Yesterday's Game:

-In a game overshadowed by a frightening injury to starting pitcher Devin Smeltzer, who was hit by a line drive and exited the game in the 5th inning, the Blue Wahoos beat Biloxi 5-2 on Wednesday evening.

-Pensacola jumped to an early lead, scoring first for the 11th time this season, with a run in the first on a bases loaded walk to Jimmy Kerrigan. The Wahoos added two more in the second, stringing together a hit by pitch and singles by Luis Arraez, Jordan Gore, and Brian Schales to go up 3-0.

-A Wahoos error, walk, and two hits by Biloxi in the second brought home the first runs against Smeltzer this season. The lefty allowed four hits and the two runs (one earned) while striking out four over 4.0 IP before exiting. Adam Bray (W, 3.0 IP, 0 R, 3 K) and Sam Clay (S, 2.0 IP, 0 R, 3 K) combined to throw five shutout innings of relief.

Starting Success:

-Through 13 games, Blue Wahoos starting pitchers have been brilliant. As a staff, Pensacola starters hold a 1.28 ERA and have struck out 72 batters in 70.1 IP while allowing just 10 earned runs on 46 hits.

Providing Relief:

-Complimenting Pensacola's starting pitching has been a strong bullpen. Over 44.1 IP, Wahoos relievers hold a 2.03 ERA with 59 strikeouts (12.0 K/9). Pensacola leads the Southern League with 7 saves and is tied for the league lead with 4 holds.

Arraez's Average Climbing:

-2B Luis Arraez has hits in 11 of 13 games this year. With his fast start, his career minor league batting average now sits at an even .330 over 326 games in the minor leagues (1,267 at-bats). -Arraez's .353 average this year is second in the Southern League behind Birmingham's Joel Booker (.409).

Keeping It Close:

-Through 13 games in 2019, the Blue Wahoos have already played in 8 one-run contests. Three of Pensacola's four losses have been by one run (the other was a two-run loss). Only three games this season have been decided by more than a two-run differential.



 -Went 3-4 with a 3.70 ERA in 87.2 IP for Fort Myers in 2018, striking out 66 while walking only 15 in 15 games.

-Opened 2018 in Fort Myers where he held a 2.41 ERA over 33.2 IP while striking out 44 before a May promotion to Double-A. Went 5-7 with a 3.83 ERA in 18 appearances (14 starts) for Chattanooga, throwing 94.0 IP and putting up a 1.23 WHIP. Held a 2.88 ERA in the season's second half over 75.0 IP.

-Excelled as a high-end starting pitching prospect early in his career before thoracic outlet syndrome forced a move to the bullpen. Pitched in the Southern League in 2015, 2016, 2017, posting a 1.95 ERA in 101.1 IP with Montgomery and Biloxi.

-Made 49 appearances at the AAA level in 2017 and 2018, throwing 64.0 IP, striking out 79, and holding a 4.50 ERA.
