### LAST GAME:

Kellin Deglan swatted a go-ahead three-run homer off Zach Logue in the sixth inning and Ben Ruta hit his fifth home run of the season to lead El Trueno to a 5-2 win over Los Gatos Feroces.

Brian Keller allowed two runs, one earned, over five innings in his second start in the Thunder rotation this year. Keller struck out seven, allowed just four hits and one walk in his outing.

Brady Lail earned the victory with 2.2 scoreless innings of relief and struck out seven, matching the most by a Thunder reliever this season. Thunder pitching combined for 17 strikeouts in Saturday's win.

### THUNDER CLAPS

**HOY, HOY, HOY:** Infielder **Hoy Jun Park**, one of five Eastern League all-stars selected from the Thunder roster, has hit safely in seven straight games (a season-high) and is batting .357 (10-for-28) during that stretch. Up until his seventh-inning RBI-double Saturday night, however, each of Park's previous 22 hits (since May 31) had been singles.

**HOLD ON LOOSELY:** Shortstop **Kyle Holder** is batting .351 over his last 20 games, hitting safely in 17 of the 20. The San Diego, California native's current 16-game on-base streak is the longest by a Thunder player this season, passing **Ben Ruta**'s previous team-high of 13 (April 17-May 6). The streak is the third-longest of Holder's career; he reached safely in 18 straight games May 9-31, 2016 for Single-A Charleston and 17 straight to end the 2017 season with High-A Tampa.

**FUN FACT:** The Thunder have won each of their last three Sunday games: at New Hampshire June 23, at Bowie June 16, and against Erie June 9.

**CRAFTY KRISKE:** Reliever **Brooks Kriske** has posted outstanding overall numbers, but has been especially dominant over his last 13 appearances. The Palm Desert, California native has allowed just two runs over 16.0 IP during that stretch, striking out 21 and allowing just 8 walks and 7 hits.

**FLAIL AGAINST LAIL:** Right-hander **Brady Lail**, who didn't make his season debut until May 27, joined the dominant Thunder relief corps on June 5 and has held opposing batters to a .172 average. Lail has provided at least two innings of work in each of his eight outings for Trenton and has recorded a brilliant 8BB/30K ratio over his 18.0 IP.

**FLATLINING:** The Thunder have neither won nor lost more than two games in a row since June 6-8, when the team lost a series finale in Hartford and two of the first scheduled four at home against Erie. The last winning streak of longer than two games was a three-game winning streak May 28-June 1 against Altoona and Harrisburg, which saw one suspension and postponement at home against the Curve.

**ONLY SHOOTIN' STARS BREAK THE MOLD:** On Monday, five Thunder players were named Eastern League all-stars: pitchers **Daniel Alvarez** and **Deivi Garcia**, infielders **Chris Gittens** and **Hoy Jun Park**, and outfielder **Ben Ruta**. The five selections are tied for second-most from any one team; only Richmond (6) is sending more. It is the first mid-season all-star selection for four of the five Thunder players selected; Park earned an all-star nod for Single-A Charleston in 2017.

**WHO THEY ARE:** Of the 24 players on the Thunder roster, 12 were drafted by the Yankees, 10 were signed as minor league or international free agents, and two were acquired via trade. Fourteen of the 24 played under Patrick Osborn at High-A Tampa at some point in 2018.
