

Last Night's Recap:

-Craig Dedelow hit a sac fly in the bottom of the ninth inning to cap off a three-run rally as the Birmingham Barons walked off the Wahoos 3-2 for their second walk off win in a row. Pensacola led 2-0 headed into the ninth with closer Colton Hock on the mound. The league's leader in saves struggled with his command in the inning as he walked the bases loaded with nobody out. Zack Granite laced a two-run single to tie the game and advanced to second on the throw to the plate, setting up runners at second and third with still nobody out. After intentionally walking Micker Adolfo, and a pop out from Carlos Perez, Dedelow hit a sac fly to center to give the Barons the win.

-The loss takes the shine away from a masterful outing from Edward Cabrera. He hurled six shutout innings and struck out nine without allowing a walk. The Barons mustered a total of three hits against Cabrera. Offensively, Bubba Hollins carried the load for the Wahoos as the New Yorker 2-for-4 with a homer and two RBI. He hit a solo shot off John Parke in the fifth to put the Wahoos up 1-0. Then in the eighth, he laced an RBI double into the left field corner to score Devin Hairston and give Pensacola what looked like a save 2-0 lead.

Around The Farm:

AAA-Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (25-18): Despite falling behind 3-0 four batters into Thursday's game, the Jacksonville bullpen pitched 8.2 scoreless innings with 15 strikes to help the Jumbo Shrimp rally past the Durham Bulls for a 4-3 victory. JAX has now gone 15-6 this season in games decided by three runs or fewer and the victory matches their largest comeback win of the season. Durham was held to just five hits in the ballgame, and didn't advance a runner past second base after the first inning.

High A-Beloit Snappers (22-23): The Snappers struggled in Thursday's against the Quad Cities River Bandits, losing 10-3, but Marcos Rivera hit his first home run of the season on a two-run shot to left-center field. The River Bandits scored 10 runs in the first five innings, hitting four home runs.

A-Jupiter Hammerheads (21-23): Jupiter's contest against Bradenton has been postponed due to inclement weather. The game has been rescheduled for a doubleheader on June 25.

Hot Star

The 2021 Pensacola Blue Wahoos made history by getting off to their best start in team history at 27-16 through 43 games, slightly edging out the 2019 Blue Wahoos who started 26-17.

Hello, Edward

-RHP Edward Cabrera made his Wahoos debut on 6/19 in Game 1 of a doubleheader against MTG and pitched 4.1 IP, with 2 hits (1HR) and 1 run allowed while walking 1 and striking out 7.

-In his 2 starts with Pensacola, Cabrera has a 0.87 ERA (1 ER / 10.1 IP) with 1BB and 16Ks -Cabrera joined the Blue Wahoos on 6/15, meaning the Wahoos have two of the Marlins Top 5 pitching prospects on the roster (Max Meyer, #3 / Cabrera #5)

Patience At The Plate: Three of the top five most patient hitters in the Double-A South are in Pensacola's lineup. Peyton Burdick (31) and Lazaro Alonso (30) lead the AA-S in walks. JJ Bleday ranks 6th with 22. As a team, the Blue Wahoos have drawn 183 walks, most in the league.

First Impressions: The Blue Wahoos are 7-1 in series openers and have won the first game of their last six series.

Burdick Blasts: Peyton Burdick leads the Double-A South in extra base hits (21) and runs scored (34), and ranks third in total bases (77) and is T-2nd home runs (10).

Pair of Aces: Jake Eder (1.08) and Max Meyer (2.08) rank first and fifth in the Double-A South in ERA.

-Eder leads the league in opponent average (.148) while Meyer ranks sixth (.195). Eder's opponent average ranks fourth in Minor League Baseball.

-Eder ranks second in strikeouts (62) and fourth in WHIP (0.94).

-Eder's 1.08 ERA is second best in the Minor Leagues behind Janson Junk (1.03, Somerset). Meyer ranks fourth overall in the Minors.

Fortes Keeps Hitting: Since May 23, Nick Fortes has hit .321, (third best in the league) and leads the Double-A South in on-base percentage (.418). Over that time period, he ranks fifth in slugging (.513), second in OPS (.930), and fourth in doubles (7).

Bleday Heats Up: During the month of June, JJ Bleday leads the Blue Wahoos in hits (20), total bases (36), and RBI (14).

Lockdown Bullpen: The Blue Wahoos bullpen ranks second in the Double-A South in ERA (3.87) and leads the league in saves (16), has been credited with the most wins (15) and holds (18). The bullpen's dominance has helped Pensacola to a 13-6 record in one-run games.

Strong Week: Over his past 7 games, Lazaro Alonso has slashed .348/.483/.478.

-Manager Kevin Randel has won 346 games as a Minor League manager and 93 at the Double-A level.

-Nick Fortes knocked his 100th career hit on June 15 against Montgomery, driving in his 50th career run in the same game.

-Riley Mahan sits 1 hits shy of 250 in his MiLB career.
