Last Night's Recap:

-Peyton Burdick clubbed his team-leading 10th home run of the season and Will Stewart W, 3-3) nearly turned in a quality start as the Wahoos took the series opener, 4-3 on Tuesday at Recions Field.

-The fireworks began in the second inning for Pensacola, where after a leadoff walk to Riley Mahan, Burdick belted a two-out, two-run home run off Konnor Pikington (L, 1-3) to put the Wahoos ahead. However, the Barons had a swift response for the Wahoos, Joel Booker took Stewart deep in the bottom half of the inning to put the Barons within a run. In the fourth, the Wahoos used small ball to get that run right back. After a walk and hit-by-pitch, the Wahoos used a pair of groundouts to score, which made it a 3-1 game.

-The only remaining offense the Barons had left came from Micker Adolofo. He hit a pair of solo homers deep to center, that each time cut the Wahoo lead down to one. In the sixth he led off the inning with a solo blast off Stewart, and in the eighth he took Dylan Bice deep to cut down Pensacola's lead to 4-3. Colton Hock worked around a two-out single and struck out Zack Granite to end the ball game for his league-leading 10 saves this season.

Around The Farm:

AAA-Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (23-18): The Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp took an early 1-0 lead Tuesday but were unable to add on against the Durham Bulls in a 4-1 loss at 121 Financial Ballpark. The Shrimp bullpen was excellent, allowing just one infield single as the only baserunner after the fourth. However, the Durham bullpen was equally as impressive, giving up just five baserunners in the final five innings.

High A-Beloit Snappers (22-21): The Snappers scored four runs in the first half of the game and held off a late rally from the Quad Cities River Bandits to secure a 4-3 win in Tuesday's series opener. The Snappers snapped the River Bandits' seven-game win streak.

A-Jupiter Hammerheads (21-22): The Hammerheads were blasted in the series opener by Bradenton 15-2 on Tuesday afternoon. The Marauders scored at least once in the first 6 innings of the game, including three separate 4-run frames.

Hot Star

The 2021 Pensacola Blue Wahoos are off to their best start in team history at 27-16 through 43 games, slightly edging out the 2019 Blue Wahoos who started 26-17.

Meyer on Fire

-Over his past six starts, Max Meyer holds a $0.31\,\mathrm{ERA}$. Over that period, Meyer has 32 Ks in 29.0 innings and has allowed just one earned run on a solo home run.

-Meyer's 0.31 ERA over his past six outings (since May 17) is the best in Minor League Baseball among pitchers with 20+ IP.

Patience At The Plate: Three of the top five most patient hitters in the Double-A South are in Pensacola's lineup. Peyton Burdick leads the AA-S with 30 walks, one ahead of teammate Lazaro Alonso. JJ Bleday ranks 5th with 22. As a team, the Blue Wahoos have drawn 178 walks, most in the league.

First Impressions: The Blue Wahoos are 7-1 in series openers and have won the first game of their last six series.

Burdick Blasts: Peyton Burdick leads the Double-A South in extra base hits (21) and runs scored (32), and ranks second in total bases (75) and home runs (10).

Pair of Aces: Jake Eder (1.08) and Max Meyer (1.42) rank first and second in the Double-A South in ERA.

-Eder leads the league in opponent average (.148) while Meyer ranks fifth (.185). Eder's opponent average ranks fourth in Minor League Baseball.

-Eder ranks second in strikeouts (62) and fourth in WHIP (0.94).

-Eder's 1.08 ERA is second best in the Minor Leagues behind Janson Junk (1.03, Somerset).

Meyer ranks fourth overall in the Minors.

Fortes Keeps Hitting: Since May 23, Nick Fortes has hit .315, (third best in the league) and leads the Double-A South in on-base percentage (.419). Over that time period, he ranks sixth in slugging (.521), third in OPS (.939), fourth in doubles (4), and sixth in extra base hits (10).

Bleday Heats Up: During the month of June, JJ Bleday leads the Blue Wahoos in hits (19), total bases (35), and RBI (12).

Lockdown Bullpen: The Blue Wahoos bullpen ranks second in the Double-A South in ERA (3.84) and leads the league in saves (16), has been credited with the most wins (15) and holds (18), and is responsible for the fewest losses (5). The bullpen's dominance has helped Pensacola to a 13-4 record in one-run games.

- -Pensacola relievers have walked just 45 batters, far fewest in the Double-A (second-fewest is Montgomery with 67), leading the relief staff to hold a league-best 1.04 WHIP.
- -Pensacola's pitching staff holds a 1.86 ERA and 0.98 WHIP in late/close situations
- -Colton Hock leads the Double-A South in saves (10) and ranks second in Minor League Baseball. Hock's 1.27 ERA ranks second among AA-S relievers with 20+ IP.

Jerar vs. Barons: In 7 games against Birmingham this season, Jerar Encarnacion has slashed .320/.414/.640.

Strong Week: Over his past 7 games, Lazaro Alonso has slashed .350/.480/.500.

-Manager Kevin Randel has won 346 games as a Minor League manager and 93 at the Double-A level.

-Nick Fortes knocked his 100th career hit on June 15 against Montgomery, driving in his 50th career run in the same game.

-Riley Mahan sits 2 hits shy of 250 in his MiLB career.
