Tuesday Recap: RubberDucks snap home losing skid against Curve (Akron 7, Altoona 2): The Akron RubberDucks scored five runs in the third inning Tuesday night on the way to a 7-2 win over the Altoona Curve in front of 3,408 at Canal Park, marking Akron's first home win in six games with Altoona this season and first in any home game since June 13 to snap a season-long seven-game home losing streak. Akron right-hander Jake Paulson (6-5) allowed two runs in six innings, and designated hitter Mitch Longo had three hits, a home run and two RBI. It set up Akron's second home rubber match of the season (won May .

<u>Call named Player of the Week:</u> RubberDucks center fielder Alex Call was named the Eastern League Player of the Week for June 24-30, after he led the league with 22 total bases and was tied for the lead with three home runs (including consecutive games Saturday, when he hit Akron's first grand slam of the season, and Sunday), five extra-base hits, and eight RBI. He hit safely in six of seven games on the road trip, going 10-for-32 with a double, a triple, and four runs. He is the second RubberDuck to be named Player of the Week (Ka'ai Tom was May 20-26).

RubberDucks All-Stars: The RubberDucks had five players selected as All-Stars for the Western Division. The rosters were announced on Monday for the 2019 Eastern League All-Star Game in Richmond on July 10 at 7:05 p.m. They include first baseman Wilson Garcia (will not participate because of right foot sprain), outfielders Connor Marabell and Ka'ai Tom, and pitchers Eli Morgan and Kyle Nelson.

<u>Ducks flying out of the park:</u> The RubberDucks have hit an Eastern League-leading 74 home runs while allowing only 47 home runs (tied for third fewest among EL clubs) for a league-best +27 home run differential. In 41 home games, Akron has hit 28 home runs, allowing 20 (+8 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 74 home runs this season, 50 (68 percent) have come in 18 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List on May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 46 games, collecting 57 hits (third in the Eastern League) and going 57-for-180 (.317, second in the EL) to move to fifth in league with a .293 average with 17 multi-hit games (including four in his last five), seven doubles, three triples, a home run, 23 runs, 12 RBI, 13 walks, and a .370 OBP (sixth in the EL). He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (Baseball America) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

<u>League leaders:</u> Akron leads the league in games (84), at-bats (2,787), runs (357), hits (676), home runs (74), extra-base hits (222), total bases (1,066) and RBI (329). The RubberDucks average 4.25 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 95 total runs in the last 28 games (3.39/game, 11-17 W-L), scoring five or more in eight games (6-2).

Home field ebbs and flows at Canal Park: Before a win Tuesday, the RubberDucks lost a season-high seven straight home games. In between a season-opening six-game losing streak and the latest skid, Akron was 18-9 at home. The RubberDucks lost the first six games of the season April 4-9 at Canal Park and were swept in the last two home series by Portland (June 14-16) and Erie (June 21-23). The last time Akron was swept in consecutive home series was June 2016 (June 7-9 vs. Reading, June 14-16 vs. Erie), during an eight-game home losing streak. Akron has been swept three times at home for the first time since 2016, when it also won the Eastern League Championship. Since then, Akron was never swept at home in 2017 and was swept once at home in 2018.

<u>Ducks host Curve:</u> The RubberDucks and Curve are playing the fourth of five scheduled series this season, with seven games at Canal Park and 11 at Peoples Natural Gas Field. Altoona swept the season-opening fourgame series April 4-7 at Canal Park and has won four of seven games in Altoona. Last season, Altoona won the series, 13-10, for the first time since 2010, although Akron held a 7-6 edge at Canal Park and won the Western Division playoff series, three games to one. Altoona finished first in the Eastern Division, at 78-60, by one game over Akron (78-62) last season. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 173-140, and has won 10, lost two, and tied two season series.

Tom's hot stretch: Since April 30, outfielder Ka'ai Tom is leading the Eastern League in total bases (124), runs (40), on-base percentage (.420), slugging (.596) and OPS (1.016). Tom had a 27-game on-base streak May 21-June 18 to tie Binghamton's Sam Haggerty (a RubberDuck in 2018) for the longest on-base streak in the EL this year. During the streak, Tom was 35-for-92 (.380) with seven doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, 19 runs and 17 walks for a .491 on-base percentage. Since May 10, he has hit safely in 42 of 50 games (61-for-177, .345 average, 13 home runs, 38 runs, 33 RBI), raising his average from .191 to .286. Tom leads the EL with 82 hits, 148 total bases, and 50 runs, is second in triples (6) and slugging (.516), third in on-base percentage (.388) and OPS (.904), tied for third in home runs (14) and extra-base hits (32), fourth in walks (43), and eighth in average (.286).

Tom made case for another Eastern League Player of the Month:

After last month he became the first Akron player to earn Eastern League Player of the Month since Tim Fedroff in May 2011, outfielder **Ka'ai Tom** has maintained stellar statistics. In June, he played in all 29 RubberDucks games and led the league in total bases (57), and was second in on-base percentage (.415) and OPS (.968). He was third in average (.320) and slugging (.553), and tied for third in runs (18). In May, Tom led the league in May with a .434 OBP, .635 SLG, and 1.069 OPS, and tied for the lead with 21 runs. He was second in hits (32) and total bases (61), and tied for second in average (.333). After hitting .177 with one home run in 23 April games, Tom hit .333 (32-for-96) with seven home runs (tied for the team high and third in the league) in 26 May games. In 2018, he hit .286 in May (his best in any month) after hitting .183 in April.

LAST START (Friday, June 28, at Bowie, ND in 3-2 loss):

Hentges kept Bowie off the board with two hits through three innings and held a 1-0 lead before the Baysox got a pair of fourth-inning doubles to tie the game. He had a 2-1 lead entering the bottom of the fifth, but he gave up the tying run on Ryan McKenna's two-out RBI triple that ended his start. Right-hander Robert Broom ended the inning in a tie, giving Hentges a no decision, but Broom allowed the deciding home run to Rylan Bannon in the sixth inning of a 3-2 loss.

Season Highlights

- In May, had the eighth-best ERA (2.38), eighth-most innings (34) and tied for the fifth-most strikeouts (35) in the Eastern League.
- Entered the season ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the Indians system by Baseball America and No. 10 by MLB.com (both as top left-handed pitcher).
- Added to the Indians 40-man roster Nov. 20, and made his first two career major league spring training appearances, with two scoreless, hitless starts for the Indians - Feb. 26 at Colorado (W, 1.0 IP, 0 BB, 0 K) and March 3 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 1 BB, 3 K).

2018:

- Finished second in ERA (3.27) and third in strikeouts (122) in the Carolina League, Mid-Season Carolina League All-Star, MiLB.com organizational All-Star.
- Did not pitch after August 15 due to a left shoulder strain, but his final start was his best, Aug. 15 at Wilmington (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 7SO).
- Recorded four starts of at least 6 scoreless innings and over his final 12 starts, he posted a 2.69 ERA (19ER/63.2IP).
- Allowed only four homers in 118.1 innings, while batters hit .230 (46-for-200) off him with runners on and .231 (27-for-117) with RISP.

2017:

- Season did not begin until 7/8 due to elbow surgery the previous July.
- Made six rehab starts in the Arizona League before being activated at Mahoning Valley on 8/9, finishing the season with five starts (2.04 ERA).

2016: Limited to 14 starts for Lake County (A) due to a left elbow strain, did not pitch after June 23...had left elbow reconstruction (Tommy John surgery) in July.

2015: Led AZL Indians with 59 strikeouts, third-most in the league.

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookielevel Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**
