Last Night's Recap:

-The Blue Wahoos road trip in Birmingham ended with a thud, after a 10-3 loss Sunday against the Barons in the series finale at Regions Field. Just as they did in Pensacola in mid-May, the Barons won four of the six games. Birmingham is the only team in the Double-A South to have series' wins against the Blue Wahoos.

-Blue Wahoos pitcher Will Stewart, making his second start in the series, had his roughest outing of the season. He was rocked for seven runs on four hits in 2.2 innings and walked six batters among the 19 hitters he faced.

-Birmingham jumped on Stewart with four runs in the first inning, after Stewart walked the bases loaded. Carlos Perez followed with a two-run single. First baseman J.D. Osborne committed a throwing error after a ground out, allowing another run to score and Jameson Fisher's one-out single produced the fourth run. The Barons' Micker Aldofo then did damage in the second and third innings. He hit a two-out, RBI double in the second. He followed in the third inning with a grand slam off reliever Tyler Mitzel to give Birmingham a 9-2 lead.

Around The Farm:

AAA-Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (26-20): Despite trailing by a run heading to the bottom of the ninth on Sunday, the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp prevailed on a walk-off single by Deven Marrero to get past the Durham Bulls 3-2 in 10 innings in front of 4,826 fans at 121 Financial Ballpark. JAX earned a split in the six-game series, and moves to within 4.5 games of the first-place Bulls in the standings.

High A-Beloit Snappers (23-25): The Beloit Snappers took a perfect game into the top of the ninth inning leading 6-0, but it all came undone, and the Snappers fell 10-7 in 10 innings. Velez pitched five perfect frames. Johnston doubled to extend his hit streak to 16 games. Conine hit a three-run home run.

A-Jupiter Hammerheads (22-25): The Hammerheads lost their series finale to Bradenton, 8-3 at LECOM Field. Jupiter was held to 3 hits in the defeat. Former Wahoo Brian Navaretto recorded a double in his 1st rehab assignment with the Sharks.

Hot Start

The 2021 Pensacola Blue Wahoos made history by getting off to their best start in team history at 27-16 through 43 games, slightly edging out the 2019 Blue Wahoos who started 26-17.

Aw Shucks

-The Wahoos welcome the Biloxi Shuckers to BW Stadium for the 1st time this season. Both teams are coming off series losses with the Wahoos losing 4 of 6 to the Barons and the Shuckers losing 5-straight to the Biscuits.

Hello, Edward

-RHP Edward Cabrera made his Wahoos debut on 6/19 in Game 1 of a doubleheader against MTG and pitched 4.1 IP, with 2 hits (1HR) and 1 run allowed while walking 1 and striking out 7.

-In his 2 starts with Pensacola, Cabrera has a 0.87 ERA (1 ER / 10.1 IP) with 1BB and 16Ks -Cabrera joined the Blue Wahoos on 6/15, meaning the Wahoos have two of the Marlins Top 5 pitching prospects on the roster (Max Meyer, #3 / Cabrera #5)

Patience At The Plate: Three of the top five most patient hitters in the Double-A South are in Pensacola's lineup. Peyton Burdick (31) and Lazaro Alonso (30) lead the AA-S in walks. JJ Bleday ranks 5th with 25. As a team, the Blue Wahoos have drawn 190 walks, which is 7 behind Montgomery for the most in the league.

First Impressions: The Blue Wahoos are 7-1 in series openers and have won the first game of their last six series.

Burdick Blasts: Peyton Burdick leads the Double-A South in extra base hits (23), runs scored (36), home runs (12), and ranks 2nd in total bases (85).

Pair of Aces: Jake Eder (1.13) and Max Meyer (2.08) rank first and fourth in the Double-A South in ERA.

-Eder leads the league in opponent average (.152) while Meyer ranks sixth (.195). Eder's opponent average ranks fourth in Minor League Baseball.

-Eder ranks first in strikeouts (71) and in WHIP (0.90).

-Eder's 1.13 ERA is second best in the Minor Leagues behind Janson Junk (1.03, Somerset).

Notes:

- Selected by the Miami Marlins with the 3rd overall pick in the MLB Draft. Became highest drafted Gopher since Paul Molitor was taken 3rd overall by the Brewers in 1977.
- Enters the 2021 as the #3 prospect in the Marlins system by both MLB Pipeline and Baseball America. Ranks second among Marlins pitching prospects behind RHP Sixto Sanchez.
- In first pro start (5/5 at MIS) retired the first 12 batters he faced and didn't allow his 1st hit until the 5th inning.
- Elite slider was ranked as the best pitch and best slider in the 2020 Draft by MLB Pipeline. Ranked as the best slider in the Marlins system entering 2021 by Baseball America. Compliments with a fastball that has reached triple digits, and mid-80s changeup.
- Finished collegiate career with a 2.07 ERA across 46 games (15 starts), throwing 148.0 innings and striking out 187 batters.
- Served as Golden Gophers closer as a freshman in 2018, saving 16 games (tied team record) and holding a 2.06 ERA in 26 relief appearances. Finished tied for third in the nation in saves.
- As a sophomore in 2019, went 5-3 with a 2.11 ERA, making 11 starts and 5 relief appearances.
- In 2020, was 3-1 with a 1.94 ERA in four outings for the Gophers, striking out 46 in 27.2 innings. Finished fifth in the nation in strikeouts
- Was a two-way player in college. Slashed .230/.308/.281 over 178 at-bats.
- In the summer of 2019, competed for the USA Collegiate National Team, making four appearances (three starts) and recorded a 0.64 ERA across 14 innings, striking out 12 batters.
- Worked at Marlins 60-man Alternate Camp and Instructional League in 2020.
- In addition to baseball, played hockey at Woodbury High School where he tallied 9-8-17 in 25 games for the Royals.
