NEW ORLEANS BABY CAKES (28-33) AT SALT LAKE BEES (37-25)

RHP Sandy Alcantara (4-1, 3.53) vs. LHP John Lamb (1-0, 3.72)

THE BABY CAKES – The New Orleans Baby Cakes continue a seven-game road trip tonight with the second of a four game set in Salt Lake. The ‘Cakes dropped the first series in this road-trip, losing two of three in Las Vegas outscoring the 51s 32-21 in the series. The ‘Cakes drop the first game last night 4-0. New Orleans lost three of four at home a year ago against the Bees. The last trip to Salt Lake the Zephyrs won three of four against the Bees in 2016.

YESTERDAY’S NEWS – The Bees dealt New Orleans a 4-0 shutout in the first game of the series. The Bees scored a pair of runs in the first and two more runs in the second inning and three pitchers limited New Orleans to seven hits in the series opener. The bees offense was led by David Fletcher’s three hits. Felix Pena earned the win pitching six innings. The Cakes stranded ten men on base and were 0x10 with runners in scoring position. Cristhian Adames had the only multi-hit game of the game that included a triple.

ON THE HILL – Sandy Alcantara makes his twelfth start of the season and his first against Salt Lake. Alcantara is coming off of a win against his former organization. He pitched six innings, allowed three runs on six hits in a win against Memphis. Alcantara is 4-0 in his last six starts with a 3.35 ERA. He is 2-1 in six road starts with a 4.50 ERA.

HOT SOUP – Over his last 36 games, dating to April 26, Eric Campbell is batting .369, third-best in the PCL in that span, while his .457 on-base percentage trails only Sacramento’s Austin Slater (.462). Campbell now has a team-leading 38 RBI on the season. Campbell is 11th in the PCL in batting average, at .323 (52x164).

JUNE - The ‘Cakes are third in the PCL with a .296 batting average in June.

DEAN OF HITS – Austin Dean added another hit yesterday making his average .306 in Triple A, and has 8 hits in his last 26 at bats spanning six games. Dean was hitting .420 (34x81) in 22 games with AA Jacksonville and was named April’s Southern League Player of the Month after pacing the circuit in batting average, hits, total bases (53), slugging percentage (.654) and OPS (1.120). His .353 overall batting average places 11th in all of MiLB, and he is hitting .345 (19x55) in 14 games since moving into the leadoff spot.

HITS, HITS, & MORE HITS - The Baby Cakes recorded 20 hits Wednesday night, the most since May 8, 2015 at Memphis. All of the starters had hits and six of the nine had multi-hit efforts. Both Eric Campbell and Cristhian Adames tied the Baby Cake season-high tally with four hits each, while Magneuris Sierra and Cito Culver both recorded three hits against the 51s pitching staff.

ROSTER MOVE - Odrisamer Despaigne will be added to the roster today. He rejoins New Orleans from Miami. Despaigne will join the New Orleans bullpen. The 31-year-old was 2-0 in 11 games with Miami with a 5.31 ERA. New Orleans added Tyler Cloyd yesterday and he will replace the starting rotation. The ‘Cakes have made nine roster moves since road-trip started on Monday.

DOUBLES’ GALORE - Cristhian Adames hit three doubles Wednesday in Vegas, the first time a ‘Cakes player has done so since Matt Dominguez smacked three doubles at Nashville on April 12, 2012. Adames now has 11 on the season, tied with Isaac Galloway for the team lead. The Baby Cakes also recorded eight doubles as a team, tying the Baby Cakes single game record.

ADAMES FAMILY - Adames added a triple last night in Salt Lake and has 13 hits in his last 20 at bats, batting .650 in his five game hit streak.

MAGNIFICENT MAGGY – Magneuris Sierra has a hit in eight of his last nine games. Over his last 16 starts, Sierra is batting .318 (21x66), he has 17 multi-hit game, good for the team lead.

LONELIEST NUMBER – The Baby Cakes have played 23 one-run games, going a PCL-worst 7-16, and 34 games decided by one or two runs (12-21), second-most in the league (Round Rock, 34). NOLA has dropped all 13 one-run affairs on the road.

ARMS RACE – Over the last ten games, Baby Cakes starting pitchers own a 3.94 ERA (26 ER/59.1 IP) and have seven quality starts in that span. The ‘Cakes starters had a 2.25 ERA (45 ER/180.0 IP) in a 27-game stretch from April 18-May 17 before the staff held a 7.94 ERA in its next 10 games.

ILLUSTRIOUS INNING - New Orleans recorded eight runs in the fourth inning Wednesday night, their highest tally since an eight run outburts in the 9th inning at El Paso on May 14, 2016. The ‘Cakes gave up eight runs to the 51’s in the third inning on Tuesday.

STEAL AWAY – The Baby Cakes have 47 stolen bases this season, tied for sixth-most in the PCL. Rafael Ortega is 10x10 in stolen base attempts, the most of any player in the league without being caught, and with

Isaac Galloway (13) account for one of three sets of PCL teammates to reach double-digit steals, joining Colorado Springs’ Keon Broxton (18) and Nate Orf (12) and Tacoma’s Ian Miller (14) and John Andreoli (13).

SIR ISAAC - Isaac Galloway team leading (41) runs scored and 13 stolen bases this season are tied for third-most in the PCL, and he has 64 steals in a New Orleans uniform, three ahead of Colin Porter for the most in franchise history. Galloway played in his 331st game with NOLA on Sunday, moving him ahead of Jason Alfaro for seventh place on the club’s all-time chart, while he ranks sixth in at bats (1,161) and seventh in runs scored (158), one behind Colin Porter for sixth.

SOLD ON CITO - Cito Culver is 6x17 on the roadtrip .353, producing five RBI and six runs.

THE TRIP - New Orleans is 1-3 on the trip, batting .333 (54x162) scoring 32 runs, with 14 doubles, 6 triples and 4 home runs. The club has a 5.82 ERA, allowing 22ER, 26R, in 33 innings pitched and have 7 errors.

NAWLINS NOTES – New Orleans was shutout for the third time this season. The ‘Cakes have dealt six shutouts and the nine shutouts combined are the third most in the league trailing Memphis and Nashville (10). The ‘Cakes are now 3-6 in extra inning games. The ‘Cakes have turned 56 double plays, tied with four other teams for 3rd in PCL.

2018 SEASON

DANDY SANDY – Alcantara fanned eight batters in 4.2 innings in his Triple-A debut, 4/7 vs. Nashville, equaling his season high from all of 2017, established twice with AA Springfield. Alcantara limited the Sounds to one hit in six at-bats with runners in scoring position.

HIGH QUALITY – Alcantara recorded his first quality start on 4/17 vs. Colorado Springs. He blanked the Sky Sox until two outs in the sixth inning, when a walk and consecutive singles scored a run to leave him with a no-decision. Right-handed hitters went 1x14 on the night.

TREAT YO SELF – Alcantara produced the only run of support during his 4/23 start vs. Oklahoma City with a fifth-inning double, his first career RBI after starting 1x17 at the plate.

WINNER WINNER – Despite allowing just one run in three of his first five starts, Alcantara did not break into the win column until 5/4 at Omaha, when he logged a season-high 7.0 innings and held the Storm Chasers to one run and four hits. The 7.0 IP matched his career best, established five other times.

EIGHT IS GREAT – For the first time in 76 career starts, Alcantara pitched into the eighth inning on 5/17 vs. Round Rock. In 8.0 IP, he allowed five hits, including a pair of solo homers, to pick up the win.

2017 IN REVIEW

FAST RISER – Alcantara made his MLB debut with the Cardinals after going 7-5 with a 4.31 ERA in 25 games (22) starts with AA Springfield. He finished 11th in the Texas League in strikeouts (106) and 12th in innings pitched (125.1) and his 15 hit batsmen were second-most in the league. San Francisco's Tim Federowicz began Alcantara's big league career with a home run on his first batter faced on 9/3, but he recovered to fan Buster Posey for his first strikeout.

WILD THING – After blanking Frisco for 6.0 innings in his season debut on 4/7, Alcantara unleashed six wild pitches while allowing seven runs in 3.2 innings against the RoughRiders six days later. His 20 wild pitches on the year were the most in the Texas League.

SECOND HALF SURGE – Following the All-Star break, Alcantara went 4-0 with a 2.77 ERA (17 ER/55.1 IP) and limited opponents to a .222 batting average (45x203). Included was a three-appearance stint in the bullpen from 8/23-8/29 before having his contract purchased on 9/1.

K MAN – Alcantara twice fanned a season-high eight batters in a game, in a loss at Tulsa on 5/6 and a victory at Corpus Christi on 8/12. Four of Alcantara's eight major league outings were scoreless and he recorded a strikeout in seven, including striking out the side in order against the Cubs on 9/15.

FALL LEAGUE – Alcantara was named to the Arizona Fall League's Rising Stars Game after ranking fourth among AFL starters with a 2.08 opponents batting average in five starts for the Surprise Saguaros.

2018 SEASON

DANDY SANDY – Alcantara fanned eight batters in 4.2 innings in his Triple-A debut, 4/7 vs. Nashville, equaling his season high from all of 2017, established twice with AA Springfield. Alcantara limited the Sounds to one hit in six at-bats with runners in scoring position.

HIGH QUALITY – Alcantara recorded his first quality start on 4/17 vs. Colorado Springs. He blanked the Sky Sox until two outs in the sixth inning, when a walk and consecutive singles scored a run to leave him with a no-decision. Right-handed hitters went 1x14 on the night.

TREAT YO SELF – Alcantara produced the only run of support during his 4/23 start vs. Oklahoma City with a fifth-inning double, his first career RBI after starting 1x17 at the plate.

WINNER WINNER – Despite allowing just one run in three of his first five starts, Alcantara did not break into the win column until 5/4 at Omaha, when he logged a season-high 7.0 innings and held the Storm Chasers to one run and four hits. The 7.0 IP matched his career best, established five other times.

EIGHT IS GREAT – For the first time in 76 career starts, Alcantara pitched into the eighth inning on 5/17 vs. Round Rock. In 8.0 IP, he allowed five hits, including a pair of solo homers, to pick up the win.

2017 IN REVIEW

FAST RISER – Alcantara made his MLB debut with the Cardinals after going 7-5 with a 4.31 ERA in 25 games (22) starts with AA Springfield. He finished 11th in the Texas League in strikeouts (106) and 12th in innings pitched (125.1) and his 15 hit batsmen were second-most in the league. San Francisco's Tim Federowicz began Alcantara's big league career with a home run on his first batter faced on 9/3, but he recovered to fan Buster Posey for his first strikeout.

WILD THING – After blanking Frisco for 6.0 innings in his season debut on 4/7, Alcantara unleashed six wild pitches while allowing seven runs in 3.2 innings against the RoughRiders six days later. His 20 wild pitches on the year were the most in the Texas League.

SECOND HALF SURGE – Following the All-Star break, Alcantara went 4-0 with a 2.77 ERA (17 ER/55.1 IP) and limited opponents to a .222 batting average (45x203). Included was a three-appearance stint in the bullpen from 8/23-8/29 before having his contract purchased on 9/1.

K MAN – Alcantara twice fanned a season-high eight batters in a game, in a loss at Tulsa on 5/6 and a victory at Corpus Christi on 8/12. Four of Alcantara's eight major league outings were scoreless and he recorded a strikeout in seven, including striking out the side in order against the Cubs on 9/15.

FALL LEAGUE – Alcantara was named to the Arizona Fall League's Rising Stars Game after ranking fourth among AFL starters with a 2.08 opponents batting average in five starts for the Surprise Saguaros.

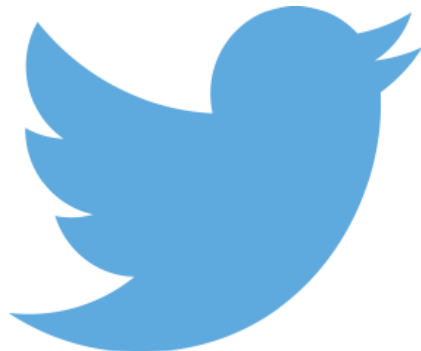
