TUESDAY: The Fire Frogs notched their third shutout win of the season, blanking the Flying Tigers, 4-0. RHP Nolan Kingham Followed up his complete game shutout performance from a week ago by tossing six more scoreless innings last night, striking out just two but sidestepping six hits. He hasn't allowed a run in 15.2 IP now. RHP Daysbel Hernandez and RHP Brandon White also kept the Flying Tigers off the board.

RBI singles from Greyson Jenista in the third and Riley Unroe in the fourth put Florida in the lead 2-0. Garrison Schwartz launched his first homer of the season, a two-run shot, to left in the sixth. It was his first home-run since Mid-August of last season, also hit here at Publix Field at Joker Marchant Stadium.

NOTHING OR ALL: Florida's last three wins have been shutouts, coming on May 1st vs. Lakeland, May 3rd vs. Tampa, and last night. All have occurred in the past seven days. In the other games over the past week, the Fire Frogs pitching staff has allowed 18 runs, an average of 4.5/conte

UNROE NOT TO BE UNDONE: With his RBI knock yesterday, Riley Unroe became the first Florida player to get to a 16-game on-base streak. Since April 20th, Unroe has hit .322 with 2 HR and 9 RBI as part of the streak. He has a hit in 14 of 16 games and is on a season-best 7-game knock streak.

DELGADO DIGS IN: The efficiency in which Riley Delgado has reached base this year is startling. He has gotten on in 27 of the 30 games he has logged a plate appearance and he has hits in 23 of those contests. Delgado got on-base two more times yesterday, singling in the second and walking in the sixth. He is currently on a 10-game on-base streak and is now the second Florida player to get a streak of 10 or more. He also had a 9-game on-base streak from April 12th-22nd.

THE SERIES: This encounter between the Flying Tigers and Fire Frogs is their last of the first half. The season series was originally supposed to comprise of 7 games at Osceola County Stadium and 6 at Publix Field. Due to last Thursday's rainout in Kissimmee, that game was made up on Monday in Lakeland as part of a twin bill. The Fire Frogs and Flying Tigers will meet 7 times in the second half, the next being at Publix Field in July. Florida is 7-7 as the Fire Frogs in games played at Publix Field at Joker Marchant Stadium.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP Philip Pfeifer will be making the 5th start of his career tonight. His last start before last week came on April 25th, 2018 at Rochester while with Gwinnett: IP, 2 H, 2 ER, 2 HB, BB, 0 K, PC: 36/20 strikes. He permitted a run in six of his seven outings with Mississippi this season before being sent down on April 29th. This is the first time while with the Braves system that he's pitching for the Fire Frogs and the first time he's been at the Advanced-A level since 2016, when he pitched in a combined 20 games between Rancho Cucamonga (Dodgers) and the Carolina Mudcats.

ROSTER ANALYSIS: 12 players on the Fire Frogs Opening Day roster have Advanced-A experience or higher to start this season. 8 of the Top 30 Atlanta Braves prospects according to Baseball America begin the season in Florida, William Contreras (#9), Greyson Jenista (#15), Freddy Tarnok (#16), Tristan Beck (#17), Huascar Ynoa (#19), A.J. Graffanino (#25), Jeffrey Ramos (#26), Isralen Wilson (#28) round out those particular prospects.
