Friday Recap: RubberDucks walk off Flying Squirrels again (Akron 4, Richmond 3, 10 innings): RubberDucks designated hitter Trenton Brooks hit a walk-off RBI double in the 10th inning to lead Akron to a 4-3 series-opening over Richmond in front 7,411 at Canal Park on Friday night. The RubberDucks earned their fifth walk-off win of the season and third over Richmond, which has played five straight extra-inning games and six in their last seven contests. Akron has played three straight extra-inning games, matching its longest streak of the season.

Bradley Zimmer rehab: Cleveland Indians outfielder Bradley Zimmer, on the 60-day Injured List, is playing his fourth rehab game with the RubberDucks on Saturday. He homered on Friday and is 4-for-10 with two doubles and three strikeouts in his first three rehab games. Zimmer suffered a right shoulder injury during pre-game batting drills in Columbus on June 11, 2018, and had season-ending arthroscopic right shoulder surgery on July 20, 2018, to repair a torn labrum, with rehab from the procedure back to full baseball activities expected to be 8-12 months. He appeared in five Arizona League games Aug. 11-18 (4-for-8, 1 HR, 2 RBI).

<u>Jefry Rodriguez rehab:</u> Cleveland Indians pitcher Jefry Rodriguez, on the 60-day Injured List with a right shoulder strain, pitched his first game with Akron on a rehab assignment on Tuesday (1.2 IP, 1 HR, 1 K, 18 pitches) and is scheduled to pitch again in relief on Saturday. Rodriguez has made eight major league starts this season and made an Aug. 16 rehab appearance (1 IP, 1 BB, 1 K) in the AZL. With Rodriguez, all three players acquired in the Nov. 30, 2018, Yan Gomes trade with Washington (also outfielder Daniel Johnson, infielder Andruw Monasterio) will have appeared for Akron this season.

<u>Since the All-Star break:</u> Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 17-24, but a few RubberDucks have posted numbers among the league leaders since the break. **Trenton Brooks** leads the league with 26 extrabase hits and 19 doubles, and he has 42 hits (10th), 80 total bases (third), a .537 slugging percentage (third) and .882 OPS (third). **Nolan Jones**, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has seven home runs (tied for sixth), 23 walks (tied for second) and 30 runs (tied for second). **Ernie Clement** has nine stolen bases (tied for seventh). **Jake Paulson** has five wins (tied for the lead). **Sam Hentges** has 41 strikeouts (tied for sixth). **Dalbert Siri** has six saves (tied for sixth) in 15 appearances (tied for fifth).

Gonzalez warms up to the EL: Outfielder Oscar Gonzalez, promoted to Akron on Aug. 1, hit safely in nine of 12 games Aug. 6-19, including a sixgame hitting streak Aug. 6-13 (8-for-22, three doubles, a home run, five runs and five RBI) after going hitless in his first three Eastern League games (0-for-10). Gonzalez is hitless in his last 10 at bats, but in two of the games, he has been a late substitution after Zimmer's exit. The Carolina League All-Star left Lynchburg with a league-best .319 average, 123 hits and 175 total bases. He had eight home runs, 61 RBI (fourth), 33 extra-base hits (sixth), .455 SLG (fifth) and .797 OPS (second).

RubberDucks host Flying Squirrels: The RubberDucks and Flying Squirrels are playing the last of three scheduled intradivision four-game series this season, with eight games at Canal Park and four at The Diamond Each of the first two series were four-game splits. Last season, Akron went 11-5 against Richmond, including 6-2 at Canal Park. In 2018, the Flying Squirrels finished in sixth place in the Western Division, at 62-76 overall. Since Richmond joined the league in 2010, Akron leads the series, 58-55. According to Baseball America (pre-2019) and MLB.com (July 2019), top prospects in this series include:

<u>Clement's strong return:</u> Since returning from the Injured List May 9, shortstop <u>Ernie Clement</u> has 95 hits (tied for sixth in the Eastern League). Since May 9, he is 95-for-345 (.275, seventh in EL). That includes 27 multi-hit games, 12 doubles, three triples, a home run (at Erie in his first game back), 42 runs, 22 RBI, 23 walks, a .326 OBP, and separate 13-and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the IL with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (*Baseball America*)/No. 26 (MLB.com) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones has seven home runs in 39 Eastern League games (tied for sixth in the EL since July 11). Ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by Baseball America (entering 2019), he made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the CL in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also played in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

Flying out of the park: The RubberDucks have hit 13 home runs over the past 13 games after hitting just three in the previous 20 games. In the past 33 games, Akron has 16 home runs while allowing 30. Overall, the RubberDucks have 98 home runs (tied for third in the Eastern League) while allowing 90 (tied for fifth fewest in the EL) for a +7 home run differential. Of Akron's 98 home runs this season, 59 (60 percent) have come in 22 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its most since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros. The last season Akron led the Eastern League in home runs was 2005, when the Aeros hit 151, led by Jonathan Van Every's 27 (tied for second in the league).

LAST START (Monday, August 19, vs. Harrisburg, L in 7-4 loss): Hentges allowed a second-inning run on two hits, but Akron tied the game in the bottom of the inning. In the fifth, following a one-out walk, he fielded a ground ball off the pitcher's mound, but neither middle infielder was at second base in time for an out. A go-ahead RBI single, stolen base, intentional walk, two-run single and walk ended his outing. David Speer allowed a two-run double that capped the five-run inning and the difference in a 7-4 Harrisburg win.

Season Highlights

- In May, had the eighth-best ERA (2.38), eighth-most innings (34) and tied for the fifth-most strikeouts (35) in the Eastern League.
- Entered the season ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the Indians system by Baseball America and No. 10 by MLB.com (both as top left-handed pitcher).
- Added to the Indians 40-man roster Nov. 20, and made his first two career major league spring training appearances, with two scoreless, hitless starts for the Indians Feb. 26 at Colorado (W, 1.0 IP, 0 BB, 0 K) and March 3 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 1 BB, 3 K).

2018:

- Finished second in ERA (3.27) and third in strikeouts (122) in the Carolina League, Mid-Season Carolina League All-Star, MiLB.com organizational All-Star.
- Did not pitch after August 15 due to a left shoulder strain, but his final start was his best, Aug. 15 at Wilmington (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 7SO).
- Over his final 12 starts of the season he posted an ERA of 2.69 (19ER/63.2IP).
- Recorded four starts of at least 6.0 innings and zero runs allowed and fanned 10 on April 17 vs. Frederick.

2017: Began season July 8 with six rehab starts in the Arizona League before being activated at Mahoning Valley on 8/9, finishing the season with five starts (2.04 ERA).

2016: Limited to 14 starts for Lake County (A) due to a left elbow strain, did not pitch after June 23...had left elbow reconstruction (Tommy John surgery) in July.

2015: Led AZL Indians with 59 strikeouts, third-most in the league.

2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#27 Tony Arnold, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 60, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

#28 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (First Season) — De La Cruz, 26, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj
