This Series | The Jackson Generals (Double-A, Arizona Diamondbacks) host the Montgomery Biscuits (Tampa Bay Rays) in their fourth home series of 2018 and their sixth series overall. The Generals and Biscuits will face each other 20 times this season, splitting 20 First Half series home-and-home The Biscuits will host Jackson at the end of this month (May 29-June 2).

About Last Night | Jackson, Tenn. – **Rudy Flores'** 100th career minor league home run helped propel the Jackson Generals past the Montgomery Biscuits 10-4 on Wednesday night. The victory brought the Generals (18-8) even in their series with Montgomery (10-17), 1-1, heading in to Friday's contest. Jackson is now 12-1 on the year when hitting a home run.

The Southern League-leading Generals offense whirled to life on Wednesday near the end of the outing for Montgomery starter Zach Lee (3-1, 2.18 ERA). Trailing 3-2 in the bottom of the fifth, Flores led the charge into the lead with a one-out, three-run blast, his fifth of the year, to put the Generals in front. The dinger marked a turning point in the contest, as the Generals would score five more runs through the later innings, while the Biscuits were held to just one further tally. Flores, hitting cleanup behind **Juniel Querecuto** and **Kevin Medrano**, combined with the two men ahead of him to go 6-for-13 with six runs scored and eight RBI.

Pitching-wise, the Generals had good-enough work from **Alex Young** (4-1, 3.66 ERA), who gave up three runs in five innings while striking out four. Behind Young, **Mason McCullough** allowed a run in the sixth inning to Montgomery, but **Gabe Speier** and **Kirby Bellow** pitched the final three frames with more combined strikeouts (four) than baserunners (three).

Put a Hurtin' on Them | Perhaps the most remarkable point of the Generals' 17-8 start was the way they played in spite of a roster impacted by early injuries. **Ryan Atkinson** and **Jon Duplantier** both missed starts after joining the team late from Extended Spring Training to finish individual rehab work, and **Marty Herum** and **Jay Gonzalez** each spent time on the DL during the first month of the year with injuries. Herum and Gonzalez accounted for 21 runs through the season's first 20 games while hitting a combined .344 (30-for-87), while Atkinson and Duplantier struck out 29 batters in the first 22.2 innings they pitched. **Ben DeLuzio** made a team-high 18 starts (all in center field) through the team's first 20 games before being placed on the DL 4/27 as the team leader in stolen bases. **Matt Jones**, a catcher, was leading the team in home runs when he went on the DL 4/28. Most recently, veteran catcher **Alberto Rosario** became the fourth General hurt in the space of a week (and the second catcher), when he landed on the DL on 5/2. Rosario was batting .288 at the time of his departure, having caught 11 of Jackson's 17 wins to date. Former General **Marcus Littlewood** ('15, '16) was added in his place.

Josh, Prince of Thieves | Two Generals--outfielders **Jay Gonzalez** and **Ben DeLuzio**--traded the league lead in stolen bases back and forth early in the 2018 season, with Gonzalez stealing five bags through his first three games and DeLuzio swiping nine through his first 20 contests. On May 4, the Generals received infielder **Josh Prince** from Triple-A Reno to supplement to the team's versatility and speed. Prince, who played 8 games with the Milwaukee Brewers in 2013, was a 2014 Southern League All-Star and the SL's "Best Hustler" that year, stealing a league-high 37 bases for the Huntsville Stars. Prince stole 217 bases in his MLB career before being added to the Generals' roster; defensively, he's proven an adaptable asset, playing 355 games in the infield and 276 games in the outfield.

Poche Poached | Generals rookie **Colin Poche** was outstanding early in 2018. Poche struck out 23 batters over his first 11.0 IP without allowing a run, and the performance was good enough to earn him Southern League Relief Pitcher of the Month honors. However, Poche was dealt to the Tampa Bay Rays on May 1 as a final piece in a three-team trade that sent Rays outfielder Steven Souza Jr. to Arizona earlier this year. Poche was assigned to the Montgomery Biscuits, meaning he merely had to walk to the visitor's clubhouse at The Ballpark at Jackson to switch teams--Montgomery's series with the Generals began a day after Poche was traded. Full details of the three-team trade are listed below, and they involved multiple players who figure to be extensively involved in the Southern League:

D-BACKS RECEIVED: NYY RHP Taylor Widener (now AA/Jackson), TB OF Steven Souza Jr. (now MLB/Arizona)

YANKEES RECEIVED: ARI 2B Brandon Drury (now MLB/NY Yankees)

RAYS RECEIVED: NYY OF Nick Solak (now AA/Montgomery), ARI LHP Anthony Banda (now AAA/Durham), ARI LHP Colin Poche (now AA/Montgomery), ARI RHP Sam McWilliams (now A-/Charlotte)

Cribbs Rocking | Do-it-all General **Galli Cribbs** hit **the cycle on April 18 vs. Birmingham**, collecting an inside-the-park home run, a triple, a double, and a single in that order in an 8-1 win. It was the first cycle for a General since current Kansas City Royals outfielder Abraham Almonte completed the ten-base feat in 2013. Cribbs hit 2 of his 3 career HR (in 300+ career games) in April 2018.. Cribbs' 1.097 OPS led all active Southern League players through the season's first month. He also led the league with 20 runs in April.

Lean, Clean Defensive Machine | Following the April 16 contest against Birmingham, the Generals had ten players on their roster who had already played multiple defensive positions in the first ten games of the year. The only players not to play more than one position in that span were center fielder **Ben DeLuzio** and catcher **Alberto Rosario**. Additionally, the Generals played 9 straight error-free games in streak that ended April 20, going 8-1. Through the first month of the season, **Kevin Medrano**, **Galli Cribbs**, **Jay Gonzalez**, and **Jason Morozowski** have all played three different positions: **Jose Vinicio** and **Juniel Querecuto** manned four each.

The Hits Just Keep On Comin' | In their April 21 win over Chattanooga, Jackson snagged 10+ hits for the 8th game in a row; the streak broke with 9 hits in a 7-inning win over the Lookouts two days later. The second game of that double-header, (also 7 innings) featured 10 hits, including **Marty Herum's** game-winning double. **Through 26 games, Jackson's 267 hits led the SL.**

One Inning Ain't Enough, Jack | The Generals' bullpen showed great effectiveness in their first month, and part of it was due to the ability of Generals relievers to pitch more than one inning. Every pitcher in Jackson's bullpen has worked a multi-inning outing; **Joel Payamps** has the longest (3.0 IP). Only Kirby Bellow has yet to work 1.1+ IP multiple times.

We're No. 1 | The Generals' 15-2 start gave them the most wins by any 2018 MLB team through 17 tilts. Last year, Jackson finished April an SL-best 15-8. It's also the most wins to start a season in franchise history. Their winningest month in the last two years was May of 2016, when they went 19-10 (.655) en route to a First Half North Division title (and an eventual championship).

APRIL 23 (CHA)--Caught by Matt Jones...Threw 66% of his pitches for strikes, getting two groundouts and one flyout...faced only two batters more than the minimum...Allowed a leadoff solo home run to LaMonte to begin the game...thereafter, struck out the next three hitters, beginning a stretch of 10 hitters retired in a row until a Nick Gordon single in the fourth...after Gordon's single, sat down the next five hitters in order, striking out four of them...highest strikeout total of the year gave him the league lead with 30...Departed with a 3-run lead, but the Generals bullpen denied him a decision by surrendering 5 runs in the next two innings...Jackson won on a walk-off 2-run double by Marty Herum in the bottom of the 7th (2nd game in a double-header, with the Generals sweeping both to run their season-best win streak to nine)...

APRIL 17 (BIR)--Caught by Alberto Rosario...Threw only 56% of his pitches for strikes, though 66% of his outs came via punchout...Rosario gunned down a pair of runners who attempted to steal second base with one out (1st and 3rd innings, respectively)...1-2-3 second inning...issued consecutive two-out walks in the top of the 4th to load the bases before striking out Keon Barnum to keep the scorecard clean...

APRIL 12 (TNS)--Caught by Matt Jones...threw 64% of his pitches for strikes...struck out the side in the first inning...stranded a two-out single in the second...stranded a pair of runners in the third with a strikeout of Jason Vosler...stranded a two-out walk in the fourth...issued a pair of one-out walks in the fifth (the first one going to the opposing pitcher), and Vosler knocked in the first of the two walks with a two-out RBI single...struck out Yasiel Balaguer to end his day...

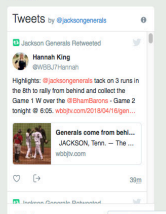
