**Friday Recap: SeaWolves stave off elimination with ninth-inning rally over Ducks (Erie 3, Akron 2):** Erie third baseman Kody Eaves hit a twoout, game-tying double in the ninth inning and then scored on left fielder Cam Gibson's go-ahead single in the SeaWolves 3-2 comeback win over the RubberDucks that kept Erie from elimination in the Western Division second-half race in front of 7,275 at Canal Park on Friday night. Akron left-hander **Tanner Tully** matched a season long with a seven-inning, one-run start, and right fielder **Trenton Brooks** hit a fourth-inning, two-run home run (Akron's 100th of the season) for a 2-1 lead that remained until the ninth inning, but right-hander **Dalbert Siri** (2-2) blew his first save in nine chances since June 2 (also against Erie). Akron on Saturday will seek to avoid matching its longest losing streak of the year (six April 4-9).

**RubberDucks host SeaWolves:** The RubberDucks are closing the season with last of six scheduled series this season with the SeaWolves, with seven games at Canal Park and 12 at UPMC Park (Akron's closest trip – 125 miles – and most frequent road opponent). Erie has won the first five series, and 13 of the first 16 meetings this season (and all four in Akron). Last season, Akron went 11-8 against Erie, including 4-5 at Canal Park. Erie finished fifth in the Western Division, at 63-77, last season. Since 2005, Akron is 156-162 against Erie, According to *Baseball America* (pre-2019) and MLB.com (July 2019), top prospects in this series include: Indians (*BA/*MLB.com): #2/1 3B Nolan Jones, #6/15 LHP Sam Hentges, #22/NR OF Oscar Gonzalez

**Playoff scenario:** With three games remaining in the Eastern League season, there is one playoff spot remaining to be determined. Bowie leads Erie by 2.0 games and holds the tiebreaker for the Western Division second half title. The magic number for the Baysox to clinch the second half is 1 (a Bowie win or Erie loss eliminates the SeaWolves).

**Strong arms:** The RubberDucks rank fifth in the Eastern League with a team ERA of 3.51, their best since a 3.19 ERA in 2015. Akron's bullpen ERA of 2.87 is second in the league and the club's best since posting a league-leading 2.66 bullpen ERA in 2012, when Akron won the EL title. Right-hander **Robert Broom** has pitched eight straight scoreless outings (12 1/3 innings) and has a 0.76 Eastern League ERA (0.60 overall ERA).

Since the All-Star break: Since the Eastern League All-Star break, Akron is 19-28, but a few RubberDucks have posted numbers among the league leaders since the break. **Trenton Brooks** leads the league with 29 extrabase hits, 21 doubles, and 92 total bases. He also has a .529 slugging percentage (second), an .876 OPS (second), 49 hits (eighth) and a .282 batting average (10th). **Nolan Jones**, called up to Double-A for the first time during the break, has seven home runs (tied for ninth), 28 walks (second) and 31 runs (tied for sixth). **Jake Paulson** has five wins (tied for second). **Sam Hentges** has 49 strikeouts (tied for sixth). **Dalbert Siri** has six saves (tied for ninth) in 17 appearances (tied for sixth). **SubJECT TO CHANGE**

Jones arrives in Double-A: Third baseman Nolan Jones has seven home runs in 46 Eastern League games (tied for ninth in the EL since July 11). Ranked by MLB.com as the Indians' No. 1 prospect (July 2019) and No. 2 by Baseball America (entering 2019), he made his Double-A debut on July 11, becoming the highest-ranked Indians prospect to appear for Akron this season. A 2019 Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star with Class-A Advanced Lynchburg, Jones led the CL in walks (65), on-base percentage (.435) and OPS (.860) at the time of his promotion to Akron. He also led Lynchburg with 48 runs. He played 77 games and hit .286 with seven home runs, 41 RBI, and a .456 slugging percentage. He also played in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Progressive Field on July 7, starting at third base and grounding out to the pitcher in his only at bat. Jones will also be among five Indians, including 2019 RubberDuck Ernie Clement, playing in the Arizona Fall League, which begins Sept. 18.

<u>Gonzalez warms up to the EL:</u> Outfielder Oscar Gonzalez, promoted to Akron on Aug. 1, has six hits in his last seven games. He also hit safely in nine of 12 games Aug. 6-19, including a six-game hitting streak Aug. 6-13 (8-for-22, three doubles, a home run, five runs and five RBI) after going hitless in his first three EL games (0-for-10). The Carolina League All-Star left Lynchburg with a CL-best .319 average, 123 hits and 175 total bases. He had eight home runs, 61 RBI (fourth), 33 extra-base hits (sixth), .455 SLG (fifth) and .797 OPS (second).

**Danny Salazar rehab:** Cleveland Indians right-hander **Danny Salazar** (currently on the 10-day Injured List) made his fourth Double-A rehab appearance and second of the week with the RubberDucks on Wednesday, allowing three earned runs on three hits and two walks in two-thirds of a relief inning. Salazar was placed on the Injured List for the entire 2018 regular season with right shoulder rotator cuff tendonitis. This season, he made six rehab starts between June 30 and July 27 – two each with the Arizona League Indians (Rookie), Akron and Columbus (Triple-A) – before starting for Cleveland on Thursday, Aug. 1, against Houston at Progressive Field. He was placed on the Injured List with a right groin strain after that start, which was his first appearance in the major leagues since the 2017 American League Division Series.

**Back at Canal Park:** Akron is 29-38 (11-20 in the second half) at home this season, marking its first home losing record since 2014 (32-39, 73-69 overall). The club is 7-12-1 in home series (2-7-0 in the second half).

**Flying out of the park:** The RubberDucks have hit 14 home runs over the past 21 games after hitting just three in the previous 20 games. In the past 41 games, Akron has 18 home runs while allowing 32. Overall, the RubberDucks have 100 home runs (fourth in the Eastern League) while allowing 93 (fourth fewest in the EL) for a +7 home run differential. Of Akron's 100 home runs this season, 59 (59 percent) have come in 22 multi-homer games, including 13 in four straight games May 9-13. Akron's six home runs on May 11 in Reading were its most since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie. Akron allowed six home runs to Binghamton on July 20, marking its most allowed since May 29, 2009, when Erie hit six in an 11-8 win over the Aeros.

LAST START (Monday, Aug. 26, at Altoona, L in 5-0 loss): Morgan began the second inning after Danny Salazar pitched a scoreless first inning. The game was scoreless until the third inning, when Morgan hit Jason Delay with a pitch, Adrian Valerio singled, and Morgan walked Jared Oliva with one out. Bligh Madris singled off Morgan's glove to drive in a run, and designated hitter Logan Hill hit a two-run single for a 3-0 Altoona lead. Morgan also allowed Valerio's two-run single in the sixth inning, his last in his first relief outing since 2017.

Season Highlights: Was Carolina League's first Pitcher of the Week for April 4-14 (11 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 15 K) and began the season with 14 consecutive scoreless innings.

- Started Opening Day for Lake County (A), was promoted to Lynchburg (A-Adv) May 16, went 9-7 with a 3.21 ERA, 1.10 WHIP, 156 K in 143.1 IP across two levels.
- Earned Pitcher of the Week honors three times, once with Lake County (A) and twice with Lynchburg (A-Adv).
- For second straight year, named Best Changeup in Indians Farm System by Baseball America.
- MiLB.com Indians Organizational All-Star (RH starter). Indians Director of Player Development James Harris (to MiLB.com): "Eli is one of those pitchers who gets a lot of swings and misses with his changeup. It's a real weapon for him and he isn't shy about using it. The challenge for him will be continuing that success as he moves through the higher levels. We feel he's a starter, and that's how we'll approach things with him moving forward, but he's certainly rising up our board quickly.

2017: His 1.03 ERA was good for the 3rd-lowest mark in the New York-Penn League (min. 35.0IP), finished 2nd on Mahoning Valley with 58 strikeouts (14.91 K/9).

#### Amateur/Personal

- Pitched for four years at Palos Verdes Peninsula High School in Rolling Hills, California, before three seasons at Gonzaga University, where he earned First Team All-American from Perfect Game/Rawlings and First Team All-West Coast Conference as a junior in 2017 (14 GS, 10-2, 2.86 ERA, 100.2 ip, 138 K – second most in program history).
- Pitched 14 games (3 starts) as a freshman in 2015, but went 20-5 with 7 complete games and 5 shutouts over 30 starts his sophomore and junior seasons. Father, Dave Morgan, is the former president of USA Today Sports Media Group, former executive editor for Yahoo Sports, and former deputy sports editor for the L.A. Times, where he spent more than 20 years. In 2008, Dave was named one of the "100 Most Influential People in Sports" by BusinessWeek, a list including commissioners from all the major North American sports leagues, influential team owners and broadcast and digital network executives.

### **2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF**

**#24 Rouglas Odor**, *Manager* (*First Season*) – Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

**#27 Tony Arnold**, *Pitching Coach* (10th Season, not consecutive) — Arnold, 60, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole**, *Hitting Coach* (*First Season*) — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24** 

**#28 Juan De La Cruz**, *Bench Coach (First Season)* — De La Cruz, 26, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookielevel Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season) — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj

Akron Baseball: A Winning Tradition This is the 31<sup>st</sup> season of Double-A baseball in Northeast Ohio, and the 23<sup>rd</sup> in downtown Akron. The franchise began as the **Canton-Akron Indians** in 1989, and then moved to **Canal Park** in Akron as the **Aeros** in 1997, later becoming the **RubberDucks** before the 2014 season.
