Tuesday Recap: Fisher Cats shut out RubberDucks (New Hampshire 7, Akron 0): New Hampshire right-hander Justin Dillon (4-2) held Akron hitless for five innings and pitched six scoreless innings, combining with two relievers on a three-hit shutout and 7-0 series-opening win over the RubberDucks at Northeast Delta Dental Stadium on Tuesday night. Akron left-hander Adam Scott (4-2) allowed four runs - three earned - in five innings, his shortest of nine Eastern League starts. The Akron pitching staff's season-long 22-inning scoreless streak ended in the second inning. The shutout loss was Akron's 11th of the season.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 76 games and has 89 hits (going hitless in consecutive games just three times, including the past two games), tied for the Eastern League lead. In that span, he is 89-for-303 (.294, fourth in EL) to reach seventh in the league with a .280 average. The stretch includes 26 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three triples, a home run, 38 runs, 20 RBI, 20 walks, a .342 OBP, and separate 13- and 14game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (Baseball America)/No. 26 (MLB.com) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Marabell is a mainstay: RubberDucks outfielder and first baseman Connor Marabell is playing in the Eastern League for a third straight season, has appeared in a team-high 102 games and leads Akron in at bats (387), runs (49), hits (102, tied for sixth in the Eastern League) and total bases (149). He has also appeared for Columbus (AAA) for a third straight season, going 0-for-12 in three games June 4-7. Since he returned to the Akron lineup June 11, he is ninth in the league with a .287 batting average and has gone hitless in consecutive games twice.

Since the All-Star break: Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 10-15, but a few Rubber Ducks have posted number among the league leaders since the break. Trenton Brooks has a league-high 12 doubles and 15 extra-base hits, tied for the EL lead. Nolan Jones, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has six doubles (tied for ninth), 11 extra-base hits (tied for seventh) and 19 runs (tied for second). Ernie Clement has seven stolen bases (tied for seventh). Jake Paulson has three wins (tied for first), and Dalbert Siri has five saves (tied for fourth) in nine appearances (tied for fourth).

League leaders: Akron leads the league in at-bats (3,774) and hits (914) and are tied with Reading for the lead in games (114). The RubberDucks average 4.11 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 206 total runs in the last 58 games (3.55/game, 22-36 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 18 games (15-3).

When the RubberDucks meet the road: Akron has been better statistically on the road than at Canal Park by the following offensive measures: average (.253 vs. .230), R/G (4.71 vs. 3.48), HR/G (0.93 vs. 0.55), OBP (.316 vs. .303), SLG (.403 vs. .334), OPS (.719 vs. .637).

Ducks visit Fisher Cats: As part of a stretch of 26 straight games against Eastern Division opponents July 18-Aug. 15, the RubberDucks and Fisher Cats are playing the last of two scheduled series this season. In a rematch of the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series, which New Hampshire swept in three games, the Fisher Cats won two of three games at Canal Park last week. This three-game series at Northeast Delta Dental Stadium is where New Hampshire clinched the title last season. In the 2018 regular season, the teams split their six meetings, with the road team winning two of three each series. New Hampshire finished 76-62 in second place in the Eastern Division, then swept Trenton and Akron to win its first title since 2011. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 51-36.

Midsummer warmups: While Akron went 9-18 in July, a few players had notable success. Outfielder Trenton Brooks, playing his first Double-A season, had personal one-month season highs with a .289 average, 28 hits, 11 doubles (tied for third in the Eastern League), two triples, 15 extrabase hits (tied for third), 49 total bases (tied for seventh), a .505 SLG (seventh), .860 OPS (ninth) and 18 RBI (tied for second). Outfielder Mitch Longo, in his first Double-A season, had monthly bests of a .312 average (fifth in the league), 24 hits and a .393 OBP (fifth). Shortstop Ernie Clement had 32 hits (tied for seventh) and six stolen bases (tied for eighth). Catcher Logan Ice hit .271 in July - his best month after hitting .122, .163 and .174 in the first three calendar months of the season.

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones, ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by Baseball America (entering 2019), made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also played in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit just three home runs and allowed 17 in the past 18 games, but overall they have 85 home runs (third in the Eastern League) while allowing 78 (sixth-most in the EL) for a +7 home run differential. In 58 road games, the RubberDucks have hit a league-high 54 home runs, while allowing 41 (+13 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 85 home runs this season, 52 (61 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league) among seven with double-digit home run totals.

#### LAST START (Wednesday, July 31, vs. New Hampshire, ND in 3-2 loss):

Hentges struck out seven straight batters from the first to third innings, becoming Akron's first pitcher to do so in a single appearance this season. The RubberDucks took a 2-0 lead in the fourth inning, and Hentges allowed a fifth-inning run on Santiago Espinal's RBI single. The 2-1 lead remained until two outs in the ninth inning, when Henry Martinez allowed bases-loaded walks to score the tying and go-ahead runs of the Fisher Cats' 3-2 win.

#### Season Highlights

- In May, had the eighth-best ERA (2.38), eighth-most innings (34) and tied for the fifth-most strikeouts (35) in the Eastern League.
- Entered the season ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the Indians system by Baseball America and No. 10 by MLB.com (both as top left-handed pitcher).
- Added to the Indians 40-man roster Nov. 20, and made his first two career major league spring training appearances, with two scoreless, hitless starts for the Indians Feb. 26 at Colorado (W, 1.0 IP, 0 BB, 0 K) and March 3 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 1 BB, 3 K).

### **2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF**

**#24 Rouglas Odor**, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach** (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24** 

**#28 Juan De La Cruz**, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookielevel Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

**Paul Synenkyj**, *Strength and Conditioning Coach* (*Third Season*) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter:** @PaulSynenkyj
