Fire Frogs Recap (All-Time)


WEDNESDAY: The first shutout of the season was an especially memorable one for the Fire Frogs. RHP Nolan Kingham completed the first nine-inning complete game in the history of the franchise, scattering three hits and recording five punchouts while leading Florida to the 2-0 win. Kingham faced just one batter over the minimum and needed just 85 pitches to achieve the feat. Florida backed him up in the fourth with a two-out, two-run double off the bat of Drew Lugbauer to provide the final margin. Brett Langhorne bumped his season-best hitting streak to five, becoming the 4th different player to have a streak of at least that length. Shean Michel and William Contreras had their eight-game on-base streaks come to an end.

FIRST ONE TO 10: With his bunt single yesterday, Riley Unroe became the first Florida player to get to a 10-game on-base streak. Since April 20th, Unroe has hit . 317 with 2 HR and 5 RBI as part of the streak. He has a hit in 8 of 10 .

HOME SWEET HOME?: The Fire Frogs are playing the third game of a six-game home stand tonight, three against Lakeland and three against Tampa. The Fire Frogs, however, were just 3-9 through their first big home stretch of the season. They played 12 of their first 17 games at the friendly confines of Osceola County Stadium. For perspective, Florida was 6-8 through their first 14 home games last year and 6-7 to start the 2017 season at home. Florida is 5-6 at the Pond against Lakeland over the past two-plus seasons.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP Philip Pfeiffer slides in to start for RHP Freddy Tarnok who is receiving an extra day of rest. Pfeiffer will be making the 4th start of his career. His last start came April 25th, 2018 at Rochester while with Gwinnett: IP, 2 H, $2 \mathrm{ER}, 2 \mathrm{HB}, \mathrm{BB}, 0 \mathrm{~K}, \mathrm{PC}: 36 / 20$ strikes. He permitted a run in six of his seven outings with Mississippi this season before being sent down on April 29th. This is the first time while with the Braves system that he's pitching for the Fire Frogs and the first time he's been at the Advanced-A level since 2016. He has never pitched in a Florida State League game.

ROSTER ANALYSIS: 12 players on the Fire Frogs Opening Day roster have Advanced-A experience or higher to start this season. 8 of the Top 30 Atlanta Braves prospects according to Baseball America begin the season in Florida, William Contreras (\#9), Greyson Jenista (\#15), Freddy Tarnok (\#16), Tristan Beck (\#17), Huascar Ynoa (\#19), A.J. Graffanino (\#25), Jefrey Ramos (\#26), Isranel Wilson (\#28) round out those particular prospects.
