 4)...During his streak, the native of Venezuela is batting .303 (10-for-33) with the dinger and six driven in.

HE COULD GET USED TO THIS: For the second time this season, Luis Salazar called upon second baseman Marcus Mooney to toss an inning of relief for the Fire Frogs, and the product of South Carolina has responded well for his manager...Mooney faced four batters in the eighth inning, and had Jose Pujols reach on a free pass for the only base runner of the frame...During his two relief appearances this season, the 24-year-old has allowed just one hit, one walk, and has not allowed any runs while topping out in the upper-80s on the radar gun...The Loxahatchee, Fla. resident started the game at second base before moving to the mound, resulting in Florida losing its designated hitter, but Mooney became the first pitcher in the team's history to have a plate appearance when he dug into the right-handed batter's box in the top of the ninth inning, which resulted in a single to left field.

DAVIDSON SNAPS SLUMP: Braxton Davidson entered Saturday night's contest mired in an 0-for-19 slump, but swung his way out of it with his second two-hit night of the season...The DH-turned-first baseman flew out to right field in his first at-bat, but walked in the fourth inning, singled in the seventh, drew another free pass in the eighth, and drove home two runs with a double off the wall in right.

OFFENSIVE RUMBLINGS: For the ninth time over the last 10 games, the Florida Fire Frogs had at least one inning in which they scored more than one run...Florida's offense has tallied 59 runs on 83 hits over the previous 86 innings...The Fire Frogs had scored just 23 runs over their previous seven games prior to the offensive eruption.


