## **Wednesday Recap: Brady pitches Curve past former club in win over RubberDucks (Altoona 8, Akron 1):**

Former Akron RubberDucks left-hander Sean Brady (5-12), released by the Cleveland Indians earlier this season, held his former club to one run in seven innings, and the Altoona Curve scored eight unanswered runs over the third through fifth innings on the way to an 8-1 victory and third straight win at Peoples Natural Gas Field on Wednesday night. Akron seeks to avoid being swept in a four-game series for the first time since Altoona won four in the season-opening set April 4-7 at Canal Park. Akron's was last swept in a four-game road series Aug. 18-20 (doubleheader Aug. 19), 2017, in Richmond.

## **Danny Salazar rehab:**

Cleveland Indians right-hander **Danny Salazar** (currently on the 10-day Injured List) made his fourth Double-A rehab appearance and second of the week with the RubberDucks on Wednesday, allowing three earned runs on three hits and two walks in two-thirds of a relief inning. Salazar was placed on the Injured List for the entire 2018 regular season with right shoulder rotator cuff tendonitis. This season, he made six rehab starts between June 30 and July 27 – two each with the Arizona League Indians (Rookie), Akron and Columbus (Triple-A) – before starting for Cleveland on Thursday, Aug. 1, against Houston at Progressive Field. He was placed on the Injured List with a right groin strain after that start, which was his first appearance in the major leagues since the 2017 American League Division Series.

**Since the All-Star break:** Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 19-27, but a few RubberDucks have posted numbers among the league leaders since the break. **Trenton Brooks** leads the league with 28 extra-base hits and 21 doubles. He is second with 85 total bases and a .518 slugging percentage, and third with an .855 OPS. **Nolan Jones**, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has seven home runs (tied for seventh), 26 walks (third) and 30 runs (tied for third). **Ernie Clement** has nine stolen bases (tied for eighth). **Jake Paulson** has five wins (tied for the lead). **Sam Hentges** has 45 strikeouts (tied for fifth). **Dalbert Siri** has six saves (tied for ninth) in 16 appearances (tied for sixth).

**Longo finding a groove:** RubberDucks outfielder **Mitch Longo** has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games, going 14-for-47 (.298) with six runs, three doubles and a home run in that span. Since July 1, his .289 batting average is eighth in the Eastern League. Longo is third on the club in walks (29) and second in stolen bases (11).

**Gonzalez warms up to the EL:** Outfielder **Oscar Gonzalez**, promoted to Akron on Aug. 1, has five hits in his last five games. He also hit safely in nine of 12 games Aug. 6-19, including a six-game hitting streak Aug. 6-13 (8-for-22, three doubles, a home run, five runs and five RBI) after going hitless in his first three EL games (0-for-10). The Carolina League All-Star left Lynchburg with a CL-best .319 average, 123 hits and 175 total bases. He had eight home runs, 61 RBI (fourth), 33 extra-base hits (sixth), .455 SLG (fifth) and .797 OPS (second).

**RubberDucks visit Curve:** The RubberDucks and Curve are playing the last of five scheduled series this season, with seven games at Canal Park and 11 at Peoples Natural Gas Field. Altoona leads the series, 13-4, winning six of seven games at Canal Park and seven of 10 games in Altoona. Last season, Altoona won the series, 13-10, for the first time since 2010, including 7-3 in Altoona, although Akron won the Western Division playoff series, three games to one. Altoona finished first in the Eastern Division, at 78-60, by one game over Akron (78-62) last season. Since 2005, Akron leads the series, 173-144, and has won 10, lost three, and tied two season series. According to *Baseball America* (pre-2019) and MLB.com (July 2019), top prospects in this series include:

**Clement's strong return:** Since returning from the Injured List May 9, shortstop **Ernie Clement** has 100 hits (seventh in the Eastern League). Since May 9, he is 100-for-364 (.275, seventh in EL). That includes 29 multi-hit games, 13 doubles, three triples, a home run (at Erie in his first game back), 43 runs, 24 RBI, 24 walks, a .327 OBP, and separate 13- and 14-game hitting streaks. He was on the IL with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 18 (*Baseball America*)/No. 26 (MLB.com) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120).

**Jones arrives in Double-A:** Third baseman **Nolan Jones** has seven home runs in 44 Eastern League games (tied for seventh in the EL since July 11). Ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by *Baseball America* (entering 2019), he made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the CL in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also played in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat.

**Flying out of the park:** The RubberDucks have hit 14 home runs over the past 19 games after hitting just three in the previous 20 games. In the past 39 games, Akron has 17 home runs while allowing 32. Overall, the RubberDucks have 99 home runs (fourth in the Eastern League) while allowing 93 (tied for fourth fewest in the EL) for a +6 home run differential. In road games, the RubberDucks have hit 60 home runs (second-most in the EL) and allowed 48 (tied for fourth-most), for a +12 differential. Of Akron's 99 home runs this season, 59 (60 percent) have come in 22 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its most since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros.

# RUBBERDUCKS STARTING PITCHER

**#33 Sam Hentges...LHP, 6-8, 245, Age 23 (7/18/96), Resides: Shoreview, MN** *Member of Indians 40-man roster*

**LAST START (Saturday, August 24, vs. Richmond, ND in 2-0 win):** Hentges allowed baserunners in four of the first five innings. He worked around two singles and a walk in the first inning with two runners caught stealing. He stranded a runner at third base with consecutive strikeouts to end the second inning. He walked two batters each in the fourth and fifth innings before left-hander David Speer relieved him with two outs in the fifth. Speer got the last out before Akron scored both of its runs in an eventual 2-0 victory.

## Season Highlights

- In May, had the eighth-best ERA (2.38), eighth-most innings (34) and tied for the fifth-most strikeouts (35) in the Eastern League.
- Entered the season ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the Indians system by *Baseball America* and No. 10 by MLB.com (both as top left-handed pitcher).
- Added to the Indians 40-man roster Nov. 20, and made his first two career major league spring training appearances, with two scoreless, hitless starts for the Indians – Feb. 26 at Colorado (W, 1.0 IP, 0 BB, 0 K) and March 3 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 1 BB, 3 K).

## 2018:

- Finished second in ERA (3.27) and third in strikeouts (122) in the Carolina League, Mid-Season Carolina League All-Star, *MiLB.com* organizational All-Star.
- Did not pitch after August 15 due to a left shoulder strain, but his final start was his best, Aug. 15 at Wilmington (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 7SO).
- Over his final 12 starts of the season he posted an ERA of 2.69 (19ER/63.2IP).
- Recorded four starts of at least 6.0 innings and zero runs allowed and fanned 10 on April 17 vs. Frederick.

**2017:** Began season July 8 with six rehab starts in the Arizona League before being activated at Mahoning Valley on 8/9, finishing the season with five starts (2.04 ERA).

**2016:** Limited to 14 starts for Lake County (A) due to a left elbow strain, did not pitch after June 23...had left elbow reconstruction (Tommy John surgery) in July.

**2015:** Led AZL Indians with 59 strikeouts, third-most in the league.

# 2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

**#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (First Season)**— Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

**#27 Tony Arnold, Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive)**— Arnold, 60, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season)**— Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**
