Sunday Recap: RubberDucks shut out Rumble Ponies again (Akron 5, Binghamton 0): In his Indians organizational debut, left-hander Scott Moss (1-0) pitched five scoreless innings, before right-handers Kyle Dowdy and Argenis Angulo each pitched two scoreless frames to complete a three-hit shutout and 5-0 win over Binghamton in front of 4,985 at Canal Park on Sunday afternoon. The rubber match win snapped the RubberDucks' six-series losing streak at home and marked their first consecutive home wins since sweeping Hartford June 11-13. Akron's second straight shutout extended the pitching staff's 21 -inning scoreless streak, matching its longest of the season. Its 13 shutouts are tied for second most in the Eastern League.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 75 games and has an Eastern League-leading 89 hits (going hitless in consecutive games just twice), going 89-for-299 (.298, fourth in the league) to reach sixth in the league with a .284 average. The stretch includes 26 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three triples, a home run, 38 runs, 20 RBI, 20 walks, a .347 OBP, and separate 13-and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (Baseball America)/No. 26 (MLB.com) prospect was 3 -for-25 (.120).

Marabell is a mainstay: RubberDucks outfielder and first baseman Connor Marabell had three consecutive two-hit games in three straight games. Playing in the Eastern League for a third straight season, he has appeared in a team-high 101 games and leads Akron in at bats (383), runs (49), hits (102, tied for sixth in the Eastern League) and total bases (149). He has also appeared for Columbus (AAA) for a third straight season, going 0 -for-12 in three games June 4-7. Since he returned to the Akron lineup June 11, he is seventh in the league with a .294 batting average and has gone hitless in consecutive games twice.

Since the All-Star break: Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 10-14, but a few RubberDucks have posted number among the league leaders since the break. Trenton Brooks has 11 doubles and 14 extrabase hits, both tied for the league lead. Nolan Jones, called up to DoubleA for the first time during the break, has six doubles (tied for ninth), 11 extra-base hits (tied for seventh), 43 total bases (tied for 10th) and 19 runs (tied for second). Ernie Clement has seven stolen bases (tied for seventh). Jake Paulson has three wins (tied for first), and Dalbert Siri has five saves (tied for fourth) in nine appearances (tied for third).

League leaders: Akron leads the league in at-bats $(3,744)$ and hits $(911)$ and are tied with Reading for the lead in games (113). The RubberDucks average 4.14 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 206 total runs in the last 57 games (3.61/game, 22-35 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 18 games (15-3).

Ducks visit Fisher Cats: As part of a stretch of 26 straight games against Eastern Division opponents July 18-Aug. 15, the RubberDucks and Fisher Cats are playing the last of two scheduled series this season. In a rematch of the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series, which New Hampshire swept in three games, the Fisher Cats won two of three games at Canal Park last week. This three-game series at Northeast Delta Dental Stadium is where New Hampshire clinched the title last season. In the 2018 regular season, the teams split their six meetings, with the road team winning two of three each series. New Hampshire finished 76-62 in second place in the Eastern Division, then swept Trenton and Akron to win its first title since 2011. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 51-35.

Midsummer warmups: While Akron went 9-18 in July, a few players had notable success. Outfielder Trenton Brooks, playing his first Double-A season, had personal one-month season highs with a .289 average, 28 hits, 11 doubles (tied for third in the Eastern League), two triples, 15 extrabase hits (tied for third), 49 total bases (tied for seventh), a . 505 SLG (seventh), 860 OPS (ninth) and 18 RBI (tied for second). Outfielder Mitch Longo, in his first Double-A season, had monthly bests of a .312 average (fifth in the league), 24 hits and a . 393 OBP (fifth). Shortstop Ernie Clement had 32 hits (tied for seventh) and six stolen bases (tied for eighth). Catcher Logan Ice hit . 271 in July - his best month after hitting .122, . 163 and .174 in the first three calendar months of the season.

[^0]Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit just three home runs and allowed 16 in the past 17 games, but overall they have 85 home runs (third in the Eastern League) while allowing 77 (sixth-most in the EL) for a +8 home run differential. Of the RubberDucks' 85 home runs this season, 52 (61 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league) among seven with double-digit home run totals.

## 2019 RUBBERRDUCHS FIELD STAFF

\#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (First Season) - Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.
\#27 Tony Arnold, Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.
\#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) - Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including . 275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron.
