Sams' Bat, Housey's Arm Beat Cougars: The LumberKings never trailed last night at Elfstrom Stadium thanks to a first-inning three-run homer by **Kalian Sams** and six scoreless innings from right-hander **John Housey** in a 6-1 win over the Kane County Cougars. Sams lifted off to deep center field – his 12th blast of the year – with **Nick Franklin** and **James Jones** aboard. Jones would go yard with Franklin on in the fifth, hitting his fourth HR of the year to nearly the same spot as Sams. Housey (W, 4-0) scattered three hits and struck out four in his first start of the season, and left-hander **Brian Moran** (S, 1) yielded only a run on two hits while striking out six over the final 3.0 innings for the save. Cougars' right-hander Rob Gilliam (L, 3-4) surrendered five runs on nine hits over 7.0 IP. Both **Brandon Bantz** (3-for-4, RBI) and **Matt Cerione** (3-for-4) had three-hit games in the winning effort.

Quest for the West: With last night's victory, the LumberKings have won 14 of their last 16 and 19 of their last 24 to stay within 2.5 games of first-place Cedar Rapids (32-18) and 0.5 games of second-place Quad Cities (30-20) with 19 games to go in the first half. The last Clinton club to capture a first-half playoff berth was the 2008 team, led by **Mike Micucci**...they won the first-half West title.

Slammin' Sammy: The three-run blast by **Kalian Sams** was his team-leading 12th home run this season, good for second in the Midwest League behind only Great Lakes' Jerry Sands (15 HR). Sams also ranks second in the MWL in HR/AB ratio (1 HR every 12.58 AB), tied for third in RBI (34) and eighth in slugging percentage (.503). A native of The Hague, South Holland, Netherlands, Sams is enjoying his best season since 2008, when he hit 10 HR and drove in 20 RBI with short-A Pulaski. The LumberKings **lead the MWL in team home runs with 48**, four more than second-place Great Lakes (44). Last year's club had 77 HR over 137 games, with **Denny Almonte** leading the way with 13 HR.

Housey Do It?: Right-hander **John Housey** worked 6.0 scoreless innings in his first start as a LumberKing last night following 11 relief appearances with the club. Seattle's 36th round pick in 2009 out of the University of Miami, Housey has not allowed a run of any kind over his last four outings, 13.0 innings, lowering his ERA from 3.18 to 1.80...that scoreless streak is the longest by a Clinton pitcher this year. Housey is the second Kings hurler to toss scoreless baseball in his first start this year, joining **Taylor Lewis**...he fired 5.0 scoreless, one-hit innings in a win over Cedar Rapids on 5/15. **Overall, Clinton starters are 18-9 with an ERA of 2.21 (56 ER in 228.2 IP) over the last 40 games.**

Cardiac Kings: **Hawkins Gebbers** became the seventh-different LumberKing to record the game-winning RBI in their eight last at-bat wins this season, singling home Gabriel Noriega in the 15th inning for a 5-3 win over Kane County on Saturday. Seattle's 33rd round pick out of Biola University, Gebbers joins **Kalian Sams** (walk-off homers on 4/9 vs. Peoria and 4/16 vs. Quad Cities), **Nick Franklin** (walk-off homer on 4/20 vs. Burlington and walk-off double on 5/16 vs. Cedar Rapids), **Dennis Raben** (sac fly on 4/24 vs. Kane County), **Vinnie Catricala** (solo HR in 9th on 5/2 at Peoria), Noriega (RBI single on 5/23 vs. Burlington) and **Daniel Carroll** (RBI push bunt on 5/24 vs. Burlington).

The Fantastic Franklin: 19-year-old first-round pick **Nick Franklin** went 2-for-4 with a double atop the order last night, **giving him at least a hit in 35 of his last 43 games.** The #9 prospect in the Seattle system as rated by *Baseball America*, Franklin is batting .322 (19-for-59) with three home runs and eight RBI over his last 17 games. He's amidst MWL leaders in several offensive categories, including total bases (2nd with 107), extra-base hits (2nd with 24), slugging percentage (2nd at .552), triples (T-2nd with 6), HR (T-3rd with 8), total hits (T-3rd with 61), HR/AB ratio (5th at 1 HR per 24.25 AB), OPS (5th at .913) and average (10th at .314). **Franklin leads the club with 18 multi-hit games.**

You've Been Eras'd: While he saw his string of three-straight wins snapped, 20-year-old right-hander **Erasmus Ramirez** did turn in a **season-high 8.0 innings** in Saturday night's game at Kane County. The Nicaraguan is 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (5 ER in 27.0 IP) over his last four starts following a two-game losing streak...**he's lowered his ERA from 2.66 to 1.90, eighth-lowest amongst Midwest League pitchers.** The Mariners' Minor League Pitcher of the Year while with Aguirre of the VSL last season (11-1, 0.51), Ramirez has walked only two batters while striking out 30 over 47.1 innings.

Game Over: The Clinton bullpen is 10-7 with a 2.20 ERA, 10 holds and 12 saves this season. Leading the way is right-hander **Chris Kirkland**...the former Memphis catcher is 1-0 with a save and a miniscule 0.32 ERA (1 ER in 28.0 IP) following 2.0 scoreless innings Friday...Kirkland leads the MWL in opposing average for relievers at .133 and fewest baserunners per 9.0 IP at 7.39. Lefty **Jose Jimenez** lowered his ERA to 1.42 (3 ER in 19.0 IP) with a scoreless 1.0 IP in securing his first save Saturday, while left-hander **Brian Moran** earned his first save with a run over 3.0 IP last night. Moran has a 2.08 ERA (6 ER in 26.0 IP) and has walked only three while striking out 30...he owns the league's best walks/9.0 IP ratio at 1.04. Right-hander **John Housey** is 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 ER in 24.0 IP) as a reliever and has not allowed an earned run over his last 14.0 relief innings. Closer **Brandon Josselyn** is 7-of-10 in saves following his third blown-save Saturday night. His 3.10 ERA is still fifth-best in the pen.

Taylor-Made: Right-hander **Taylor Stanton** won for the third time in his last four outings Friday night, becoming the first LumberKings' pitcher to reach five wins (5-2). The lone outing over that span in which he didn't win was on 5/18 at Burlington, when he pitched a scoreless ninth and locked down his first professional save. Seattle's 26th round pick out of Diablo Valley College in 2008, Stanton has allowed three earned runs over his last two starts (both quality starts), 15.0 innings for a 1.80 ERA. He's not the only Taylor having success...**Taylor Lewis** has won all three of his starts since joining the club on 5/13 (3-0, 3.38 ERA, 6 ER in 16.0 IP, 6 BB, 5 K).

Today's Start: 22-year-old left-hander **Jimmy Gillheeny** makes his team-leading 11th start with the LumberKings today in the finale of this four-game series at Kane County. It is the 17th-career appearance, 15th-career start for Gillheeny, Seattle's 8th-round pick out of NC State in 2009.

Last Start: Gillheeny is coming off his third win of the season, a one-run, five-hit outing over 6.2 innings in game one of a doubleheader against Burlington on 5/26, a 6-1 win over the Bees. Gilly was one out away from a seven-inning complete-game shutout, but served up an RBI triple to Jose Bonilla before exiting...still, **he lowered his ERA to 2.22, 13th best amongst Midwest League pitchers.**

Against the Cougars: Gillheeny is facing both Kane County and an Oakland Athletics' affiliate for the second time in his career today. He pitched 5.0 innings of scoreless, four-hit baseball on 4/23, striking out seven in a no-decision...the offense failed to back him in a 5-4 loss.

Run Support: The LumberKings' offense has backed Gillheeny with a total of 22 runs over his 10 starts, or an average of 2.20 runs per game. That average is second-lowest amongst Clinton starters this season, ahead of only lefty **Jon Hesketh**, who gets an average of 2.11 runs per game.

Missing a Lot of Bats: Gillheeny has struck out 51 batters over 56.2 innings this season, an average of 8.16 strikeouts per nine innings. Only **Jon Hesketh's** 10.77 strikeouts per nine innings is better. **Gillheeny is currently alone in eighth in the Midwest League in total strikeouts.**

Rough Patch: Two of Gillheeny's three losses came in back-to-back outings at Cedar Rapids on 4/29 and vs. Beloit on 5/4...he gave up a total of seven runs, five earned over 11.0 IP (a 4.09 ERA), walked one and struck out 11 over those two losses, but is 2-0 over four starts since then.

Long Time Coming: His win on 4/13 at Wisconsin marked his first as a pro following an 0-4 start over seven outings, four starts. Gillheeny was Clinton's Opening Night starter on 4/8 against Peoria, but took the loss with five runs (three earned) in a 5-4 final.

'09 in Pulaski: Following the draft, Gillheeny spent the entirety of his first pro assignment with Pulaski. After two scoreless relief outings (3.2 IP), he moved into the rotation, going 0-3 with a 5.79 ERA over four outings. All three of his losses came over his final three starts of the year.

Leaving 'Em On: Despite a .381 opponent average allowed to leadoff hitters in 2009, Gillheeny thrived at stranding baserunners. He limited hitters to a .214 average (3-for-14) with runners on and 2 outs and a .111 average (1-for-9) with RISP and 2 outs.

Leader of the Wolf Pack: Gillheeny pitched for NC State from 2007 to 2009, going 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA, 34 walks and 75 strikeouts in 13 starts with the Wolfpack in his final year. Prior to '09, Gillheeny was the club's closer, going 2-0 with 10 saves in 21 relief outings as a sophomore. The 2007 season saw him go 4-3 with a 6.36 ERA and one save in 19 games.

College Accolades: Following his junior year, Gillheeny was voted second-team All-ACC by the league's head coaches. The previous season, he was named to the third-team All-America by the NCBWA and first-team All-ACC, becoming the third NC State closer to earn the honors (**Jamie Wolkosky** in 1992 and **Joey Devine** from '03-'05).

22-year-old right-hander **Tyler Blandford (1-2, 3.67)** will make his eighth start of the season in the opener of a three-game series at Bowling Green tomorrow night. Blandford returned from a two-week stint on the disabled list on 5/26 and was limited to 2.0 innings against Burlington, but struck out four of the six batters he faced and did not allow a baserunner in a no-decision...lefty Brian Moran would get the victory as the LumberKings won, 7-1 in game two of a doubleheader. Seattle's fifth-round pick out of Oklahoma State University in 2009, Blandford will face both the Hot Rods and a Tampa Bay Rays affiliate for the first time in his career tomorrow.
