Friday Recap: Scott stays sharp, as homers power Ducks to win in Binghamton (Akron 5, Binghamton 0): RubberDucks left-hander Adam Scott (3-0) pitched six scoreless innings, and back-to-back home runs by right fielder Trenton Brooks - whose home run was his first career grand slam - and first baseman Nellie Rodriguez with two outs in the third inning carried a 5-0 win over the Rumble Ponies in the second game of a four-game series at NYSEG Stadium on Friday night. Akron's ninth shutout of the season tied Binghamton for second-most in the league.

<u>Call named Player of the Week:</u> RubberDucks center fielder Alex Call was named the Eastern League Player of the Week for June 24-30, after he led the league with 22 total bases and was tied for the lead with three home runs (including consecutive games Saturday, when he hit Akron's first grand slam of the season, and Sunday), five extra-base hits, and eight RBI. He hit safely in six of seven games on the road trip, going 10-for-32 with a double, a triple, and four runs. He is the second RubberDuck to be named Player of the Week (Ka'ai Tom was May 20-26).

RubberDucks All-Stars: The RubberDucks had five players selected as All-Stars for the Western Division. The rosters were announced on Monday for the 2019 Eastern League All-Star Game in Richmond on July 10 at 7:05 p.m. They include first baseman Wilson Garcia (will not participate because of right foot sprain), outfielders Connor Marabell and Ka'ai Tom, and pitchers Eli Morgan and Kyle Nelson.

<u>Ducks flying out of the park:</u> The RubberDucks have hit an Eastern League-leading 77 home runs while allowing only 50 home runs (fourth fewest among EL clubs) for a league-best +27 home run differential. In 45 road games, Akron has hit 48 home runs, allowing 28 (+20 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 77 home runs this season, 52 (68 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List on May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 49 games, collecting 63 hits (second in the Eastern League) and going 63-for-195 (.323, second in the EL) to move to third in league with a team-high .300 average with 19 multi-hit games (including six in his current eight-game hitting streak), seven doubles, three triples, a home run, 26 runs, 12 RBI, 13 walks, and a .372 OBP (fourth in the EL). He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (Baseball America) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

<u>League leaders:</u> Akron leads the league in games (87), at-bats (2,894), runs (367), hits (704), home runs (77), extra-base hits (230), total bases (1,109), slugging percentage (.383) and RBI (339). The RubberDucks average 4.22 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 105 total runs in the last 31 games (3.39/game, 12-19 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 9 games (7-2).

<u>Ducks visit Rumble Ponies:</u> For the final series before the Eastern League All-Star Break, the RubberDucks and Rumble Ponies are playing the third of five scheduled series this season, with 10 games at Canal Park and seven at NYSEG Stadium. Binghamton leads the season series, 5-3, including 3-2 at home against Akron. Last season, Akron went 10-3 against Binghamton, including 4-2 at NYSEG Stadium. In 2018, Binghamton finished fifth in the Eastern Division, at 64-76. In the first half of this season, the Rumble Ponies won two of three games both in Akron and Binghamton, and finished 35-29, in fourth place, 2.5 games out of first place in the Eastern Division. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 118-88, winning eight, losing five, and tying one season series.

Warming up the bats: While shortstop Ernie Clement has the team's longet active hitting streak at eight games, RubberDucks outfielders Trenton Brooks and Mitch Longo each are on their longest hitting streaks of the season, which is the first for both in Double-A. Brooks has homered twice in the past week and has six-game hitting streak (including three two-hit games) in which he is 9-for-23 with a double, triple, two home runs and six RBI. Longo has a five-game hitting streak (three multi-hit games) in which he is 9-for-18, with two doubles, a home run, two RBI and four walks. Also, first baseman Nellie Rodriguez has hit three home runs in the last week and has nine this season – fourth on the club – to give him 44 in his Double-A career – his most at any level.

New York connections: Two current RubberDucks hail from the Rochester, New York, area – about a 2.5-hour drive from Binghamton. Shortstop Ernie Clement is a Rochester native who graduated from Brighton High School and was twice named Rochester City Athletic Conference Player of the Year and named league MVP his junior and senior seasons. He was a two-time Bowman Cup Team Selection (best hockey players from Rochester and Buffalo areas). Friday's starter, left-hander Adam Scott, is a native of Canandaigua (southeast of Rochester) and was a four-year starter at Canandaigua Academy. He earned All-Greater Rochester honors. He also lettered twice in basketball.

Tom's hot stretch: Since April 30, outfielder Ka'ai Tom is leading the Eastern League in total bases (128), batting average (.327), on-base percentage (.425), slugging (.598) and OPS (1.023). Tom had a 27-game on-base streak May 21-June 18 to tie Binghamton's Sam Haggerty (a RubberDuck in 2018) for the longest on-base streak in the EL this year. During the streak, Tom was 35-for-92 (.380) with seven doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, 19 runs and 17 walks for a .491 on-base percentage. Since May 10, he has hit safely in 43 of 51 games (62-for-181, .343 average, 13 home runs, 38 runs, 33 RBI), raising his average from .191 to .285. Tom leads the EL with 149 total bases. He is tied for the lead in hits (82), is second in triples (6), runs (50) and slugging (.512), third in hits (83), on-base percentage (.386) and OPS (.898), tied for third in home runs (14) and extra-base hits (32), fourth in walks (43), and eighth in average (.285, second on the club).

LAST OUTING (Monday, July 1, vs. Altoona, ND in 5-4 loss)

Lingos relieved David Speer to begin the third inning, with a 1-0 lead. In his first Double-A inning, he allowed a walk, RBI triple and RBI single to fall behind, 2-1. From there, Lingos faced the minimum through the seventh inning, including one stretch retiring 11 in a row. Meanwhile, Akron took a 4-2 lead. Lingos began the eighth inning with a walk to Altoona's Bralin Jackson before picking him off first base. Gift Ngoepe hit a popup that second baseman Alexis Pantoja dropped. Left-hander Kyle Nelson entered, allowing a hit batter and game-tying two-run double, and right-hander Dalbert Siri allowed the go-ahead double, closing a three-run eighth inning with Altoona ahead, 5-4. The Curve held on for the series-opening win.

2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (*Third Season*) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**
