#### Last Night's Recap:

Pensacola never seemed to get their offense going as the Barons clipped the Wahoos 5-3, Saturday night at Regions Field. Birmingham starter Kade McClure hurled five shutout innings in his ninth start of the season. He held the Wahoos to just two hits and one walk while striking out eight. Jeff Lindgren (L, 2-4), despite giving up an early run in the second inning, pitched well enough for the Wahoos to be in the game for most of the night.

-Entering the top of the sixth down by two, the Wahoos rallied for a pair of runs against Felix Paulino (W, 1-1). After Riley Mahan walked to start the inning, Peyton Burdick and JJ Bleday roped back-to-back singles to bring home one. Then, Encaracion tied the game with an RBI single to make it 2-2. With the new found offense, it appeared as though Lindgren had the opportunity to try and turn in a quality start. However, his night came to end in the in the bottom of the sixth when Micker Adolfo led off with a single before a walk to Craig Dedelow. With two on and nobody out the Wahoos brought in Zack Leban who was tagged for three consecutive singles before retiring the side. After the seventh, the Barons led 5-2, and would win despite allowing a RBI double to J.D. Osborne in the top of the ninth.

#### Around The Farm:

AAA-Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (25-20): The Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp scored early and rallied late, but ultimately fell short by a run, 4-3 to the Durham Bulls in front of 7,027 fans on Saturday at 121 Financial Ballpark. Jacksonville falls to 5-4 in one-run games this season and are now 7-10 on the season against the Durham.

High A-Beloit Snappers (23-24): In a game that lasted over four hours and saw 110 at-bats, the Beloit Snappers fell just two runs shy, 14-12, of the Quad Cities River Bandits in 11 innings

A-Jupiter Hammerheads (22-25): Jupiter fell to Bradenton 9-5 on Saturday at LECOM Park. The Hammerheads top performers include Federico Polanco (1-for-4, 2B) and Brian Navaretto (1-for-3, 2RBI, R, BB).

#### Hot Start

The 2021 Pensacola Blue Wahoos made history by getting off to their best start in team history at 27-16 through 43 games, slightly edging out the 2019 Blue Wahoos who started 26-17

#### Whats on the Line

-The Blue Wahoos have only lost 1 series all season long (Birmingham, May 11-16)...with a loss this afternoon in the series finale, both of Pensacola's only series losses would come at the hands of the Birmingham Barons.

#### Hello. Edward

-RHP Edward Cabrera made his Wahoos debut on 6/19 in Game 1 of a doubleheader against MTG and pitched 4.1 IP, with 2 hits (1HR) and 1 run allowed while walking 1 and striking out 7.

-In his 2 starts with Pensacola Cabrera has a 0.87 FRA (1 FR / 10.1 IP) with 1BB and 16Ks -Cabrera joined the Blue Wahoos on 6/15, meaning the Wahoos have two of the Marlins Top 5 pitching prospects on the roster (Max Meyer, #3 / Cabrera #5)

Patience At The Plate: Three of the top five most patient hitters in the Double-A South are in Pensacola's lineup. Peyton Burdick (31) and Lazaro Alonso (30) lead the AA-S in walks. JJ Bleday ranks 5th with 25. As a team, the Blue Wahoos have drawn 190 walks, which is 7 behind Montgomery for the most in the league.

First Impressions: The Blue Wahoos are 7-1 in series openers and have won the first game of their last six series.

Burdick Blasts: Peyton Burdick leads the Double-A South in extra base hits (23), runs scored (36), home runs (12), and ranks 2nd in total bases (85)

Pair of Aces: Jake Eder (1.13) and Max Meyer (2.08) rank first and fourth in the Double-A South in ERA

-Eder leads the league in opponent average (.152) while Meyer ranks sixth (.195). Eder's opponent average ranks fourth in Minor League Baseball. -Eder ranks first in strikeouts (71) and in WHIP (0.90).

-Eder's 1.13 ERA is second best in the Minor Leagues behind Janson Junk (1.03, Somerset).

Fortes Keeps Hitting: Since May 23, Nick Fortes has hit .291, (9th best in the AA-S) and is 4th in the Double-A South in on-base percentage (.384)

Bleday Heats Up: During the month of June, JJ Bleday leads the Blue Wahoos in hits (21), is first in RBI (15) and is second in total bases (37).

Lockdown Bullpen: The Blue Wahoos bullpen ranks second in the Double-A South in ERA (3.90) and leads the league in saves (16). The bullpen's dominance has helped Pensacola to a 13-6 record in one-run games.

#### Minors Milestones

-Manager Kevin Randel has won 347 games as a Minor League manager and 94 at the Double-A level.

-Nick Fortes knocked his 100th career hit on June 15 against Montgomery, driving in his 50th career run in the same game

-Riley Mahan tallied his 250th hit in his MiLB career on 6/25 against Birmingham.

#### Shuckers on Deck

-The Wahoos return home on June 29th for a 6-game ser against the Biloxi Shuckers -Pensacola won the 1st matchup in MGM Park taking 4 of 6 against the Brewers Double-A affiliate
