Miguel Sano Added To Pensacola On MLB Rehab

-2017 American League All-Star Miguel Sano has been promoted to Pensacola on Major League rehab. One of the most heralded international prospects in recent memory, Sano signed with the Twins as a 16-year old in 2009 from the Dominican Republic. Ranked as high as the #6 prospect in baseball, he made his MLB debut in 2015 as a 22-year-old and finished 3rd in Rookie of the Year voting, hitting 18 homers in 80 games. He was selected as an All-Star in 2017 and finished second in the Home Run Derby (to Aaron Judge), hitting .264 with 28 homers on the season.

-Sano sustained a laceration on his heel during a celebration of his team's Dominican Winter League championship in January. His rehab start began on April 30 with Fort Myers. He went 4-4 with a home run and 3 RBI last night in his final game with the Miracle.

Top Prospect Alex Kirilloff Joins Pensacola Lineup

-OF Alex Kirilloff, the #8 overall prospect in the game of baseball (MLB Pipeline), was activated from the 7-day injured list prior to tonight's game. Kirilloff hit .348 with 20 home runs and 101 RBI between A-Cedar Rapids and A+ Fort Myers in 2018, taking home a bevy of awards and honors including the MiLB Breakout Prospect of the Year, the Sherry Robertson Twins Minor League Player of the Year, the Midwest League Player of the Year, and selections to the MiLB.com Organizational All-Star and Baseball America Minor League All-Star teams.

Smeltzer Promoted, Dobnak Joins Rotation

-Devin Smeltzer, the Southern League leader in ERA (0.60) was promoted to AAA-Rochester before tonight's game. The lefty made five starts for Pensacola, leading the team in innings pitched, strikeouts, ERA, and WHIP.
-Smeltzer will be replaced in the Pensacola rotation by RHP Randy Dobnak. The 24-year-old was 3-0 with a 0.40 ERA in 22.1 IP for A+ Fort Myers this season. A former independent baseball teammate of Taylor Grzelakowski with the Utica Unicorns, Dobnak holds a 15-5 record and 2.68 ERA across three seasons in his minor league career.
