Last Night's Recap:

-The Wahoos had a memorable week in the franchise's history, earning a third walk-off win in six days on Sunday, the latest one from Canadian-born catcher J.D. Osborne, who delivered a line-drive rope down the left field line to produce a 10th-inning, 4-3 victory against the Montgomery Biscuits. In a week that included rain delays, schedule changes, a swipe from Tropical Storm Claudette, the Blue Wahoos won five of six games against the Biscuits and made Father's Day Weekend special at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

-After winning a pair of seven-inning games, including a walk-off win, in a double-header Saturday that followed arrival of a tropical storm, the Blue Wahoos had just one hit Sunday through six innings. They trailed 3-1 in the seventh. The lone hit was Riley Mahan's second-inning homer.

-Fast forward to the ninth, where Peyton Burdick led off with the Wahoos down 3-2, and took a pitch on his shoulder. He went to third on Jerar Encarnacion's double. With one out and the bases loaded, Mahan produced a fly ball to left deep enough to score Burdick with the tying run. After a scoreless 10th for Montgomery, Osborne delivered the heroics to win the game.

AAA-Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (23-17): Sunday's game between the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and the Charlotte Knights at Truist Field has been postponed due to inclement weather. -RHP Edward Cabrera made his Wahoos debut on 6/19 in Game 1 of a doubleheader against MTG and pitched 4.1 IP, with 2 hits (1HR) and 1 run allowed while walking 1 and striking out 7.

-Cabrera joined the Blue Wahoos on 6/15, meaning the Wahoos have two of the Marlins Top 5 pitching prospects on the roster (Max Meyer, #3 / Cabrera #5)

Mad Max

-Over Max Meyer's last 6 starts, the former #3 overall pick is 2-0 with a 0.31 ERA (1 ER / 29 IP) with 17 walks, and 32Ks.

-Meyer leads all Double-A starters since May 18th in ERA.

Extra Burdick

-Entering play today, OF Peyton Burdick leads the league in the AA-South in extra base hits (20), is T-3rd in doubles (9), and is T-3rd in HRs (9).

Jake L-Eder

-Pensacola lefty Jake Eder enters play today as the league leader in ERA (1.08), opponent's average (.148), starts (8); is 2nd in strikeouts (62), and innings pitched (41.2); and is 4th in WHIP (0.94).

Walk This Way

-The Blue Wahoos and Montgomery Biscuits have drawn the most walks in the league in walks (175) and have the 5th most in all of AA (Bowie ranks #1, 198).

-Peyton Burdick (30) and Lazaro Alonso (29) lead the Double-A South in walks

-Burdick trails only Adley Rutschman's 34 (Bowie) for the most in Double-A.

-Pensacola pitchers have allowed the second-fewest walks (117) in Double-A. The only team that has issued fewer walks is Montgomery (102).

Nick Fortes

-Since May 23, Nick Fortes is hitting an .324 (23-71) with 2HRs, 7 doubles, a triple, a HR, 8RBI, 8BBs, and 10 runs scored while reaching base at a .415 clip over his last 21 games. That .324 average is the 3rd-highest in the league over that stretch.
