

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes conclude a three-game series against the Lancaster JetHawks (Colorado Rockies Affiliate) on the road in game three at The Hangar. This is the final of six total games between the two clubs over a seven day stretch, with the first three match-ups taking place at LoanMart Field in Rancho Cucamonga. This is the third series played at The Hangar for Rancho during the first-half schedule.

VS LANCASTER: This is the 12th of 28 overall meetings between the two clubs and the ninth of 15 games at The Hangar. The Quakes last met with the JetHawks in a three-game series at LoanMart Field 6/1-6/3 and won two-of-three against the South Division opponents. Starting pitcher Dean Kremer was credited with the win in the first game of the series, as the Quakes shutout Lancaster 2-0. In game two of the set, Stetson Allie pitched a scoreless fifth inning of relief and secured his first victory of the season. Following a 6-4 loss to Lancaster on Wednesday, the Quakes lead the season series six-games-to-five.

LAST TIME OUT: The Lancaster JetHawks received some good starting pitching and unlike Tuesday's series-opener, got some solid work out of the bullpen, holding off the Quakes on Wednesday night at The Hangar, winning 6-4. Lancaster jumped on Rancho starter Tony Gonsolin for three first-inning runs, with Willie Abreau connecting for an opposite-field homer to highlight the inning, giving the JetHawks a 3-0 lead. The JetHawks' bullpen didn't start out so strong on Wednesday, as Heath Holder gave up a two-run homer to Hamlet Marte and a solo-shot to Rylan Bannon, his league-best 15th of the year, as Rancho made it a two-run game in the seventh, at 6-4. That's as close as the Quakes would get though, as Lawrence came on in the eighth after a Logan Landon double, getting Thomas to ground out to end the inning before working a 1-2-3 ninth.

GROUNDING THE HAWKS: On the offensive end, Gavin Lux and Rylan Bannon have shown the most success against Lancaster pitching this season. Lux is batting .395 (17-for-43) with five doubles, four home runs and 12 RBI's to go along with a team-high OBP of .458. Bannon is batting .318 (14-for-44) with a team-high seven home runs and a slugging percentage of .909.

BANNON'S BIG WEEK: Rylan Bannon was named California League Player of the week on Monday (6/4) following a strong offensive showing to close the month of May. Over the week, Bannon hit .458 with four HR's, eight RBI's and six runs scored. Bannon is the third Quakes player to receive league honors after Gavin Lux was named player of the week on 4/30 and Dustin May as pitcher of the week on 5/21.

ONE RUN NO FUN: Rancho has struggled in one-run games this season going 5-13 in tightly contested matchups. Rancho dropped a one-run game in the series finale against Lancaster on Sunday (2-3), and of recent is 1-6 over the last seven games decided by a run.

CHASING THE TOP: The Quakes are rumbling at the right time, winners of six of their last eight games, with 11 games left to play in the first-half schedule. Rancho is currently tied second place in the California League south division with Lancaster, two games back of first place Lake Elsinore.

CURRENT STREAKS: Rylan Bannon has reached on a hit in ten of his last eleven games and is currently on an eleven-game on-base streak. Jeren Kendall has reached on a hit in seven of his last nine games. After homering in four consecutive games over a five-game hit streak, Gavin Lux was 0-for-5 on Wednesday, seeing his stretch come to a close.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Today, RHP Andrew Sopko was promoted to double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. Filling Sopko's spot of the roster, RHP Parker Curry has been transferred from Tulsa to Rancho Cucamonga.

KREMER WITH A "K": Dean Kremer (4-2) is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season for the Quakes and second start against the JetHawks. Kremer pitched against Lancaster his last time out on 6/1 at LoanMart Field, allowing no runs on one hit over five innings and striking out nine in his fourth win of the season. Kremer has not allowed a run over his last two starts and surrendered a single hit over 11 total innings. The Stockton, CA native was a 14th round pick by the Dodgers in 2016 draft out of the University of Nevada Las Vegas.

OPPOSING PITCHER: Rico Garcia (5-6) is scheduled to make his 12th start of the year for the JetHawks and second this season against Rancho. Garcia faced the Quakes his last time out in a start on 6/1, allowing one run on five hits and striking out nine over 6 innings in a loss. Garcia ranks second in the Cal League with 76 total strikeouts, behind Dean Kremer (83) of Rancho. The Honolulu, HI native was drafted by the Rockies in the 30th round of the 2016 draft out of Hawaii Pacific University.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had three different Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia. Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM: A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 17th and 23rd in the Dodgers' system, by MLB Pipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Mathewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

NINE & ON TIME: The Quakes are the only team in the California League that have yet to play an extra-inning game under the new MilB rules this season. As a result, Rancho has completed all games in under four hours with the longest contest clocking in at 3:49 vs. Inland Empire on April 14th. April 14th marked the closest the Quakes have come to playing extras, tied at 6-6 in the ninth inning, Rancho scored the game-winning run in the bottom half and secured their first walk-off win of the season.

BY THE NUMBERS

12	Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.
83	Starting pitcher Dean Kremer currently leads the California League with 83 strikeouts over his first 12 starts of the season. Kremer set a career high with ten strikeouts in a start against Inland Empire on 5/27. The UNLV product totaled 46 strikeouts across 29.2 total innings pitched in the month of May.
27	The Quakes RBI-Leader Cristian Santana has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 27 of his 39 RBI's have come with RISP where he is batting at a .266 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average sky rockets to .375 where he is 3-for-8 with 9 RBI's.
