Wednesday Recap: Fisher Cats walk past RubberDucks in ninth inning (New Hampshire 3, Akron 2): With consecutive two-out, basesloaded walks in the ninth inning by Akron right-hander Henry Martinez, the Fisher Cats tied and took the lead and completed a 3-2 win in front of 6,531 at Canal Park Wednesday afternoon. RubberDucks left-hander Sam Hentges struck out a season-high nine batters in five innings. The loss sealed Akron's season-high sixth straight home series loss.

Clement's strong return: Shortstop Ernie Clement has reached base in 28 of 30 games and hit safely in 25 of 30. Since returning from the Injured List on May 9, he has played 70 games, and has an Eastern Leagueleading 86 hits, going 86-for-282 (.305, third in the league) to reach second in the league with a .290 average with 25 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three triples, a home run, 38 runs, 19 RBI, 20 walks, a .356 OBP, and separate 13- and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (Baseball America)/No. 24 (MLB.com) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Call him the hottest hitter: RubberDucks outfielder Alex Call has a season-long eight-game hitting streak, in which he is 13-for-29 (.448) with three doubles, a triple, five runs, five RBI, three walks and a .457 OBP.

Midsummer warmups: While the RubberDucks went only 9-18 in July, a few players had notable success at the plate in the month. Outfielder Trenton Brooks, playing his first Double-A season, had personal singlemonth season highs with a .289 average, 28 hits, 11 doubles (tied for third in the Eastern League), two triples, 15 extra-base hits (tied for third), 49 total bases (tied for seventh), a .505 slugging percentage (seventh), .860 OPS (ninth) and 18 RBI (tied for second). Outfielder Mitch Longo, in his first Double-A season, had monthly bests of a .312 average (fifth in the league), 24 hits and a .393 OBP (fifth). Shortstop Ernie Clement had 32 hits (tied for seventh) and six stolen bases (tied for eighth). Catcher Logan Ice hit .271 in July - his best month after hitting .122, .163 and .174 in the first three calendar months of the season.

Since the All-Star break: Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 7-13, but a few RubberDucks have posted number among the league leaders since the break. Trenton Brooks has 11 doubles and 13 extrabase hits, both tied for the Eastern League lead. Nolan Jones, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has six doubles (tied for sixth), 10 extra-base hits (tied for seventh), 38 total bases (tied for ninth), 15 runs (tied for fourth), and a .529 slugging percentage (10th). Ernie Clement has six stolen bases (tied for fifth).

League leaders: Akron leads the league in at-bats (3,623), hits (885) and total bases (1,358). The RubberDucks average 4.15 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 190 total runs in the last 53 games (3.58/game, 19-34 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 16 games (13-3).

Ducks host Fisher Cats: In a rematch of the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series, which New Hampshire swept in three games, the RubberDucks and Fisher Cats are playing the first of two scheduled series this season, with three games this week at Canal Park, and three next week Northeast Delta Dental Stadium, where New Hampshire clinched the title last season. In the 2018 regular season, the teams split their six meetings, with the road team winning two of three each series. New Hampshire finished 76-62 in second place in the Eastern Division, then swept Trenton and Akron to win its first title since 2011. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 50-35. This six-game homestand begins a stretch where the RubberDucks play 20 of their final 33 games at Canal Park.

Notes on the sweep in Hartford: In four straight wins at Dunkin' Donuts Park last Thursday through Sunday, Akron scored six runs in four straight games for the first time since Aug. 31, 2017 at Harrisburg, and Sept. 1-3, 2017 at home against Erie. Akron's 7-0 regular season sweep of Hartford joined Harrisburg's 6-0 sweep of New Hampshire this season as the first two between any Eastern League clubs since 2013 (Altoona 7-0 vs. New Hampshire, Richmond 6-0 vs. Portland) and the first by Akron of any club since 2006 (6-0 vs. New Britain). The last time Akron was swept in a regular season series was 2008 (0-6 vs. New Britain).

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones, ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by Baseball America (entering 2019), made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also represented the Indians in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit just two home runs and allowed 14 in the past 14 games, but overall they have 84 home runs (third in the Eastern League) while allowing 75 (sixth-most in the EL) for a +9 home run differential. In 27 July games, Akron allowed 28 home runs while hitting only 13 (-15 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 84 home runs this season, 52 (62 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league) among seven with double-digit home run totals.

Paulson received a 3-0 lead entering the fourth inning, when Alan Trejo hit a leadoff double, and Mylz Jones hit an RBI single. With a 6-1 lead, Paulson allowed a run in the fifth inning. Despite allowing at least one hit each inning, Paulson went five innings for a sixth straight Double-A start, before scoreless relief by Chih-Wei Hu (3 IP) and Henry Martinez (1 IP).

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (First Season) - Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. #28 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (First Season) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookielevel Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj
