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Friday Recap: Baysox rally to stun RubberDucks (Bowie 6, Akron 5, 10 innings): With the RubberDucks one out from a win, Bowie second baseman Jesmuel Valentin hit a go-ahead two-run home run for a 5-4 lead, and the Baysox scored a 10th-inning run for a 6-5 win in front of 6,042 at Canal Park on Friday night. Akron dropped eight games below .500 in a half and nine games below .500 overall for the first time this season. Akron is now 7-18 in one-run games and 7-9 in extra innings.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List on May 9, shortstop **Ernie Clement** has played 53 games, collecting 67 hits (second in the Eastern League) and going 67-for-212 (.316, second in the EL) to move to fourth in league with a team-high .295 average with 19 multi-hit games (including six in his current 12-game hitting streak), eight doubles, three triples, a home run, 28 runs, 13 RBI, 14 walks, and a .365 OBP. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (*Baseball America*) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

League leaders: Akron leads the league in games (91), at-bats (3,035), runs (380), hits (735), home runs (78), total bases (1,150), slugging percentage (.379) and RBI (350). The RubberDucks average 4.18 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 118 total runs in the last 35 games (3.37/game, 12-23 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 10 games (7-3).

Salazar makes rehab start: Cleveland Indians right-hander **Danny Salazar** made his first Double-A rehab start for the Indians on Thursday, taking a loss after going 2 2/3 innings with two strikeouts and allowing an earned run on two hits and a walk in the third inning, before the Akron bullpen relieved him. Salazar has not pitched in the major leagues since the 2017 American League Division Series and has made two rehab starts (June 30 and July 5) this season for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians (0-1, 6.23 ERA, 4.1 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, 0 BB, 11 K), his first regular season action since he was placed on the Injured List for the entire 2018 regular season with right shoulder rotator cuff tendonitis. He is currently on the Indians 60-day Injured List. After 13 starts for Akron between 2012 and 2013 (6-3, 2.26 ERA, 67.2 IP, 74 K), Salazar has pitched 2013-2017 in the major leagues with the Indians.

RubberDucks All-Stars: The RubberDucks had five players selected as All-Stars for the Western Division, and four played in the Eastern League All-Star Game, won by the Western Division, 5-0, on Wednesday in Richmond. **Connor Marabell** played the whole game as the designated hitter and was 0-for-4 with a strikeout. **Ka'ai Tom** went 1-for-2 with a strikeout and was promoted after the game to Triple-A Columbus. Right-hander **Eli Morgan** allowed one of the two Eastern Division hits but was the only Western Division pitcher to strike out two batters in his scoreless fifth inning. Left-hander **Kyle Nelson** struck out Binghamton's Braxton Lee to end the seventh inning. First baseman **Wilson Garcia** did not participate because of right foot sprain.

Ducks host Baysox: The RubberDucks and Baysox are playing the last of six scheduled series this season, with 10 games scheduled at Canal Park and 11 at Prince George's Stadium. Akron leads the series, 12-7, and since 2005, leads 169-134. Last season, Akron went 13-8 against Bowie, including 8-3 at Prince George's Stadium. Bowie won the last series of the season, 3-1, in Akron. In 2018, Bowie finished fourth in the Western Division, at 67-71.

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman **Nolan Jones**, ranked by *Baseball America* and MLB.com as the Indians No. 2 prospect, made his Double-A debut Thursday. A second-round pick in 2016 from Holy Ghost Preparatory School (Bensalem, PA), he became the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also represented the Indians in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on Sunday, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Ducks flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit an Eastern League-leading 78 home runs while allowing only 55 home runs (fourth fewest among EL clubs) for a league-best +23 home run differential. In 44 home games, Akron has hit 29 home runs, allowing 24 (+5 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 78 home runs this season, 52 (two-thirds) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

Warming up the bats: While shortstop **Ernie Clement** has the team's longest active hitting streak at 12 games, RubberDucks outfielder **Trenton Brooks** is also on his longest hitting streak of his first Double-A season. Brooks has eight RBI in a 10-game hitting streak (including four two-hit games) in which he is 15-for-41 with three doubles, a triple, two home runs and eight RBI. Outfielder **Mitch Longo**, also in his first Double-A season, had a seven-game hitting streak snapped on Thursday. He was 12-for-25, with four multi-hit games, three doubles, a home run, two RBI and five walks. Also, first baseman **Nellie Rodriguez** has hit four home runs in the last 11 games and has 10 this season – tied for second on the club – to give him 45 in his Double-A career – his most at any level.

Call named Player of the Week: RubberDucks center fielder **Alex Call** was named the Eastern League Player of the Week for June 24-30, after he led the league with 22 total bases and was tied for the lead with three home runs (including consecutive games Saturday, when he hit Akron's first grand slam of the season, and Sunday), five extra-base hits, and eight RBI. He hit safely in six of seven games on the road trip, going 10-for-32 with a double, a triple, and four runs. He is the second RubberDuck to be named Player of the Week (**Ka'ai Tom** was May 20-26).

Scott had his third straight scoreless outing against the Rumble Ponies, striking out seven and allowing five hits over six innings. He got through a second-and-third, one-out jam in the first and then again worked around a leadoff single in the second. Scott faced only two over the minimum across the next four innings, leaving after the sixth. Jared Robinson worked two scoreless innings, and Dalbert Siri closed out the ninth to preserve the shutout.

Season Highlights

- Has pitched 19.1 consecutive scoreless innings, including each of his last three starts. Akron's longest this season is 21.2 innings (Zach Plesac).
- Began the season with Lynchburg (A-Adv), making 12 starts before a June 20 promotion to Akron.
- Ranked third in the Carolina League with 74 strikeouts at the time of his promotion.

- Began his professional career on June 18 and made four relief appearances for the AZL Indians (rookie).
- Promoted on July 2 to Mahoning Valley (SS-A) and made five relief appearances for the Scrappers.
- Promoted on Aug. 2 to Lake County (A) and made five relief appearances for the Captains.
- Promoted on Aug. 30 to Lynchburg (A-Adv) and made four relief appearances (two in the postseason) for the Hillcats.

Amateur/Personal

- Pitched four seasons at Wofford University, where he set program records for games started (59), innings pitched (364.2) and strikeouts (389 – third-most in Southern Conference history) and finished second with 26 wins.
- Set Wofford single-season record with a conference-leading 137 strikeouts in 103.1 innings as a senior in 2018, when he was named All-Southern Conference second team by the coaches and media.

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (First Season) — Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (First Season) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**
