New Affiliation:

-After seven seasons as an affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds, the Blue Wahoos signed a two-year Player Development Agreement with the Minnesota Twins during the off-season that extends through the 2020 season. During their tenure with the Reds, the Wahoos went 474-497, hit .241 as a team, held a 3.64 team ERA, and took home a share of the 2017 Southern League title.

Ballpark Improvements:

-The Blue Wahoos spent over \$600,000 over the off-season upgrading award-winning Blue Wahoos Stadium. New additions included four gourmet themed Concession Storefronts, a 20-foot HD homeplate concourse videoboard, and over 17,000 square feet of new infield sod. Blue Wahoos Stadium has won the Southern League Ballpark of the Year three times and was named MiLB's "Best View In Double-A" over the off-season.

Mound Aces:

-The Blue Wahoos Opening Day starting rotation includes three of the Minnesota Twins top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): #3 Brusdar Graterol, #18 Jorge Alcala, and #24 Griffin Jax. Among pitchers, Graterol is #1 in the organization, Alcala ranks as #7, and Jax is #10
 -The Blue Wahoos projected Opening Day bullpen staff posted a combined 2.80 ERA during the 2018 season.

Top Prospects:

-Baseball America pegged Pensacola as the probable #2 strongest team in all of the minors in their recent 2019 Super Teams preview, and the Wahoos Opening Day roster backs up the prediction featuring top prospects OF Alex Kirilloff (Twins #2, #9 overall), P Brusdar Graterol (#3, #68), Luis Arraez (#17), P Jorge Alcala (#18), and P Griffin Jax (#23).

Pass The Mic:

-After seven seasons as Pensacola's lead play-by-play broadcaster, Tommy Thrall received a major league call-up. He joins the Cincinnati Reds broadcast team for the 2019 season. Taking over for Thrall will be Chris Garagiola in his third season as part of the Wahoos radio team.
