TODAY'S GAME: Game three of a five-game series against the Daytona Tortugas (CIN) from Jackie Robinson Ballpark (2-0)...Game six of an eight-game road trip against the Palm Beach Cardinals and Tortugas (5-0)...Florida is coming off a three-game sweep against the Cardinals at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium...Final of five series (18 games) against the Cincinnati Reds' affiliate, with 10 games in Daytona Beach...The Atlanta Braves' affiliate has dropped four of five on the road against Daytona in 2018...Florida was swept in a three-game series at "The Jack" from April 23-25.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 23-year-old Jon Kennedy makes his first start at the High-A level on Tuesday night against Daytona...The southpaw has appeared in 19 games with Florida in 2018, posting a 5-4 record with a 2.16 ERA (10er/41.2ip)...In two spot starts with the Triple-A Gwinnett Stripers, the native of Melbourne, Australia went 0-2 with a 13.50 ERA (9er/6.0ip)...The 6-foot-9 hurler's last start came on May 8 against the Toledo Mud Hens, allowing six runs - five earned - on seven hits and a walk through two innings...Kennedy's last appearance for the Fire Frogs came on July 4 against the Charlotte Stone Crabs, where the third-year pro tossed four hitless frames, while walking two and striking out five in a 5-4 win.

STRONG STARTING PITCHING CARRIES FLORIDA TO DOUBLEHEADER SWEEP: Joey Wentz and Kyle Muller dominated the Daytona Tortugas on the mound during Monday night's doubleheader sweep at Jackie Robinson Ballpark, as the two southpaws allowed just one unearned run across 13.2 innings of work in both games. The Florida Fire Frogs won both extra-inning contests, 3-1 and 2-1 to extend their winning to a season-high, five games.

CAPTAIN CLUTCH: Kevin Josephina came up with two huge hits on Monday night, as the second baseman drove in the game-winning runs in both contests to help with the sweep...The switch-hitter had been 0-for going into his final at-bats of both games, before driving in the winning run with a single in the ninth of game one, and a single in the eighth of game two.

START ME UP: Florida's starters have been unshakeable over the last four games, as the combination of Tucker Davidson, Ian Anderson, Joey Wentz and Kyle Muller have allowed just one unearned run through 25.2 innings on 15 hits, two walks and 28 punchouts...The last three starters for the Fire Frogs have not issued any free passes after issuing 17 the previous nine games.

WONDERFUL WORLD OF WENTZ: With 6.2 scoreless innings of work in game one, Joey Wentz extended his scoreless-innings streak to 24...The Atlanta Braves' ninth-ranked prospect has not allowed a run since his fourth pitch of the night against the Bradenton Marauders on June 13, a solo home run by Jared Oliva to lead off the contest.

MULLER MOWS 'EM DOWN: Kyle Muller punched out 12 batters through seven innings in game two, setting both a career high and a team record...The Braves' 11th-ranked prospect gave up the game-tying single to Ibandel Isabel in the seventh, and then set down Bruce Yari and John Sansone on strikes to set the new team mark...The previous record of 11 had been touched three times, with the last occurrence coming on Ian Anderson on July 2.

ANDERSON NAMED PITCHER OF THE WEEK: 20-year-old Ian Anderson was named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for the week of July 2-8...Atlanta's fourth-ranked prospect went 2-0 in his two starts, and did not yield a run to the Jupiter Hammerheads or Palm Beach Cardinals at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium...Rexford, N.Y. native struck out 18 batters across 11 innings of work, while limiting the opposition to five hits, and issued just one free pass...The right-hander has not allowed a run since the sixth inning of a June 26 contest against the Dunedin Blue Jays at Osceola County Stadium, spanning 13 frames...Over three starts since the second half, Anderson has allowed two runs on 11 hits, four walks and 24 strikeouts across 17 innings, posting an ERA of 2.12 in the process.

2017: Appeared in 13 games with the GCL Braves in his debut campaign, going 1-1 with a pair of saves and a 3.44 ERA (7 ER/18.1 IP)....Allowed opponents to bat just .164 (11-for-67), while fanning 22 batters in 18.1 innings (10.8 SO/9.0 IP)....Allowed four runs in 0.1 innings in his professional debut, before pitching to a 1.50 ERA (3 ER/18.0 IP) in his final 12 appearances.

THOMAS BURROWS • LHP • 6-2 • 235 • 23 YRS • #45 • TRADE, 2017 (SEA)

Saves/Opp: 3/4 **Holds:** 4 **1st Batter/retired:** 26/12 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 12/6
2017: Acquired by Atlanta in January and played the full season with Single-A Rome...His 92 strikeouts led all Atlanta relief farmhands, and his 12.4 SO/9.0 IP was the second-best rate in the system (min. 60.0 IP)....Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratio (T6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)....Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.
2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft....Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)....Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted .290 (20-for-69)....Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

MAURICIO CABRERA • RHP • 6-3 • 260 • 24 YRS • #22 • NDFA, 2010

Saves/Opp: 1/3 **Holds:** 6 **1st Batter/retired:** 30/17 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 6/1
2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett....Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen....Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season....Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.
2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE....Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27....Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season....Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies....From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors....Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6....Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast....He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 6/30 vs. MIA. Compiled a 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.

JOSH GRAHAM • RHP • 6-1 • 210 • 24 YRS • #12 • 4TH ROUND, 2015 (ATL)

2017: Split the season between High-A Florida and Double-A Mississippi, combining to go 3-4 with a 3.98 ERA (27 ER/61.0 IP) and three saves in 41 appearances....Allowed eight runs (six earned) over his first four appearances (6.1 IP, 8.53 ERA) before pitching to a 3.46 ERA over his final 37 outings....Opened the season with Florida before moving to Mississippi on 8/5....Lefties hit .200 (20-for-100) with two extra-base hits against him, including 2-for-19 (.105) at the Double-A level....Played for Peoria in the Arizona Fall League....Had a 6.97 ERA (8 ER/10.1 IP) over nine games.
2016: Played his first full pro season with Single-A Rome, where he went 1-2 with a 3.40 ERA (16 ER/42.1 IP) and six saves over 35 appearances....Finished the season in the Top 10 among Atlanta farmhands in saves (T8th, 6) and strikeout-walk ratio (10th, 4.17)....Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings over two outings in the postseason to help Rome claim the South Atlantic League Championship.
2015: Made his professional debut with six appearances (5 starts) for rookie-level Danville, pitching to a 1-1 record with a 2.60 ERA (5 ER/17.1 IP) and fanning 21.
AMATEUR: Began his career at the University of Oregon as a catcher, before transferring to the mound prior to his junior season in 2015....Went 4-1 with a 2.63 ERA (19 ER/60.0 IP) in 19 games, six starts....Was a two-time first-team All-State selection for Roseburg High School (OR).
PERSONAL: His uncle is former major leaguer, Jamie Burke.



MANAGER, LUIS SALAZAR

- He spent three seasons, 2007 to 2009, as the Dodgers' Double-A hitting coach.
- From 1995 to 2001, Salazar was a member of the Milwaukee Brewers organization, including working the 2011 season as the Milwaukee Brewers' first base coach.
- During his time with the Brewers organization, he spent three seasons (1998-99 and 2000) as the Brewers' Triple-A hitting coach: Louisville (1998 and 1999) and Indianapolis (2000), and in 1996 and 1997, he managed the Single-A Beloit Snappers.
