Friday Recap: RubberDucks hang on to beat Rumble Ponies (Akron 4, Binghamton 3): RubberDucks right fielder Trenton Brooks hit a goahead three-run triple in the fifth inning of Akron's 4-3 win over Binghamton in front of 5,807 at Canal Park on Friday night. Right-hander Jake Paulson (7-7) allowed one run in five innings to become Akron's first seven-game winner, and right-hander Jared Robinson earned his third save by stranding two baserunners in a scoreless ninth inning. On Saturday, the RubberDucks seek consecutive wins for the first time since June 25-26 and back-to-back home wins for the first time since June 13.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List on May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 60 games, collecting 74 hits (tied for most in the Eastern League) and going 74-for-241 (.307, third in the EL) to move to fifth in league with a .289 average with 21 multi-hit games, nine doubles, three triples, a home run, 32 runs, 14 RBI, 15 walks, a .356 OBP and separate 13- and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (Baseball America) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Warming up the infield bats: Shortstop Ernie Clement has reached base in 18 of 19 games and hit safely in 17 of them. Third baseman Nolan Jones has five RBI his last five games. He came within a double of the cycle and hit his first Double-A home run Monday, homered again Tuesday and finished 6-for-13 with a triple, two home runs, four RBI and three runs in three games in Erie. Second baseman Andruw Monasterio was 5-for-12 on the three-game road trip, and has eight hits in nine games since the All-Star break. First baseman Nellie Rodriguez is 4-for-12 in his last three games and has hit safely in four of his last five games. His 10 home runs lead the RubberDucks' active roster.

<u>League leaders:</u> Akron leads the league in games (98), at-bats (3,272), hits (792), home runs (82) and total bases (1,236), and are second to Bowie in runs (407). The RubberDucks average 4.15 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 145 total runs in the last 42 games (3.45/game, 14-28 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 11 games (8-3).

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones, ranked by Baseball America and MLB.com as the Indians No. 2 prospect, made his Double-A debut on July 11. A second-round pick in 2016 from Holy Ghost Preparatory School (Bensalem, PA), he became the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also represented the Indians in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

<u>Ducks host Rumble Ponies</u>: The RubberDucks and Rumble Ponies are playing the fourth of five scheduled series this season, with 10 games at Canal Park and seven at NYSEG Stadium. Binghamton leads the season series, 8-4, including 3-2 in Akron. Last season, Akron went 10-3 against Binghamton, including 4-2 at NYSEG Stadium. In 2018, Binghamton finished fifth in the Eastern Division, at 64-76. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 118-90, winning eight, losing five, and tying one season series.

<u>Ducks flying out of the park:</u> The RubberDucks have hit an Eastern League-leading 82 home runs while allowing only 64 (tied for fourth fewest among EL clubs) to tie Portland for a league-best +18 home run differential. In 48 home games, Akron has hit 30 home runs, allowing 28 (+2 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 82 home runs this season, 52 (63 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were the most for the club since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

Otero makes rehab appearance: Cleveland Indians right-hander Dan Otero made his first rehab appearance with Akron IN a scoreless seventh inning Thursday, allowing a leadoff single before inducing a ground-ball double play and groundout. He is scheduled to make another relief outing for Akron on Saturday. Otero was placed on the Injured List June 2 with right shoulder inflammation and made his first rehab appearance for Mahoning Valley on Monday. For the Indians, Otero is 0-0 with a 4.56 ERA in 20 games this season (23.2 IP, 10 K, 1.48 WHIP, 1.68 GO/AO).

Salazar makes rehab start: Cleveland Indians right-hander Danny Salazar (currently on the 60-day Injured List) made his second Double-A rehab start with the RubberDucks in Erie on Tuesday, allowing an earned run on three hits with two walks and four strikeouts in three innings. In his first Double-A start July 11, he took a loss (2.2 IP, 2 K) and allowed an earned run on two hits and a walk in the third inning. Salazar made two rehab starts June 30 and July 5 for the rookie Arizona League Indians (0-1, 6.23 ERA, 4.1 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, 0 BB, 11 K), his first regular season action since he was placed on the Injured List for the entire 2018 regular season with right shoulder rotator cuff tendonitis. He has not pitched in the major leagues since the 2017 American League Division Series. After 13 starts for Akron between 2012 and 2013 (6-3, 2.26 ERA, 67.2 IP, 74 K), Salazar has pitched 2013-2017 in the major leagues with the Indians.

RubberDucks All-Stars: The RubberDucks had five players selected as Western Division All-Stars, and four played in the Eastern League All-Star Game, won by the Western Division, 5-0, on July 10 in Richmond.

Connor Marabell played the entire game as the designated hitter, going 0-for-4 with a strikeout. Ka'ai Tom went 1-for-2 with a strikeout and was promoted afterward to Triple-A Columbus. Right-hander Eli Morgan allowed one of the two Eastern Division hits but was the only Western Division pitcher to strike out two batters in his scoreless fifth inning. Left-hander Kyle Nelson struck out Binghamton's Braxton Lee to end the seventh inning. Wilson Garcia did not participate (right foot sprain).

In his first Eastern League start, Hu retired the first six batters and had a 2-0 lead entering the bottom of the third inning. Cam Gibson led off the inning with a solo home run. After a groundout, Hu allowed a walk before a fly out. After going to a three-ball count against six of the 10 batters he faced, he was removed for right-hander Jordan Stephens, who preserved the lead. Akron grew the edge to 4-1, before Erie rallied to tie the game in the seventh inning against Ben Krauth and win on Derek Hill's walk-off single in the ninth against Dalbert Siri.

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookielevel Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, *Strength and Conditioning Coach* (*Third Season*) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter:** @PaulSynenkyj
