

# TRENTON THUNDER GAME NOTES

## Hartford Yard Goats ((Rockies)) vs. Trenton Thunder ((Yankees))

### LAST GAME:

Brian Keller fired a 7-inning no-hitter in the opener of a doubleheader split between the Altoona Curve and Thunder on Thursday night.

Keller needed just 70 pitches to record the 8<sup>th</sup> no-hitter in the Eastern League in 2019, working around a second inning walk to complete the task. It was the second no-hitter thrown by the Thunder this season following a combined effort by Deivi Garcia, Domingo Acevedo and Daniel Alvarez in late-June.

Brian Navaretto brought a run in in the second inning with a sacrifice fly and Ben Ruta doubled in a run in the third to give Keller the two runs of support he needed to finish the no-no.

Right-hander Shawn Sample fired his first career complete game in game two of the doubleheader, a 4-2 loss. Sample surrendered a pair of homers and a run in the seventh inning to allow the Curve to split the twin bill.

Chris Gittens hit a two-run double in the first inning, Rashad Crawford collected hits in both games giving him an 11-game on-base streak.

### THUNDER CLAPS

**KELL YEAH:** Brian Keller's seven-inning no-hitter Thursday in the first game of Trenton's doubleheader against Altoona was the second Thunder no-hitter of the season and the sixth in franchise history. Keller's 70 pitches (53 strikes) were his fewest in a seven-inning start in his four-year career, and the Wisconsin native reached just one three-ball count in the game.

**BUTTING HEADS:** The Thunder are 10-9 all-time at Dunkin' Donuts Park, winning three of their six series there over the past three years. The series victories include one series sweep, a 3-0 sweep of the Yard Goats the weekend of August 24-26, 2018, the finale of which saw the Thunder clinch a postseason berth for the third straight season.

**WELL THAT'S NEW:** July's 12-18 record for the Thunder marked the first losing month for the club since August of 2015 when the Thunder went 12-16.

**RUTA RE-EMERGING:** After batting just .217 in June and July combined, Ben Ruta has resurfaced as a team batting leader lately, putting together a season-high eight-game hitting streak during which he's batting .370. The New Jersey native is second on the team with 92 hits, is tied for the team lead with 23 doubles, and leads the club with 22 stolen bases (T-3<sup>rd</sup> in the E.L.).

**GIVE YOURSELF A CHANCE:** To extreme proportions, run prevention has been key to Trenton's success this season, as the team is 10-40 when allowing four or more runs. Eight of the team's last nine losses has seen the opponent score five or more runs. On the flipside, the Thunder are 46-8 when allowing three or fewer runs.

**HOW BIZARRE:** Trenton's 36-20 home record is the Eastern League's best and is within full-season Minor League Baseball's top 10. Thunder's 22-31 road record (.415 winning percentage), however, is the worst of any full-season team in Minor League Baseball with an overall record above .500.

**NEW HEIGHTS:** Multiple Thunder players have set new career-highs in various categories this season. Among position players: Kyle Holder has set career-highs in doubles (23), triples (3), and home runs (7)... Isiah Gilliam: 13 stolen bases... Chris Gittens: 58 walks... Brian Navaretto: 5 home runs... Ben Ruta: 38 walks... Brandon Wagner: 2 triples. Among pitchers: Daniel Alvarez: 36 appearances and 14 saves... Brooks Kriske: 34 appearances, 48.0 IP, 10 saves, and 61 strikeouts... Shawn Sample: 21 appearances/16 starts, 104.0 IP, and 98 strikeouts.

**YEAR OF THE PITCHER:** The Eastern League is in the midst of one of the most pitching-dominant seasons in its history in 2019. Entering play today, the league wide batting average stands at .239 with teams scoring 3.98 runs per game. The last time the league finished with a team batting average under .250 and 4.0 runs per game was in 1989 (.249 / 3.95) while 1971 was the last season below .240 and fewer than 4.0 runs per game. The league has also seen eight no-hitters thrown, the most since a league-record nine no-hitters were thrown in 1967.

**WHO THEY ARE:** Of the 24 players on the Thunder roster, 16 were drafted by the Yankees, six were signed as minor league or international free agents, and two were acquired via trade. Sixteen of the 24 played under Patrick Osborn at High-A Tampa at some point in 2018.

(Fla.) in 2014...was selected by the Giants in the 31st round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign... Is the oldest of four, two brothers and one sister, and is expecting a baby girl with his girlfriend, who he met while playing for Tampa Tarpons in 2018, in late-August...
