TODAY'S GAME: Game three of a four-game series against the Charlotte Stone Crabs (TB) from Charlotte Sports Park (0-2)...Game three of a seven-game road trip against Charlotte and the Fort Myers Miracle (MIN) (0-2)...Florida is coming off an 0-1 series loss to the Bradenton Marauders at home, and an 0-2 homestand against Charlotte and Bradenton...Third of four series (11 games) against the Tampa Bay Rays' affiliate, with eight matchups taking place in Port Charlotte...The Atlanta Braves' affiliate finished 2-2 against the Stone Crabs on the road in 2017.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 20-year-old Ian Anderson makes his 19th start of 2018 in game three of the four-game series against the Charlotte Stone Crabs on Wednesday night...The 6'3" hurler came into the campaign as the Atlanta Braves' fifth-ranked prospect according to Baseball America, and is currently third according MLB.com, and is the 40th-ranked (MLB.com) overall rated prospect in baseball...The native of Rexford, N.Y. did not factor into the decision of a 5-4, extra-innings loss to the Bradenton Marauders on July 27...The third overall pick of the 2016 draft allowed one run on three hits and six strikeouts through five frames on 74 pitches (50 strikes)...Wednesday will be Anderson's first career start against the Stone Crabs.

JAMES STARTS ROAD TRIP WITH FIVE-HIT DAY: Jared James picked up five hits over Tuesday's doubleheader against the Charlotte Stone Crabs, but the Florida Fire Frogs dropped both end of the twin bill, 5-4 and 6-3.

James started the day with a ground-rule double against Brian Shaffer and came around to score on an error by Tristan Gray at second for the first run of the ball game in game one. The Sacramento native singled and scored a run in the three-run seventh. Sean McLaughlin surrendered four runs in the bottom of the seventh in game one to suffer the walk-off defeat.

James struck out to start game two, but ripped two singles and an RBI double to finish off the night.

KING OF JULY: Jared James' five-hit day capped off an impressive month of July for the Long Beach State product...The left-handed batter finished the fourth month of the 2018 campaign with a .296 average and a season-best six doubles to go along with 13 RBI.

ROSTER MOVES: With the July 31 trade deadline complete, the Atlanta Braves have shuffled players throughout the organization...From the Florida Fire Frogs, RHP Josh Graham and OF Cristian Pache have been transferred to the Mississippi Braves, and C Alan Crowley has been sent to the Rome Braves...To fill out the three roster spots, RHP Walter Borkovich, C William Contreras and OF Drew Waters have been transferred from Rome to Florida.

BUILDING THE PIPELINE: MLB Pipeline revealed its updated prospect rankings, and nine Atlanta Braves farmhands cracked the top-100...Of the nine, seven either currently played, or have previously played for the Fire Frogs: Kyle Wright (25), Ian Anderson (40), Austin Riley (44), Cristian Pache (58), Luiz Gohara (63), Touki Toussaint (78), and Drew Waters (100).

2018: Entered the season as the 42nd-ranked prospect in baseball according to Baseball America, and 51st-ranked according to MLB.com...Tossed a career-high seven innings against the Tampa Tarpons on May 6 at Osceola County stadium, blanking the New York Yankees High-A affiliate on two hits, a walk and seven strikeouts...Snapped a string of 17-consecutive winless starts with a 4-3 victory over the Bradenton Marauders at LECOM Park on 6/7...Named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for the week of July 2-8...Went 2-0 in his two starts, and did not yield a run to the Jupiter Hammerheads or Palm Beach Cardinals at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium...Struck out 18 batters across 11 innings of work, while limiting the opposition to five hits, and issued just one free pass.

2017: Played his first full professional season with Single-A Rome, and went 4-5 with a 3.14 ERA (29 ER/83.0 IP) and 101 strikeouts over 20 starts...Led all Atlanta farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) by averaging 11.0 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched...Pitched to a 6.15 ERA over six starts in May, but logged a 1.75 ERA (11 ER/56.2 IP) over 14 starts in the other five months of the season, including an 0.83 ERA (2 ER/21.2 IP) in seven starts after the All-Star break...Named South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week for the period of 5/22-28 after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 11 strikeouts on 5/25 vs. Augusta...Did not allow a home run on the season, and has surrendered just one homer over 122.2 professional innings...Entered 2017 named by Baseball America as Atlanta's No. 5 prospect, and as the No. 66 prospect in the minor leagues.

2016: Split his first professional season between the GCL Braves and rookie-level Danville, combining to go 1-2 with a 2.04 ERA (9 ER/39.2 IP) over 10 starts...Made five starts with the GCL Braves before advancing to Danville on 8/10...Allowed five earned runs over 4.0 innings on 8/22 vs. Bluefield, but pitched to a 0.99 ERA (4 ER/35.2 IP) in his other nine appearances...Limited left-handed batters to a .172 (10-for-58) average against him, while righties hit .277 (23-for-88)...Held opposing batters to a .189 (10-for-53) average with runners on base...Selected by the Braves with the third overall pick in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, Atlanta's highest draft selection since 1991, when it took Mike Kelly second overall...Rated as the 12th-best prospect by Baseball America in the 2016 draft class, and also earned the distinction by the publication as having the "Best Delivery" by a prep pitcher...ESPN ranked him as the seventh-best player and the third-best prep pitcher in the 2016 class.


