Yesterday's Game:

-All-Star Trey Supak dominated for the Shuckers hurling 7 shutout innings in which the righty allowed just 2 hits and struck out 8, improving his record to 8-2. RHP Jorge Alcala surrendered 4 runs in the bottom of the first inning, and Monday's 3 inning effort was his shortest outing of the season. The Wahoos suffered their 5th shutout defeat of the season, losing 8-0 and falling 2 games out of first place in the SL South Division Standings.

-The Wahoos have simply been outmatched through the first 3 games of this series. Biloxi's starters have thrown 19 innings and allowed 2 ER (0.95 ERA) compared to Pensacola's 13 ER in 10.2 IP (10.97 ERA.) The Shuckers have out scored the Wahoos 22-3, and have outhit the Pensacola by a 34-14. The Shuckers hitters have drawn 17 walks and have struck out 22 times while the Wahoos have only drawn 6 walks and have struck out 36 times. Pensacola is trying to avoid a 4th straight defeat after entering the series having won 4 straight.

Around The Farm:

AAA-Rochester Red Wings (27-33): The Red Wings scored 3 runs in the final two innings to come from behind and defeat Pawtucket, 5-3. The Wings have now won 6 straight games and 7 of their last 8.

High A-Fort Myers Miracle (36-26): The Miracle were shutout by Jupiter 8-0 on Monday. RHP Edwar Colina fired 7 innings for Fort Myers (6H, 3R, 3ER, BB, 8K) but the offense was limited to a total of 3 hits. Fort Myers still leads the FSL South by 1.0 games.

A-Cedar Rapids Kernels (33-30): The Kernels split their doubleheader against Peoria, winning the first game 7-2 and losing the second contest 2-1. RHP Andrew Cabezas did not allow an ER across 5 innings in the Kernels victory while SS Wander Javier went 3-for-6 across the two games.

New Kings of the South with 7 to go

-The Blue Wahoos have been in or tied for first place every day of the first half until Saturday. With their 5-2 loss, the Wahoos sit in 2nd place, the first time in 65 days the Wahoos haven't been in 1st. Biloxi has won 21 of their last 27 games to surpass Pensacola at the top of the Southern Division standings.

"Salute the Rank and Not the Man"

-Today, Second Lieutenant of the US Air Force, Griffin Jax has been activated from the 7-Day IL and will make his first start for the Wahoos since May 16th against the BayBears. Jax, a product of the Air Force Academy, was one of the league leaders in ERA prior to his injury. He is currently in his first season at the AA level and is trying to become the first ever Air Force graduate to ever play in the Majors (note, he would not be the first Air Force service member to play in the Majors).

All-Stars Announced

-The Southern League announced the initial rosters for the Southern League All-Star Game on June 18 in Biloxi. Six Blue Wahoos were named to the South Division All-Star Roster: P Budsar Graterol, P Griffin Jax, P Ryan Mason, 2B Travis Blankenhorn, OF Jaylin Davis, C Caleb Hamilton.

Shutouts

-Pensacola pitchers have spun 11 shutouts this season, most in baseball at any level majors or minors.

Strikeout Prone

-The Wahoos lead all of Double-A in strikeouts (601) this season. Amarillo ranks second with 600 while the next closest Southern League team is Biloxi with 546.
 -The Blue Wahoos are on pace for 1,360 strikeouts this season, which would far eclipse their single-season record of 1,175 from 2017. Since 1987, only one Southern League team has struck out 1,300 in a season (Jackson, 2017, 1,300).

No Days Off

-Travis Blankenhorn has played in 32 consecutive games for the Blue Wahoos, appearing in every game since being promoted to Pensacola on April 26.

First Impressions

-Since joining Pensacola on April 26, Travis Blankenhorn leads the Southern League in hits (53), total bases (92), and home runs (10). He ranks third in slugging (.535) behind Biloxi's Trent Grisham (.569) and Birmingham's Luis Robert (.539), and he's seventh in batting average (.308).

Tyler Jay Traded to Reds

-On June 10th, LHP Tyler Jay was traded to the Cincinnati Reds in exchange for cash considerations. Jay was the Twins first round selection (6th overall) in the 2015 by the Minnesota Twins out of Illinois University. In three NCAA seasons, he saved 24 games and held a 1.68 ERA and 10.0 K/9 and was named the Big 10 Pitcher of the Year in his draft eligible season. This season with the Blue Wahoos, Jay was 1-2, with a 4.82 ERA in 17 apps, and in his AA career, he made 62 appearances, posting a 4.68 ERA, a 1.65 WHIP and a 5.90 RA/9 (runs allowed per nine—a statistic that measures the total runs allowed per nine, not just earned runs).

Recent Roster Moves

-June 10: RHP Griffin Jax has been reinstated from the 7-Day IL while RHP Williams Ramirez has been placed on the 7-Day IL with a right triceps strain. LHP Tyler Jay has been traded to the Cincinnati Reds for cash considerations.

-June 9: RHP Cody Stashak promoted up to Triple-A Rochester, INF Ryan Costello transferred to High-A Fort Myers. Stashak began the season on the Wahoos Opening Day roster and made 19 apps with the Wahoos posting a 2-3, 4.76 mark while recording 4 saves in as many opportunities. Costello appeared in 4 games with the Wahoos prior to his return to Fort Myers. Randy Dobnak returns to Pensacola after making 4 starts with the Red Wings going 1-1 with a 2.55 ERA (5 ER / 17.2 IP).

-Selected in the 3rd round of the 2016 draft out of Air Force. Out of high school (Cherry Creek, CO), was named Colorado's Gatorade Player of the Year and was selected in the 12th round by the Phillies in 2013 but elected to attend school.

-At Air Force, was All-Conference and Mountwain West Co-Pitcher of the Year, going 9-2 with a 2.05 ERA in 15 starts during his junior year.

-A second lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force, pitched sparingly in 2016 and 2017 due to active duty commitments. Granted an exception through the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, pitched his first full season in 2018 after making just 9 appearances the past two seasons.

-Went 3-4 with a 3.70 ERA in 87.2 IP for Fort Myers in 2018, striking out 66 while walking only 15 in 15 games.

-Pitched for Salt River in the Arizona Fall League following the 2018 season, posting a 3.86 ERA in 6 games (21.0 IP).

-Enters the 2019 season ranked as the #23 overall prospect in the Twins system (Pipeline) and their #9 pitching prospect.

-Father Garth Jax played in the NFL for 10 seasons (OT) with the Dallas Cowboys and Arizona Cardinals and had a standout college career at Florida State.

-Went on the IL from 5/19 - 6/10 with a right forearm strain

-Signed by the Twins as a free agent in January 2019. Originally a first round selection (CB-A) in the 2011 draft by the Tampa Bay Rays.

-Excelled as a high-end starting pitching prospect early in his career before thoracic outlet syndrome forced a move to the bullpen. Pitched in the Southern League in 2015, 2016, 2017, posting a 1.95 ERA in 101.1 IP with Montgomery and Biloxi.

-Made 49 appearances at the AAA level in 2017 and 2018, throwing 64.0 IP, striking out 79, and holding a 4.50 ERA.
