LAST GAME:

Rony Garcia fired a quality start and Chris Gittens smacked a go-ahead RBI single in the fifth inning as part of a three-hit day to lead the Thunder Pork Roll to a 5-3 win over Harrisburg on Friday night.

Gittens and Ben Ruta recorded RBI singles to complete a two-out rally against Tyler Mapes in the fifth inning. Kyle Holder added an RBI single in the seventh inning off Mapes to help push the Thunder offense to a third straight win. Isiah Gilliam slammed a two-run homer in the second inning, his fifth at Double-A.

Garcia allowed his first hit in the third inning; a solo homer to Rhett Wiseman. The 21-year-old right-hander cruised after the solo homer before surrendering a go-ahead two-run blast to Michael A. Taylor in the fifth inning. Garcia went on to finish six innings for his sixth quality start in a Thunder uniform.

Andrew Bellati and Daniel Alvarez combined for three scoreless innings of relief following Garcia, allowing three hits, no walks and four strikeouts.

THUNDER CLAPS

CAPITAL CITIES SHOWDOWN: Matching up for their fourth and final series of the season, the Thunder and Senators are facing off for the first time since both teams clinched their respective divisions' first-half titles. Harrisburg has taken seven of the first 11 matchups, including a four-game sweep of the Thunder May 13-15 at FNB Field. All-time, the Thunder are 169-147 (.535) against the Senators.

BREAKING THE FOURTH WALL: Having won three straight games, the Thunder have the chance at their longest winning streak since May 6-11, when the team rattled off five straight wins against Richmond and Portland. Trenton has won more than three consecutive games just three times this season; all three were five-game winning streaks, and each took place within the first 31 games of the season.

GITTY'S GOT IT: First baseman **Chris Gittens** is enjoying a career year, leading all active Eastern Leaguers with 68 RBI, 61 walks, a .398 OBP, and a .503 slugging percentage. His 19 home runs rank second to Reading's Darick Hall and Portland's Bobby Dalbec, who have hit 20 each. Gittens' 19 HR and 68 RBI are just shy of his career-high 21 HR and 70 RBI in 2016, and his 96 hits are only one shy of his career-high 97 that same year.

WELL THAT'S NEW: July's 12-18 record for the Thunder marked the first losing month for the club since August of 2015 when the Thunder went 12-16.

HIT THE ROAD, JACK: After this weekend's series, the Thunder will play just seven more home games over their 21 remaining games. Only three of those next six series will be against teams with a winning record in the second half (entering Friday).

NEW HEIGHTS: Multiple Thunder players have set new career-highs in various categories this season. Among position players: **Kyle Holder** has set career-highs in doubles (23), triples (3), and home runs (7)... **Isiah Gilliam:** 13 stolen bases... **Chris Gittens:** 61 walks... **Brian Navarreto:** 5 home runs... **Ben Ruta:** 42 walks... **Brandon Wagner:** 2 triples. Among pitchers: **Daniel Alvarez:** 39 appearances and 17 saves... **Brooks Kriske:** 36 appearances, 52.0 IP, 11 saves, and 64 strikeouts... **Shawn Sample:** 22 appearances/17 starts, 108.2 IP, and 102 strikeouts.

CONNECT FOUR: The Thunder are eight games away from clinching their fourth consecutive winning season, one shy of the franchise record. From 1995 to 1999, Trenton put together five straight winning seasons as a Red Sox affiliate.

YEAR OF THE PITCHER: The Eastern League is in the midst of one of the most pitching-dominant seasons in its history in 2019. Entering play today, the league wide batting average stands at .239 with teams scoring 3.96 runs per game. The last time the league finished with a team batting average under .250 and 4.0 runs per game was in 1989 (.249 / 3.95) while 1971 was the last season below .240 and fewer than 4.0 runs per game. The league has also seen eight no-hitters thrown, the most since a league-record nine no-hitters were thrown in 1967.

WHO THEY ARE: Of the 24 players on the Thunder roster, 13 were drafted by the Yankees, seven were signed as minor league or international free agents, and four were acquired via trade. Fifteen of the 24 played under Patrick Osborn at High-A Tampa at some point in 2018.

CAREER NOTES: Selected by the Miami Marlins in the 12th round of the 2016 Draft... Acquired with Int'l Bonus Pool money by NYY in exchange for LHP Caleb Smith and INF Garrett Cooper on 11/20/17... Entering 2019, has the fifth-lowest ERA (2.59) among minor league pitchers with at least 300.0IP since 2016...

2019: Non-roster invitee to Yankees Spring Training, began season on IL with a stress fracture in his elbow... Made 4 rehab appearances with GCL/Staten Island before joining Thunder on 7/30 vs. Altoona... Touched for a career-high 10 R on 10 H (matched Thunder-high) in his 8/4 start at Hartford...

2018: Combined to go 11-5 with 2CG and a 1.79 ERA (161.1IP, 118H, 43R/32ER, 29BB, 152K, 8HR) in 25 games (24 starts) with Tampa (7GS), Trenton (12G/11GS) and SWB (6GS)...ranked second among all minor leaguers in ERA (min. 50.0IP)...his 5.24 K/BB ratio ranked sixth among all minor leaguers (min. 100.0IP)...was the lowest season ERA recorded by a Yankees farmhand (min. 20GS) since Dietrich Enns in 2016 (1.73 ERA with Trenton and Scranton/WB)...among Yankees farmhands, led in strikeouts and ERA and was second in wins...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 21-of-24 starts...started the season with Single-A Tampa and was named a Florida State League Mid-Season All-Star after going 1-3 with a 1.79 ERA (40.1IP, 8ER) in seven first-half starts...was promoted to Double-A Trenton on 5/19, where he went 6-2 with a 2.09 ERA (82.0IP, 19ER) with 76K...Named Eastern League "Pitcher of the Week" honors for week ending July 1 after he delivered a 9-inning shutout on 6/30 vs. New Hampshire, matching his career-high with 11 strikeouts (struck out 5 in a row 6th into 7th), allowed one baserunner into scoring position (Jonathan Davis, 4th inning double), first 9-inning shutout by a Thunder pitcher since Brady Lail on 7/25/15 vs. Binghamton... Delivered 26 consecutive innings without a walk (6/30-7/20)... went undefeated in his final 4GS with Trenton from 7/14-31, going 4-0 with a 1.93 ERA (28.0IP, 6ER) with 24K...was transferred to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 8/4 and went 4-0 with a 1.15 ERA (39.0IP, 5ER) with 31K with the RailRiders... allowed more than 1R in just one-of-six starts with the RailRiders and recorded a 16.1IP scoreless streak from 8/18-29...earned the International League's August "Pitcher of the Month" honors after going 3-0 with a 1.09 ERA (33.0IP, 4ER) in five Aug. starts with the RailRiders...made two postseason starts for the RailRiders, going 0-1 with a 3.37 ERA (13.1IP, 5ER) with 12K...following the season, was named to Baseball America's Minor League All-Star Second Team...was named an MLB.com Organizational All-Star...enters the 2019 season tabbed by Baseball America as the No. 5 prospect in the Yankees system and to have the organization's "Best Control"
