A few rehabs: Two-time Cy Young Award winner and Cleveland Indians right-hander Corey Kluber (currently on the 60-day Injured List) makes his second rehab start (first with the RubberDucks) on Tuesday – his second career rehab start at Canal Park, where he pitched five one-hit, shutout innings against Bowie in a 10-0 win in front of 7,707 on May 26, 2017. Returning from a right ulna fracture suffered May 1 from a line drive by Miami's Brian Anderson at Marlins Park, Kluber made his first rehab start Thursday for Triple-A Columbus (3 IP, 2 H, 2 HR, 2 ER, 1 BB, 2 K, 41 pitches, 24 strikes). Indians left-hander Tyler Olson (10-day IL since Aug. 2, non-baseball medical condition) and right-hander Dan Otero (60-day IL since May 31, right shoulder inflammation) are also scheduled to make rehab appearances Tuesday. Otero made two appearances for Akron July 18 and July 20 (2 IP, 4 H, 3 HR, 3 ER, 1 K).

<u>Sunday Recap: Sea Dogs chase RubberDucks out of town in rubber match (Portland 3, Akron 2):</u> Portland Sea Dogs left-hander Daniel McGrath held the RubberDucks to two runs - one earned - in six innings, and shortstop C.J. Chatham, the Eastern League's leading hitter, hit the deciding double in the sixth inning to give the home team a 3-2 rubber match victory at Hadlock Field on Sunday afternoon. It snapped Akron's two-series winning streak after winning two previous rubber matches.

<u>Picking up the pace:</u> The RubberDucks have won 11 of their last 18 games and three of their last five series. In that span, they have scored 77 runs (4.27/game) and allowed 50 (2.78/game), for a +27 differential. The RubberDucks hit one home run Friday and three home runs Saturday in Portland after hitting just three (two by **Nolan Jones**, one by **Connor Marabell**) the previous 20 games.

Clement's strong return: Since returning from the Injured List May 9, shortstop Ernie Clement has played 80 games and has 90 hits, tied for third in the Eastern League, although for the first time in that stretch, he is now hitless in three straight games and five of the last six. Since May 9, he is 90-for-319 (.282, sixth in EL). The stretch includes 26 multi-hit games, 10 doubles, three triples, a home run, 39 runs, 21 RBI, 21 walks, a .330 OBP, and separate 13- and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (Baseball America)/No. 26 (MLB.com) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Marabell is a mainstay: RubberDucks outfielder and first baseman Connor Marabell has five multi-hit games and seven RBI over his last nine games. Playing in the Eastern League for a third straight season, Marabell has appeared in a team-high 107 games and leads Akron in at bats (405), hits (109, sixth in the EL), total bases (158), runs (51) and RBI (49). He has also appeared for Columbus (AAA) for a third straight season, going 0-for-12 in three games June 4-7. Since he returned to the Akron lineup June 11, he is sixth in the league with a .296 batting average, tied for eighth with 59 hits and has gone hitless in consecutive games just twice.

<u>Ducks host Thunder:</u> For their final interdivision series and last of 26 straight games against the Eastern Division, the RubberDucks and Thunder are playing their fourth series this season, with six games each at Canal Park and ARM & HAMMER Park. Trenton leads the season series, 6-3, winning two of three in each of the first three. Last season, Akron went 5-4 against Trenton, including 1-2 at ARM & HAMMER Park. In 2018, Trenton finished first in the Eastern Division, at 79-61, before losing in the divisional round to eventual league champion New Hampshire. The Thunder's Eastern Division first-half championship (via a tiebreaker with Reading) clinched its fourth straight postseason berth. Trenton last won the Eastern League title in 2013 but has lost in the Championship Series four times since 2010 (including to Akron in 2012 and 2016).

<u>Since the All-Star break:</u> Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 13-17, but a few RubberDucks have posted number among the league leaders since the break. **Trenton Brooks** has 13 doubles (second in the league), 18 extra-base hits (tied for second), 56 total bases (seventh), a .533 SLG (sixth) and .886 OPS (seventh). **Nolan Jones**, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has scored 23 runs (tied for second). **Ernie Clement** has eight stolen bases (tied for sixth). **Jake Paulson** has three wins (tied for fifth), and **Dalbert Siri** has five saves (tied for fifth) in 11 appearances (tied for fifth).

<u>Jones arrives in Double-A:</u> Third baseman **Nolan Jones**, ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by *Baseball America* (entering 2019), made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the league in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also played in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit seven home runs and allowed 20 in the past 23 games, but overall they have 89 home runs (fourth in the Eastern League) while allowing 81 (sixth-fewest in the EL) for a +8 home run differential. In 62 road games, the RubberDucks have hit 31 home runs (fourth fewest), while allowing 37, tied for the fourth fewest (-6 differential). Of the RubberDucks' 89 home runs this season, 55 (62 percent) have come in 20 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its most since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league). Current Trenton manager Pat Osborn (10 homers) was among seven Aeros with double-digit home run totals.

2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 60, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, *Bench Coach* (*First Season*) — De La Cruz, 26, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (*Third Season*) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World.**" Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "the 'Ducks" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
