TODAY'S GAME: Finale of a two-game series against the Jupiter Hammerheads (MIA) at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium (1-0)...Florida is coming off a 1-8 homestand against the Daytona Tortugas and Dunedin Blue Jays to open the second half...

The Fire Frogs dropped their final seven games of the homestand, including a three-game sweep against the Blue Jays, and a two-game sweep at the hands of the Tortugas...Third of four series (11 games) against the Miami Marlins' affiliate, five at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium (2-2)...The Atlanta Braves' affiliate dropped two of three on the road against the Hammerheads from June 18-20.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 20-year-old Joey Wentz makes his 11th start of the season in the finale of the two-game series against the Jupiter Hammerheads on Tuesday night...The 6'5" lefty entered the 2018 season as the 10th-ranked prospect in the Atlanta Braves organization, according to MLB.com...The Shawnee Mission East High School product did not factor into the decision of a 3-2, 10-inning loss to the Dunedin Blue Jays on June 27...The southpaw blanked Toronto's High-A affiliate over six frames on three hits and three walks...Tuesday will be Wentz's first career start against the Hammerheads.

FLORIDA STOPS SKID WITH 3-2 VICTORY OVER JUPITER: In a night that featured 29 strikeouts, the Florida Fire Frogs came out victorious in a 3-1 final over the Jupiter Hammerheads at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium on Monday night, snapping a seven-game losing streak.

Ian Anderson (2-5) and Jordan Yamamoto (4-1) exchanged blows throughout the series opener, with the Fire Frogs' starter out dueling the Hammerheads' right-hander with six shutout innings. Kurt Hoekstra drove home the game-winning runs with a two-run single in the fourth to give the Fire Frogs a 2-0 advantage.

FINDING HIS GROOVE: Ian Anderson fired in his fifth quality start of the season, and fourth in his last five starts on Monday night, scattering three hits while walking one and tying a career- and team-record with 11 strikeouts...The native of Rexford, N.Y. set down six consecutive batters on strikes from the final two outs of the third until the start of the fifth, and recorded strikeouts to nine of the final twelve batters faced...Since the start of June, the Atlanta Braves' fourth-ranked prospect (MLB.com) has posted a 2-3 record, but has an ERA of just 2.21 over 11 games by allowing 14 earned runs in 57 innings of work.

LET'S GET SOME RUNS! With just three runs scored on Monday night, Florida has scored just 23 runs since the start of the second half (2.3 runs/game)...Through the first 10 games of the second half, Florida has just 15 hits 87 (.172avg)...The Fire Frogs have scored more than three runs in a game just one time since June 21.

2017: Spent the full season with Single-A Rome and went 8-3 with a 2.60 ERA (38 ER/131.2 IP) and 152 strikeouts...Ranked in the Top 10 among Braves farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) in starter's ERA (T2nd, 2.60), wins (T3rd, 8), strikeouts (3rd, 152), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 10.4), innings pitched (7th, 131.1) and hits per 9.0 innings (T8th, 6.8)...Named by the South Atlantic League as a Post-Season All-Star and as the league's Most Outstanding Pitcher...Ranked second in the SAL in strikeouts and fourth in ERA...Ended the season on a seven-game winning streak, going 7-0 with a 2.35 ERA over his final 17 starts...Entered the season tabbed by MLB.com as Atlanta's No. 8 prospect, and by Baseball America as the Braves' No. 15 farmhand.

2016: Selected by the Braves with the 40th overall selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and split his first professional season between the GCL Braves and rookie-level Danville, going 1-4 with a 3.68 ERA (18 ER/44.0 IP) over 12 starts...Opened his career with four scoreless outings for the GCL Braves before advancing to Danville on 7/20....Baseball America tabbed him as the 10th-best prospect in the Appalachian League at the season's end...Entered the 2016 draft ranked as Baseball America's 26th-best prospect and the 16th-best player in the draft class according to MLB.com...Led Shawnee Mission East High to the 2016 Kansas Class 6A state championship and was named the Sunflower League Player of the Year after going a perfect 9-0 while not allowing an earned run in 51.1 innings pitched...Struck out 104 batters over 51.1 high-school innings and allowed just seven hits with 12 walks.
