Friday Recap: Rumble Ponies rally past RubberDucks (Binghamton 3, Akron 2): After RubberDucks first baseman Nellie Rodriguez hit a two-run double in the second inning for a 2-0 Akron lead, the Rumble Ponies got a run in the fifth and two in the sixth on second baseman Luis Carpio's go-ahead double on the way to a 3-2 series-opening win in front of 6,971 at Canal Park Friday night. Akron left-hander Tanner Tully (6-9) pitched 6 2/3 innings in what was the RubberDucks' seventh straight loss in a home series opener. Akron has lost six straight home series and has not won consecutive home games since June 11-13 against Hartford.

<u>Ducks host Rumble Ponies</u>: As part of a stretch of 26 straight games against Eastern Division opponents July 18-Aug. 15, the RubberDucks and Rumble Ponies are playing the last of five scheduled series this season, with 10 games at Canal Park and seven at NYSEG Stadium. Binghamton has won each of the first four series and leads the season series, 11-4, including 6-2 in Akron. Last season, Akron went 10-3 against Binghamton, including 6-1 at Canal Park. In 2018, Binghamton finished fifth in the Eastern Division, at 64-76. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 118-92, winning eight, losing six (including this season), and tying one season series. Including the current six-game homestand ending Sunday, the RubberDucks play 20 of their final 33 games at Canal Park.

<u>Clement's strong return:</u> Shortstop Ernie Clement has reached base in 29 of 32 games and hit safely in 26 of 32. Since returning from the Injured List May 9, he has played 73 games and has an Eastern League-leading 88 hits (going hitless in consecutive games just twice), going 88-for-291 (.302, third in the league) to reach third in the league with a .288 average. The stretch includes 26 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three triples, a home run, 38 runs, 20 RBI, 20 walks, a .352 OBP, and separate 13- and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (*Baseball America*)/No. 26 (MLB.com) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

<u>League leaders:</u> Akron leads the league in at-bats (3,688), hits (900) and total bases (1,379) and are tied with Reading for the lead in games (111). The RubberDucks average 4.14 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 198 total runs in the last 55 games (3.60/game, 20-35 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 17 games (14-3).

Midsummer warmups: While Akron went 9-18 in July, a few players had notable success. Outfielder Trenton Brooks, playing his first Double-A season, had personal one-month season highs with a .289 average, 28 hits, 11 doubles (tied for third in the Eastern League), two triples, 15 extrabase hits (tied for third), 49 total bases (tied for seventh), a .505 SLG (seventh), .860 OPS (ninth) and 18 RBI (tied for second). Outfielder Mitch Longo, in his first Double-A season, had monthly bests of a .312 average (fifth in the league), 24 hits and a .393 OBP (fifth). Shortstop Ernie Clement had 32 hits (tied for seventh) and six stolen bases (tied for eighth). Catcher Logan Ice hit .271 in July – his best month after hitting .122, .163 and .174 in the first three calendar months of the season.

Hall of Fame Weekend: While the Pro Football Hall of Fame induction weekend is in Canton, the Greater Akron Baseball Hall of Fame will induct a class of 17 this weekend, with their ceremonial first pitch at Canal Park on Friday. Jim Clark, radio voice of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks since 1990, is receiving the "Speed" Bosworth Award for community service and contributions to baseball. Kent State alumnus and former RubberDuck outfielder Anthony Gallas played 2010-16 in the Indians system, including parts of four with Akron (.271, 28 HR, 93 RBI in 166 games). The Kent State Athletics Hall of Famer is the Flashes' career leader in RBI (224) and tied for the career lead in home runs (49). The induction will be Sunday night in a banquet at St. George Antiochian Orthodox Church in Copley. Since 1981, the Greater Akron Baseball Hall of Fame has honored Northeast Ohio individuals who make a major impact as players, coaches, managers, umpires, sponsors and administrators. <u>Since the All-Star break:</u> Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 8-14, but a few RubberDucks have posted number among the league leaders since the break. **Trenton Brooks** has 11 doubles and 13 extrabase hits, both tied for the Eastern League lead. **Nolan Jones**, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has six doubles (tied for eighth), 11 extra-base hits (tied for sixth), 42 total bases (ninth) and 16 runs (tied for third). **Ernie Clement** has six stolen bases (tied for fifth).

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones, ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by Baseball America (entering 2019), made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also represented the Indians in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit just three home runs and allowed 16 in the past 15 games, but overall they have 85 home runs (third in the Eastern League) while allowing 77 (sixth-most in the EL) for a +8 home run differential. Of the RubberDucks' 85 home runs this season, 52 (61 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league) among seven with double-digit home run totals.

LAST START (Sunday, July 28, at Hartford, ND in 9-4 win): Morgan allowed single runs in each of the first three innings, arising from two hits and two walks in the first inning, a walk and error in the second inning, and two hits and a walk in the third inning. With Akron's six-run second inning, Morgan departed with a 6-3 lead, and Ben Krauth began the fourth inning, starting a six-inning bullpen effort that yielded one run in the 9-4 victory, completing a four-game sweep in Hartford.

### Season Highlights

- Was Carolina League's first Pitcher of the Week for April 4-14, after 11 scoreless innings (3 H, 2 BB, 15 K), beginning two combined shutouts for Lynchburg (A-Adv).
- Began the season with 14 consecutive scoreless innings.
- Promoted to Akron for his first Double-A callup on May 6 and has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his first nine Eastern League starts.

### 2018

- Started Opening Day for Lake County (A), was promoted to Lynchburg (A-Adv) May 16, went 9-7 with a 3.21 ERA, 1.10 WHIP, 156 K in 143.1 IP across two levels.
- Earned Pitcher of the Week honors three times, once with Lake County (A) and twice with Lynchburg (A-Adv).
- For second straight year, named Best Changeup in Indians Farm System by Baseball America.
- MiLB.com Indians Organizational All-Star (RH starter). Indians Director of Player Development James Harris (to MiLB.com): "Eli is one of those pitchers who gets a lot of swings
  and misses with his changeup. It's a real weapon for him and he isn't shy about using it. The challenge for him will be continuing that success as he moves through the higher
  levels. We feel he's a starter, and that's how we'll approach things with him moving forward, but he's certainly rising up our board quickly."

2017: His 1.03 ERA was good for the 3rd-lowest mark in the New York-Penn League (min. 35.0IP), finished 2nd on Mahoning Valley with 58 strikeouts (14.91 K/9).

### Amateur/Personal

- Pitched three seasons at Gonzaga University, earning First Team All-American from Perfect Game/Rawlings and First Team All-West Coast Conference as a junior in 2017, when he was 10-2 with a 2.86 ERA and 138 strikeouts (second most in program history) in 100 2/3 innings across 14 starts.
- Pitched 14 games (3 starts) as a freshman in 2015, but went 20-5 with 7 complete games and 5 shutouts over 30 starts his sophomore and junior seasons.
- Pitched for four years at Palos Verdes Peninsula High School in Rolling Hills, California.
- Father, Dave Morgan, is the former president of USA Today Sports Media Group, former executive editor for Yahoo Sports, and former deputy sports editor for the L.A. Times, where he spent more than 20 years. In 2008, Dave was named one of the "100 Most Influential People in Sports" by BusinessWeek, a list including commissioners from all the major North American sports leagues, influential team owners and broadcast and digital network executives.

## 2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

**#24 Rouglas Odor**, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach** (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24** 

**#28 Juan De La Cruz**, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.
