NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (19-18) vs. OMAHA STORM CHASERS (13-24)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue an eight-game homestand tonight with the third of a four-game series against the Omaha Storm Chasers. The 'Cakes swept four games at Werner Park last weekend, their first sweep in Omaha since May 19-22, 1997, and had won six in a row over the Storm Chasers dating back to last season until yesterday's defeat.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS – Glenn Sparkman retired the game's first nine batters in his second career Triple-A start, leading Omaha to a 4-2 win. 'Cakes starter Dillon Peters matched zeroes with Sparkman by blanking the Storm Chasers until loading the bases with no outs in the fifth inning. Humberto Arteaga hit a sacrifice fly to bring in the first run of the day and Terrance Gore followed with a bunt single to double the Omaha lead. The Baby Cakes responded in the sixth inning when Eric Campbell hit a two-out double and scored on a single by Tomas Telis. Omaha tacked on a pair of insurance runs in the ninth against Drew Rucinski, providing cushion for when Josh Staumont walked the bases loaded with one out in the bottom half to put the tying run on base. Austin Dean fouled off 10 consecutive pitches against Eric Stout before settling for a sacrifice fly, and Stout then fanned Jon Rodriguez to end the game.

ON THE HILL – Adam Conley makes his team-leading eighth start of the season, in search of his first victory at home. The left-hander owns identical stat lines at home and on the road, giving up 11 earned runs in 16.0 innings in three starts apiece, but is 0-3 at the Shrine, where the Baby Cakes have provided him with a total of three runs of support. After recording a 19.64 ERA through his first three outings of the year, Conley has a 2.19 ERA (6 ER/24.2 IP) over his last four starts while limiting opponents to a .217 (20x92) batting average. In five career starts vs. Omaha, Conley is 2-2 with a 6.21 ERA, with most of the damage inflicted in a June 11 no-decision last season when he was charged with seven runs on 10 hits in 5.1 innings.

FOR STARTERS – Baby Cakes starting pitchers have a 2.49 ERA (42 ER/153.0 IP) over the last 25 games and opponents are hitting .206 (121x587). After the staff produced only five quality starts in the first 23 games, New Orleans starters have turned in 12 over the last 14 games. The 'Cakes are 12-5 when receiving a quality start.

RIDDLE ME THIS – JT Riddle charted the seventh multi-hit effort in his last eight games and his eighth overall on Saturday. In 11 games since joining the Baby Cakes, he is hitting .444 (20x45) with three doubles, one triple, two home runs and 14 RBI. Since making his NOLA season debut on April 30, Riddle ranks fifth in the PCL in batting and is tied for fifth in hits and RBI. He has hit safely in all seven career games vs. Omaha, going 14x30 (.467) with two doubles, a triple, a home run and 10 RBI. Riddle did not play on Sunday, making the Baby Cakes 11-16 without Riddle in the starting lineup.

TAKE A WALLACH – A night after recording the second four-RBI game by a Baby Cake this season, Chad Wallach walked three times yesterday, the third time a 'Cakes player has done so, joining Johnny Giavotella and Austin Dean. New Orleans is 10-4 when Wallach starts behind the plate and the pitching staff owns a 2.85 ERA in those games, compared to a 4.10 ERA in the other 23 contests.

HOT SOUP – Eric Campbell is 11x22 (.500) in five games vs. Omaha this year, and has now hit safely in 14 of his last 15 contests. Over his last 17 games, Campbell is batting .469 (30x64) to lead the PCL in that stretch (since April 26). His 30 hits are second-most in that span to Fresno's J.D. Davis (32) and his and .520 on-base percentage trails only the .521 mark posted by Davis and El Paso's Franmil Reyes.

STEAL AWAY – Stolen bases by Isaac Galloway and Tomas Telis on Sunday pushed the Baby Cakes' season total to 33 steals, tied with Memphis for second-most in the PCL (Colorado Springs, 51). Galloway swiped his ninth bag, placing him fourth in the league, and with Rafael Ortega are one of two sets of teammates in the PCL with at least eight stolen bases, joining Colorado Springs' Keon Broxton (10) and Nate Orf (8).

MAY DAYS – New Orleans boasts a 2.68 team ERA in May to pace the PCL (next-closest is Salt Lake at 3.41) and ranks third in the league with a .291 batting average this month. The 'Cakes had hit just .225 in April, the lowest over a full month since hitting .222 in May 2008.

HIT PARADE – NOLA has reached double-digit hits seven times in the last 10 games. The 'Cakes have out-hit the opposition 112-68 in that span, amassing a .306 average (112x365), including .380 (41x108) with runners in scoring position. New Orleans was hitting a PCL-worst .225 prior to the hot streak, but now sits in 12th place at .249.

ON THIS DATE ...

2006: New Orleans scores five times in the bottom of the eighth to rally past Sacramento, 7-3. Mike Vento's two-run single, his third time reaching base and third RBI on the night, keys the comeback.

JUMBO-LAYA – Jumbo Diaz worked 2.0 shutout innings yesterday and has surrendered one run in 8.1 innings across seven appearances at home (1.08 ERA), where opponents are batting .107 (3x28). On the road, Diaz is 0-3 with a 7.50 ERA and .320 average against (8x25) in six outings.

SIR ISAAC – Isaac Galloway has a hit in 13 of his last 16 games, batting .270 (20x74) in that span with five doubles and 13 runs scored. He is just two stolen bases away from tying Colin Porter for the franchise's career record (61). He also ranks eighth on the club's career leaderboard in games played (311) and at-bats (1,090) and his next run scored will be his 142nd in a NOLA uniform to move into a tied with Tyrell Godwin for 10th place.

GETTING DEFENSIVE – The 'Cakes committed two errors yesterday, after having just one in their previous 10 games. New Orleans is tied with Albuquerque for the PCL's best fielding percentage (.986) and turned a season-high four double plays yesterday.

FAMILIAR RELATIONS – The Baby Cakes are 10-4 thus far in a stretch of playing 24 straight games against Round Rock and Omaha. NOLA played each of its first 23 games against either Nashville, Oklahoma City or Colorado Springs.

NAWLINS NOTES – The 'Cakes are 4-1 on Mondays, with three straight victories ... Austin Nola has at least one hit with one RBI in each of his last three games, going 4x13 with a double, home run and four RBI ... New Orleans slipped to 3-13 when trailing after five innings ... The Baby Cakes played their 20th game decided by one or two runs, second-most in the league to Oklahoma City (21) ... Tomas Telis has hit safely in all five games vs. Omaha, going 10x21 with six RBI.

2018 SEASON

OPENING DAY – Conley was given the nod on Opening Day vs. Nashville and yielded seven runs on seven hits in 3.0 innings. His only previous Opening Day start came in his first full pro season in 2012 with Low-A Greensboro, when he fired 5.0 scoreless innings and fanned seven in a win over Lexington.

ROCKY START – Conley worked a combined 7.1 innings over his first three starts and allowed 16 runs on 20 hits (19.64 ERA). His 1.2 IP against Colorado Springs on 4/10 marked the third time in his last four starts, dating to September 2017 with Miami, that Conley did make it out of the second inning.

BACK ON TRACK – With 6.0 shutout innings of three-hit ball on 4/27 at Nashville, Conley recorded his first quality start in his last 10 assignments. He limited the Sounds to one hit in seven at-bats with runners in scoring position and retired 10 of the last 11 batters he faced.

CRAZY EIGHTS – Despite taking the loss on 5/2 vs. Round Rock, when he scattered three runs (two earned) and six hits across 8.0 innings, Conley become the first New Orleans starter to complete 8.0 innings since Ivan Pineyro on August 25, 2015 vs. Las Vegas. In three starts from 4/20-5/2, he posted a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) with a .203 (14x69) batting average against.

E-TRAIN DERAILED – Conley earned his second win on 5/8 at Round Rock, blanking the Express on three hits through 5.1 IP before allowing a pair of runs in the sixth. He became the first 'Cakes starter in 2018 to reach the 100-pitch plateau and has a 2.61 ERA (11 ER/38.0 IP) in seven career starts vs. RR.

2017 IN REVIEW

APRIL SHOWERS – After a season-opening win against the Mets on 4/8, Conley surrendered 21 runs (18 earned) in 10.2 innings across his final three starts with Miami as his ERA ballooned from 3.00 to 7.53. He was optioned to New Orleans following his 5/8 defeat vs. St. Louis.

NO FLY ZONE – Dating back to his 2015 season with New Orleans, Conley had gone 17 consecutive Triple-A starts without allowing a home run until Round Rock's Will Middlebrooks went deep on 6/1. It snapped a streak of 96.0 innings without a homer, since Memphis' Ed Easley on May 9, 2015.

HEATING UP – Conley opened July with back-to-back victories in quality starts on 7/2 at Memphis and 7/7 vs. Oklahoma City. He surrendered a combined three runs on nine hits with 13 strikeouts in 13.0 innings, including a season-high eight punchouts of the Dodgers.

BACK IN THE BIGS – Upon being recalled on 7/18, Conley went 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA (4 ER/20.2 IP) in his first three starts. He set a new career high with 11 strikeouts in defeating the Mets on 8/20 after going without a punchout in 6.1 innings vs. San Francisco on 8/14, becoming the first pitcher since the Cardinals' Joe Magrane in 1990 to fan more than 10 immediately following a game in which he went at least 6.0 strikeout-free innings.
