Thursday Recap: RubberDucks beat Fisher Cats, win consecutive series (Akron 5, New Hampshire 1): RubberDucks left-hander Tanner Tully (7-9) allowed one run in 5 1/3 innings, and center fielder Alex Call hit a go-ahead RBI single and threw out the potential tying run at home plate to lead a 5-1 rubber match victory over New Hampshire at Northeast Delta Dental Stadium on Thursday afternoon, giving Akron its first consecutive series wins of the season, both overall and on the road.

Picking up the pace: The RubberDucks have won 10 of their last 15 games and three of their last four series. In that span, they have scored 64 runs (4.27/game) and allowed 39 (2.60/game), for a +25 differential. However, the RubberDucks have hit just three home runs (two by Nolan Jones and one by Connor Marabell), while allowing seven homers.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 77 games and has 90 hits (going hitless in consecutive games just three times), which leads the Eastern League lead. In that span, he is 90-for-308 (.292, fourth in EL) to reach eighth in the league with a .279 average. The stretch includes 26 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three triples, a home run, 39 runs, 20 RBI, 20 walks, a .340 OBP, and separate 13- and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (Baseball America)/No. 26 (MLB.com) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Marabell is a mainstay: RubberDucks outfielder and first baseman Connor Marabell is playing in the Eastern League for a third straight season, has appeared in a team-high 104 games and leads Akron in at bats (394), runs (50), hits (104, tied for sixth in the Eastern League) and total bases (151). He has also appeared for Columbus (AAA) for a third straight season, going 0-for-12 in three games June 4-7. Since he returned to the Akron lineup June 11, he is ninth in the league with a .288 batting average and has gone hitless in consecutive games just twice.

Since the All-Star break: Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 12-15, but a few RubberDucks have posted number among the league leaders since the break. Trenton Brooks has a league-high 12 doubles and 15 extra-base hits, second in the EL. Nolan Jones, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has scored 20 runs (tied for third). Ernie Clement has seven stolen bases (tied for seventh). Jake Paulson has three wins (tied for first), Sam Hentges has 30 strikeouts (tied for sixth) and Dalbert Siri has five saves (fifth) in 10 appearances (tied for fourth).

League leaders: Akron leads the league in at-bats (3,797) and hits (928) while striking out the least of any club (970). The RubberDucks average 4.09 runs per game this season, but since June 5, they have scored 213 total runs in the last 60 games (3.55/game, 24-36 W-L), scoring 5 or more in 19 games (16-3).

Ducks visit Sea Dogs: As part of a stretch of 26 straight games against Eastern Division opponents July 18-Aug. 15, The RubberDucks and Sea Dogs are playing the last of two scheduled series this season, with three games at Canal Park (Portland swept June 14-16) and three at Hadlock Field. Last season, they split the series, 3-3, but Akron went 2-1 in Portland. The Sea Dogs finished in sixth place in the Eastern Division, at 63-76, last season, and last made the playoffs in 2014. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 57-32. According to Baseball America (pre-2019) and MLB.com (July 2019), prospects in this series include:

When the RubberDucks meet the road: Akron has been better statistically on the road than at Canal Park by the following offensive measures: average (.253 vs. .230), R/G (4.67 vs. 3.48), HR/G (0.90 vs. 0.55), OBP (.316 vs. .303), SLG (.400 vs. .334), OPS (.716 vs. .637).

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones, ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by Baseball America (entering 2019), made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season, A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also played in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit just three home runs and allowed 17 in the past 20 games, but overall they have 85 home runs (fifth in the Eastern League) while allowing 78 (sixth-most in the EL) for a +7 home run differential. In 60 road games, the RubberDucks have hit a league-high 54 home runs, while allowing 41, which are sixth-most (+13 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 85 home runs this season, 52 (61 percent) have come in 19 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league) among seven with double-digit home run totals.

LAST START (Saturday, Aug. 3, vs. Binghamton, W in 3-0 win): Morgan worked around a walk and single in the first inning, a single and error in the fourth inning, and consecutive singles in the fifth inning, only allowing one runner to reach third base. Akron scored once in the fourth and twice in the sixth to give Morgan his first victory since June 13.

Season Highlights

- Was Carolina League's first Pitcher of the Week for April 4-14, after 11 scoreless innings (3 H, 2 BB, 15 K), beginning two combined shutouts for Lynchburg (A-Adv).
- Began the season with 14 consecutive scoreless innings.
- Promoted to Akron for his first Double-A callup on May 6 and allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his first nine Eastern League starts.

- Started Opening Day for Lake County (A), was promoted to Lynchburg (A-Adv) May 16, went 9-7 with a 3.21 ERA, 1.10 WHIP, 156 K in 143.1 IP across two levels.
- Earned Pitcher of the Week honors three times, once with Lake County (A) and twice with Lynchburg (A-Adv).
- For second straight year, named Best Changeup in Indians Farm System by Baseball America.
- MiLB.com Indians Organizational All-Star (RH starter). Indians Director of Player Development James Harris (to MiLB.com): "Eli is one of those pitchers who gets a lot of swings and misses with his changeup. It's a real weapon for him and he isn't shy about using it. The challenge for him will be continuing that success as he moves through the higher levels. We feel he's a starter, and that's how we'll approach things with him moving forward, but he's certainly rising up our board quickly."

2017: His 1.03 ERA was good for the 3rd-lowest mark in the New York-Penn League (min. 35.0IP), finished 2nd on Mahoning Valley with 58 strikeouts (14.91 K/9).

- Pitched three seasons at Gonzaga University, earning First Team All-American from Perfect Game/Rawlings and First Team All-West Coast Conference as a junior in 2017, when he was 10-2 with a 2.86 ERA and 138 strikeouts (second most in program history) in 100 2/3 innings across 14 starts.
- Pitched 14 games (3 starts) as a freshman in 2015, but went 20-5 with 7 complete games and 5 shutouts over 30 starts his sophomore and junior seasons.

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 60, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 26, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (*Third Season*) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**
