Saturday Recap: RubberDucks win wild shootout with Bowie (Akron 10. Bowie 7): The RubberDucks erased three deficits and scored four runs in the pivotal bottom of the eighth inning for a 10-7 win over the Baysox in front of a season-high 8,299 at a sold-out Canal Park on Saturday night. Rallying after a 15-minute delay in the middle of the eighth inning for Lock 3's Italian-American Festival fireworks, Akron won for the first time all season when trailing through seven innings (had been 0-38). RubberDucks batters were struck out a season-low once at the plate.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List on May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 54 games, collecting 68 hits (tied for most in the Eastern League) and going 68-for-217 (.313, second in the EL) to move to fifth in league with a team-high .293 average with 19 multihit games (including six in his current 13-game hitting streak), eight doubles, three triples, a home run, 29 runs, 13 RBI, 14 walks, and a .361 OBP (eighth in the EL). He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (Baseball America) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

League leaders: Akron leads the league in games (92), at-bats (3,070), runs (390), hits (746), home runs (79), total bases (1,170), and slugging percentage (.381). The RubberDucks average 4.24 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 128 total runs in the last 36 games (3.55/game, 13-23 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 11 games (8-3).

Salazar makes rehab start: Cleveland Indians right-hander Danny Salazar made his first Double-A rehab start for the Indians on Thursday, taking a loss after going 2 2/3 innings with two strikeouts and allowing an earned run on two hits and a walk in the third inning, before the Akron bullpen relieved him. Salazar has not pitched in the major leagues since the 2017 American League Division Series and has made two rehab starts (June 30 and July 5) this season for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians (0-1, 6.23 ERA, 4.1 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, 0 BB, 11 K), his first regular season action since he was placed on the Injured List for the entire 2018 regular season with right shoulder rotator cuff tendonitis. He is currently on the Indians 60-day Injured List. After 13 starts for Akron between 2012 and 2013 (6-3, 2.26 ERA, 67.2 IP, 74 K), Salazar has pitched 2013-2017 in the major leagues with the Indians.

RubberDucks All-Stars: The RubberDucks had five players selected as All-Stars for the Western Division, and four played in the Eastern League All-Star Game, won by the Western Division, 5-0, on Wednesday in Richmond. Connor Marabell played the whole game as the designated hitter and was 0-for-4 with a strikeout. Ka'ai Tom went 1-for-2 with a strikeout and was promoted after the game to Triple-A Columbus. Righthander Eli Morgan allowed one of the two Eastern Division hits but was the only Western Division pitcher to strike out two batters in his scoreless fifth inning. Left-hander Kyle Nelson struck out Binghamton's Braxton Lee to end the seventh inning. First baseman Wilson Garcia did not participate because of right foot sprain.

Ducks host Baysox: The RubberDucks and Baysox are playing the last of 21 games across six scheduled series this season, with 10 games scheduled at Canal Park and 11 at Prince George's Stadium. Akron leads the series, 13-7, and since 2005, leads 170-134. Last season, Akron went 13-8 against Bowie, including 8-3 at Prince George's Stadium. Bowie won the last series of the season, 3-1, in Akron. In 2018, Bowie finished fourth in the Western Division, at 67-71.

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones, ranked by Baseball America and MLB.com as the Indians No. 2 prospect, made his Double-A debut Thursday. A second-round pick in 2016 from Holy Ghost Preparatory School (Bensalem, PA), he became the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also represented the Indians in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Ducks flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit an Eastern League-leading 79 home runs while allowing only 56 home runs (fourth fewest among EL clubs) for a league-best +23 home run differential. In 45 home games, Akron has hit 30 home runs, allowing 25 (+5 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 79 home runs this season, 52 (66 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

Warming up the bats: While shortstop Ernie Clement has the team's longest active hitting streak at 13 games, RubberDucks outfielder Trenton **Brooks** is also on his longest hitting streak of his first Double-A season. Brooks has 11 RBI in an 11-game hitting streak (including five two-hit games) in which he is 17-for-46 with four doubles, a triple, three home runs and 11 RBI. Outfielder Mitch Longo, also in his first Double-A season, had a sevengame hitting streak snapped on Thursday. He was 12-for-25, with four multi-hit games, three doubles, a home run, two RBI and five walks. Also, first baseman Nellie Rodriguez has hit four home runs in the last 12 games and has 10 this season - tied for second on the club - to give him 45 in his Double-A career – his most at any level.

Call named Player of the Week: RubberDucks center fielder Alex Call was named the Eastern League Player of the Week for June 24-30, after he led the league with 22 total bases and was tied for the lead with three home runs (including consecutive games Saturday, when he hit Akron's first grand slam of the season, and Sunday), five extra-base hits, and eight RBI. He hit safely in six of seven games on the road trip, going 10for-32 with a double, a triple, and four runs. He is the second RubberDuck to be named Player of the Week (Ka'ai Tom was May 20-26).

### LAST OUTING (Sunday, July 7 at Binghamton, L in 5-2 loss):

The Rumble Ponies hit Paulson early, as they scored one in the first inning on a triple and sacrifice fly and another in the second after three straight singles. Binghamton tacked on two more in the third after a pair of doubles, but Paulson pitched perfect innings in the fourth and fifth. His last inning was the sixth after a solo home run, and Ben Krauth and Robert Broom each pitched one inning in relief.

### 2018

- Began the season with Lynchburg (A-Adv), making four starts in April, before his first promotion to Double-A on May 3, joining the RubberDucks.
- Pitched the rest of the season with Akron and led the EL in ERA (3.04) and was 2nd in WHIP (1.18).
- Named Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star, the first All-Star selection of his pro career.
- Finished the year tied for the team lead in wins (8) and was second on the team in innings pitched (115.1) and strikeouts (91).
- Started Game 2 of the Eastern League Western Division Series against Altoona (ND, 7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 4 K), which the RubberDucks won on a 10th-inning walk-off home run by Nellie Rodriguez at Canal Park. Akron went on to win the series, 3-1.
- In Game 1 of the Eastern League Championship Series against New Hampshire, he took over with two outs in the first inning from Indians rehabbing right-hander Cody Anderson and worked 7 innings (3 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 4 K), departing in a 1-1 tie in the eighth inning. The Fisher Cats won, 3-1 in 10 innings, before going on to a sweep of the RubberDucks.

### 2016

- Went on the Daytona Injured List on May 1 with right shoulder inflammation and was activated May 24.
- Spent three separate stints on the Injured List (also June 1-July 5 and July 16 through the end of the season).

### 2014

- · Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 27th round of the June, 2014 draft, out of Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan.
- Was one of two players drafted (both by the Indians) from Oakland University. The other was catcher Jake Morton, who was a 39<sup>th</sup>-round pick but did not sign. Morton returned to Oakland for his senior season but did not play professionally.
- Only one player who attended Oakland University (MI) has reached the major leagues. Right-hander Don Kirkwood (at Oakland 1969-71) pitched five seasons with the California Angels (1974-77), Chicago White Sox (1977) and Toronto Blue Jays (1978).

# 2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

**#24 Rouglas Odor**, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach** (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24** 

**#28 Juan De La Cruz**, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.
