Yesterday's Game:

-Randy Dobnak provided an excellent start for Pensacola (6.2 IP, 8 H, 1 ER, 1 BB, 5 K) and Jeff Ames shined in relief (2.1 IP, 0 H, 4 K), but Pensacola fell in extras to Tennessee 4-3.

-A Charcer Burks RBI single in the second gave Tennessee a 1-0 lead, but Pensacola manufactured the tying run in the fifth using a walk to Joe Cronin, a stolen base, a single by Jordan Gore, and an RBI ground out. Both starters worked into the 7th, each allowing a run in the frame before exiting. The game went extras tied 2-2 and the Smokies put up a pair of runs in the 10th off reliever Tyler Palm making his Double-A debut. Jordan Gore led off the home half of the 10th with an RBI single to score the pace-of-play runner, his third hit of the game, but the Wahoos were unable to score further.

-Gore was 3-3 with 2 RBI. Ben Rortvedt was 2-4. Travis Blankenhorn extended his hitting streak to 12 with a single late in the game.

Around The Farm:

AAA-Rochester Red Wings (29-34): Sean Poppen struck out 9 over 6.0 strong innings, allowing one earned on five hits to improve to 4-0 with a 1.55 ERA since being promoted to Triple-A. Rochester picked up a 6-2 win over Columbus, using 14 hits including four from Wilin Rosario (4-4, 4 RBI), three from Luis Arraez (3-5, R), and two each from Nick Gordon, Williams Astudillo, and Jake Cave.

High A-Fort Myers Miracle (39-27): The final game of the first half was rained out for the Miracle in Tampa against the Tarpons.

A-Cedar Rapids Kernels (36-31): Luis Rijo allowed just one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings, but the Kernels were shut out in a 2-0 loss to Wisconsin.

Best of the Ballparks

-Blue Wahoos Stadium has advanced to the semi-finals of the Ballpark Digest Best of the Ballparks contest. In the round of four, Blue Wahoos Stadium will take on Hodgetown, the home of the Amarillo Sod Poodles. The other semi-final matchup will be between Dunkin' Donuts Park (Hartford Yard Goats, Rockies) and People's Natural Gas Field (Altoona Curve, Pirates).
-Blue Wahoos Stadium previously was named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Baseball Digest in 2016. The stadium has been named Southern League Ballpark of the Year three times.

12 Straight For Blankenhorn

-Travis Blankenhorn has hit safely in 12 consecutive games. Over that stretch, he's gone 15-for-51 (.294) with 3 HR, 8 RBI, and 9 runs scored.
-Since joining Pensacola on April 26, Travis Blankenhorn leads the Southern League in total bases (99) and home runs (11). He ranks third in hits (57), fourth in slugging (.518), sixth in OPS (.848), and is ninth in batting average (.301).
-Blankenhorn's 12 game hitting streak is the longest by a Pensacola batter this season, surpassing Luis Arraez's 11-game streak from April 29-May 10. Jaylin Davis ranks third with a 10-game streak from April 5th-23rd.

Sharp On D

-Pensacola has committed the second fewest errors (49) in the South Division and the third fewest in the Southern League.

Plate Discipline

-Over their past seven games, Blue Wahoos batters have struck out 88 times.
-Since June 1st, Blue Wahoos hitters have struck out 149 times, most in baseball at any level.

Staying Out Of The Double Play

-The Blue Wahoos have hit into just two double plays in the month of June, tied for fewest in baseball.
-On the season, Pensacola pitchers have induced 43 ground ball double plays, second most in the Southern League.

Getting Deep Into Games:

-Pensacola starter Randy Dobnak pitched into the 7th inning last night, the first time since May 5 that a Wahoos starter pitched longer than 6.0 innings. Over that stretch of 34 games, Wahoos starters went less than 5.0 innings 15 times. In 31 of 34 games they threw less than 6.0 innings and three times they threw 6.0 inning exactly.
-Over their last 21 games, Wahoos starters have thrown less than 5.0 innings 14 times.

All-Stars Announced

-The Southern League announced the initial rosters for the Southern League All-Star Game on June 18 in Biloxi. Six Blue Wahoos were named to the South Division All-Star Roster: P Brusdar Graterol, P Griffin Jax, P Ryan Mason, 2B Travis Blankenhorn, OF Jaylin Davis, C Caleb Hamilton.

Strikeout Prone

-The Wahoos pitching staff leads all of Double-A in strikeouts with 647. Amarillo is second with 639. Biloxi is the only other Southern League team to have reached 300, sitting at 602.
-The Blue Wahoos are on pace for 1,351 strikeouts this season, which would far eclipse their single-season record of 1,175 from 2017. Since 1987, only one Southern League team has struck out 1,300 in a season (Jackson, 2017, 1,300).

No Days Off

-Travis Blankenhorn has played in 46 consecutive games for the Blue Wahoos, appearing in every game since being promoted to Pensacola on April 26.

Bulpen Usage

-In the month of June, Blue Wahoos relief pitchers have allowed 36 runs in 52.0 innings, leaving them with an ERA of 6.23 over 12 games.
-Since May 29, the Blue Wahoos have allowed 33 in the 7th inning or later in 13 nine-inning games. 29 of those runs have come in the 8th inning or later.

Eliminated

-With last night's loss, Pensacola has been eliminated from contention for the first half title, won by Biloxi.

Weiss Wins Again In Hoosville

-On Wednesday, Zack Weiss was the winning pitcher in Pensacola's game against Tennessee. Weiss' last win at Blue Wahoos Stadium was on August 3, 2018 against Montgomery while a member of the Cincinnati Reds organization.

 -Made 49 appearances at the AAA level in 2017 and 2018, throwing 64.0 IP, striking out 79, and holding a 4.50 ERA.
