TODAY'S GAMES: Games one and two of a five-game series against the Daytona Tortugas (CIN) from Jackie Robinson Ballpark...Games four and five of an eight-game road trip against the Palm Beach Cardinals and Tortugas (3-0)...Florida is coming off a three-game sweep against the Cardinals at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium...Final of five series (18 games) against the Cincinnati Reds' affiliate, with 10 games in Daytona Beach...The Atlanta Braves' affiliate has dropped four of five on the road against Daytona in 2018...Florida was swept in a three-game series at "The Jack" from April 23-25.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHERS: 20-year-old Joey Wentz makes his 12th start of the season in the opener of the five-game series against Daytona on Monday night...The 6'5" lefty entered the 2018 season as the 10th-ranked prospect in the Atlanta Braves organization, according to MLB.com...The Shawnee Mission East High School product earned his first win since May 5 in a 6-1 victory over the Jupiter Hammerheads at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium on July 3...The left-hander blanked the Miami Marlins' affiliate on three hits, a walk and a season-high seven strikeouts in 5.2 innings of work...Monday will be Wentz's fourth start against the Tortugas...The Leawood, Kan. native is 0-1 with a 3.56 ERA (4er/10.1ip) across three starts in 2018...The 2016 Competitive Balance A pick last pitched at Jackie Robinson Ballpark on April 24, suffering his first loss of the year with three runs on five hits, three walks and three punchouts in 4.1 frames.

20-year-old Kyle Muller makes his 11th start at the High-A level in the nightcap of Monday's doubleheader against the Tortugas...The southpaw made six starts with the Rome Braves, going 3-0 with a 2.40 ERA across 30 innings of work (8er)...The Dallas native did not factor into the decision of a 5-4 win over the Charlotte Stone Crabs on July 4 at Osceola County Stadium...The 6-foot-7 hurler allowed four runs on six hits, two walks and three strikeouts in five innings, before the sky opened up and suspended the contest in the middle of the fifth with the Fire Frogs trailing, 4-2...Monday will be Muller's second career start against the Tortugas...The left-hander shut out the Cincinnati Reds' affiliate over six frames on five hits, four free passes, and four strikeouts in a 3-0 win on June 22 at Osceola County Stadium.

FLORIDA COMPLETES SWEEP WITH SUNDAY VICTORY: The Florida Fire Frogs completed the three-game sweep over the Palm Beach Cardinals with a 2-1 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals' affiliate at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium on Sunday afternoon. Florida limited the Cardinals to just two hits on the day, and allowed just 15 hits throughout the weekend, with 10 of the knocks coming in the series-opener on Friday.

The Fire Frogs grabbed the lead in the sixth on Braxton Davidson's RBI double down the line in left. After the Danny Hudzina tied the game with a sac fly in the seventh, Alan Crowley gave the visitors the lead with an RBI single in the ninth.

SECOND-HALF STUD: Ian Anderson continued to roll in the second half with five more scoreless innings, while scattering two hits and punching out seven...The Atlanta Braves' fourth-ranked prospect (MLB.com) has not allowed a run since the sixth inning of a June 26 contest against the Dunedin Blue Jays at Osceola County Stadium, spanning 13 frames...Over three starts since the second half, Anderson has allowed two runs on 11 hits, four walks and 24 strikeouts across 17 innings, posting an ERA of 2.12 in the process.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: The first five road games of the second half have all come at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium, and the Fire Frogs are off to a perfect, 5-0 start in Jupiter...Florida took both games against the Hammerheads from July 2-3...During the team's second season, the Atlanta Braves' High-A affiliate is 7-4 at "The Dean," and has a better win percentage on the road (.488) than at Osceola County Stadium (.390), despite having a better average at home (.238 to .220) and ERA (3.14 to 4.44)...The Fire Frogs are averaging 2.6 runs/game at home in the second half, but are averaging 3.8 runs/game on the road.

NEXT MAN UP: For the first time in team history, the Fire Frogs have had a three-game stretch in which they have had a save in each contest...Florida has had five saves in the second half, with each conversion being by a different pitcher...Statistically, Devan Watts leads the team with four games being closed out, but Thomas Burrows leads all active players with three.



MANAGER, LUIS SALAZAR



- Luis Salazar is in his first season as the Fire Frogs skipper and his eighth season overall as a manager in the Braves organization.
- Salazar spent his first five seasons (2011 to 2015) with the organization as the High-A skipper before managing the Double-A Mississippi Braves for the last two seasons (2016 and 2017).
- Salazar, who has 20-plus years of minor-league coaching and managerial experience, owns an overall managerial record of 769-836 (.479) over 14 seasons.
- Salazar guided his team to three consecutive Carolina League playoff appearances in 2012, 2013 and 2014...In 2012, his club claimed the Carolina League title, winning the Mill Cup Championship.
- From 2002 to 2009, he spent eight seasons as a coach in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system, including five as a manager...He managed Single-A Vero Beach in 2006 and from 2005 to 2006, he led the rookie-level Gulf Coast League Dodgers.
- He spent three seasons, 2007 to 2009, as the Dodgers' Double-A hitting coach.
- From 1995 to 2001, Salazar was a member of the Milwaukee Brewers organization, including working the 2011 season as the Milwaukee Brewers' first base coach.
- During his time with the Brewers organization, he spent three seasons (1998-99 and 2000) as the Brewers' Triple-A hitting coach: Louisville (1998 and 1999) and Indianapolis (2000), and in 1996 and 1997, he managed the Single-A Beloit Snappers.
- Salazar's first appointment as a coach came in 1995 with Chandler of the rookie-level Arizona League.
