Wednesday Recap: Thunder never trail in taking rubber match from RubberDucks (Trenton 6, Akron 3): The Trenton Thunder took a firstinning lead on Ben Ruta's two-run home run and led for the rest of a 6-3 series rubber match win over the RubberDucks on Wednesday at ARM & HAMMER Park in Trenton. RubberDucks third baseman Nolan Jones hit an RBI double to collect his third RBI of the series. Left-hander Sam Hentges (1-10) took the loss after allowing four earned runs in 3 2/3 innings. Trenton won two of the three games played in a 21.5-hour span, the first time Akron has had such a stretch this season. Akron is now 3-4 in rubber matches and 2-3 in road rubber games. The RubberDucks have lost a season-long seven straight series and season-long four straight road series (last won a series June 24-26 in Harrisburg).

Clement's strong return: Shortstop Ernie Clement has reached base in 23 of 24 games and hit safely in 21 of 24. Since returning from the Injured List on May 9, he has played 65 games, collecting 79 hits (most in the Eastern League) and going 79-for-259 (.305, second in the EL) to move to third in league with a .289 average with 22 multi-hit games, nine doubles, three triples, a home run, 35 runs, 16 RBI, 17 walks, a .354 OBP and separate 13- and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (Baseball America) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Midsummer warmups: While the RubberDucks are only 5-16 in July, a few players have had notable success at the plate this month. Outfielder Trenton Brooks, playing his first Double-A season, has posted personal single-month season highs with a .280 average, 21 hits, six doubles (tied for sixth in the Eastern League), two triples, 10 extra-base hits (tied for fifth), and 15 RBI (tied for fourth). Outfielder Mitch Longo, also playing his first Double-A season, has personal monthly bests of a .328 average (eighth in the league), 20 hits and a .408 on-base percentage (eighth). Shortstop Ernie Clement has 25 hits (tied for fifth). Catcher Logan Ice is hitting .316 in July - his best month of the season after hitting .122, .163 and .174 in the first three calendar months of the season.

Since the All-Star break: Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 3-11, but a few RubberDucks have posted number among the league leaders since the break. Trenton Brooks has six doubles (second in the EL) and eight extra-base hits (tied for fourth). Nolan Jones, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has scored 11 runs (tied for sixth). Ernie Clement has four stolen bases (tied for fourth).

League leaders: Akron leads the league in games (103), at-bats (3,416), hits (823), home runs (83) and total bases (1,278). The RubberDucks average 4.08 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 158 total runs in the last 47 games (3.36/game, 15-32 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 12 games (9-3).

Ducks visit Yard Goats: The RubberDucks and Yard Goats are playing the last of two scheduled series this season, with three games - which Akron swept - at Canal Park, and four at Dunkin' Donuts Park. Last season, Akron won the series, 4-3, including 2-2 in Hartford. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 52-38, and is 12-9 against the Hartford-based club. The RubberDucks are 2-5 at Dunkin' Donuts Park, which opened for the 2017 season. In 2018, Hartford finished third in the Eastern Division, at 65-72. The RubberDucks last won a series opener on June 11 against Hartford and have lost 11 straight series opener since then, dropping to 11-20 in series openers.

Road trip week: The RubberDucks are on their longest remaining road trip (seven games) to Trenton and Hartford. Akron lost two of three games in Trenton, where it also lost two of three games April 15-17 to the eventual Eastern Division first-half champion. The four-game series in Hartford is the RubberDucks' only visit to Hartford, whom Akron swept in a three-game series at Canal Park June 11-13. After the current road trip, the RubberDucks will play 20 of their final 33 games at Canal Park.

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones, ranked by Baseball America and MLB.com as the Indians No. 2 prospect, made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. He came within a double of the cycle and hit his first Double-A home run July 15, homered again July 16 and finished 6-for-13 with a triple, two home runs, four RBI and three runs in three games in Erie July 15-17. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also represented the Indians in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit an Eastern Leagueleading 83 home runs and allowed 73 (sixth-most in the EL) for a +10 home run differential. However, in 21 July games, Akron has allowed 26 home runs while hitting only 12 (-14 differential). In 53 road games, Akron has hit 53 home runs, allowing 39 (+14 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 83 home runs this season, 52 (63 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on Saturday, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league) among seven with doubledigit home run totals.

LAST OUTING (Friday, July 19, vs. Binghamton, W in 4-3 win):

Paulson was given a 1-0 lead in the first inning, but he allowed the tying run on a leadoff triple and groundout in the second inning. He scattered three more hits and two walks in the next three innings, stranding the bases loaded to end the fifth inning. Akron scored three runs in the bottom of the inning, and the bullpen allowed two runs in four innings for a 4-3 win.

2018

- . Made four April starts with Lynchburg (A-Adv) before his first Double-A promotion on May 3 to Akron, where he pitched the rest of the season
- Named Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star, the first All-Star selection of his pro career, led EL in ERA (3.04) and was 2nd in WHIP (1.18).
- Finished the year tied for the team lead in wins (8) and was second on the team in innings pitched (115.1) and strikeouts (91).
- Started Game 2 of the Eastern League Western Division Series against Altoona (ND, 7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 4 K), which the RubberDucks won on a 10th-inning walk-off home run by Nellie Rodriguez at Canal Park. Akron went on to win the series, 3-1.
- In Game 1 of the EL Championship Series against New Hampshire, he took over with two outs in the first inning from Indians rehabbing right-hander Cody Anderson and worked 7 innings (3 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 4 K), departing in a 1-1 tie in the eighth inning. The Fisher Cats won, 3-1 in 10 innings, before going on to a sweep of the RubberDucks.

2016

- Went on the Daytona Injured List on May 1 with right shoulder inflammation and was activated May 24.
- Spent three separate stints on the Injured List (also June 1-July 5 and July 16 through the end of the season).

2014

- Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 27th round of the June, 2014 draft, out of Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan.
- Was one of two players drafted (both by the Indians) from Oakland University. The other was catcher Jake Morton, who was a 39th-round pick but did not sign. Morton returned to Oakland for his senior season but did not play professionally.
- Only one player who attended Oakland University (MI) has reached the major leagues. Right-hander Don Kirkwood (at Oakland 1969-71) pitched five seasons with the California Angels (1974-77), Chicago White Sox (1977) and Toronto Blue Jays (1978).

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookielevel Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj
